Hailstorm Damage in Maldon

The Castlemaine SES were called out on Monday 2 January in response to calls for help after a freak hail storm swept through Maldon and surrounds. Five requests for help were received and two crews were sent out to repair damaged roofs and windows. "Mostly roofs, skylights and windows were damaged," said Daniel Bone from Castlemaine SES. "The path of the storm was fairly narrow so we dodged a bullet."

The largest of the hail stones were the size of a billiard ball, while others had been measured at 4cm in diameter.

Daniel said that the SES crews worked until 1.30am placing tarps over damaged roofs and skylights. The older laser light roofing received the worst damage, shattering from the impact of the heavy hail stones. The crews were also sent out to assist with damage that had occurred in Marong and Eaglehawk.

Vic Emergency sent out a warning for people to stay indoors when the storm was due to hit at around 5pm on Monday.

A low-pressure system brought large-sized hail stones to surrounding areas including parts of Bendigo and Maryborough, and in Maldon.

Locally, many people reported damage to their windows and cars. The Maldon Museum was hit by the hail, with nine small panes of glass being damaged. Museum President Derek Reid and a helper managed to seal up the windows with plastic to prevent any further damage from the rain.

"We were lucky there was no damage internally as it could have been a lot worse," Derek told the *Times* as the Museum awaits an assessment of and repairs to the damage.

The Golf Club did not suffer any visible damage but is waiting on an inspection of the solar panels for a damage report. In the main part of town, the hail damaged the marquee at the Maldon Hotel and there were reports of customers' car windows being smashed.

Local resident Justine Walker spoke to the *Times* and said that her horses were hit badly by the hail and one poor little foal

suffered welts on her body from the impact as Justine watched on helplessly. Justine spent the entire time during the storm trying to save cars, gardens and pets. She also experienced damage to laser light roofing.

Russell Clarke from Grange Hill Historic Winery told the *Times*, "We luckily missed the hail as it would have done serious damage to the vines if it had hit." But he and partner Angelina Chaperon witnessed some serious black cloud action and had an anxious few moments while the storm passed them by.

Another Maldon resident, Faye Parson, had damage to her fernery, while their car and her husband's work van suffered dints to the outside but luckily no broken windows.

The CFA was not called out to assist with calls for help but noted that the storm's path had passed from the south up to the golf course. Fogarty's Gap Road was hit badly with water covering the road and broken trees shredded and blown around the area.

Golf Club Break In



THIEVES broke into the Maldon Club's machinery shed a week before Christmas, taking maintenance equipment and a set of golf clubs.

Police investigated the scene and were unable to find any fingerprints. The crime is still under investigation by the Maryborough Crime Investigation Unit.

Items stolen were a battery grease gun, battery charger and booster, tyre inflator and an air gun as well as a set of clubs.

Following this incident, it was discovered that a purpose-built golf cart trailer has also gone missing. It is unknown if it was taken during the shed break-in or in a separate incident.

Golf Club Secretary Bob Briggs spoke to the *Times*. "If you can be on the lookout for the trailer, it is charcoal black in colour and has the registration number XC52840 and the VIN number is 6APDXTRLRGT003859," he said.

The public should also be on the lookout for a set of golf clubs that belonged to a member and were taken from the shed.

Bill Woodfull Reserve Improvements

WORKS to improve Maldon's Bill Woodfull Recreation Reserve will start in Autumn 2023.

Council was successful in securing State Government funding for the upgrades, with significant funding contributions from the Federal Government.

Council conducted consultations with the community regarding the designs for the upgrades with final designs endorsed by Council in September 2022.

- Features of the upcoming improvements include:
- The installation of four 24-meter poles (with LED luminaries) to improve the oval sports lighting;
 - The installation of four new 8 metre poles (with LED luminaries) to improve the netball court lighting; and
 - Construction of a new all-gender pavilion on the east side of the netball court to provide change facilities and amenities for players, spectators, and umpires.

Free Green Waste Disposal

MOUNT Alexander Shire Council is offering residents another opportunity to dispose of green waste free of charge at the Castlemaine and Maldon transfer stations.

The additional free green waste disposal period is in place from Monday 16 January to Sunday 29 January.

The opportunity will assist residents to clean up their homes and properties to reduce the risk of fire during summer.

Green waste includes garden waste such as grass, sticks and branches that are less than 10cm in diameter. The green waste must be free of contaminants such as rubbish, bricks,

soil, rubble and declared noxious weeds, and be removed from plastic bags prior to disposal.

Loads containing items other than green waste will be charged accordingly. Residents are also encouraged to compost as much material as possible at home.

Proof of residence in the shire will be required.

Normal gate fees will apply before and after the free 14-day period.

Grass fire in Maldon

Council Update

THERE was a full dance card at Mt Alexander Shire Council's last meeting of the year on Tuesday 20 December. In case you missed out, owing to the excitement of pre-Christmas festivities, here's an outline of the proceedings.

Question Time

This began with a question about what Council intends to do regarding the increasing problem of graffiti in Castlemaine. The questioner was of the opinion that while other councils have introduced measures to deal with graffiti issues, Mt Alexander Shire Council needs to become more proactive in dealing with this issue.

And here's a curly question: if a Tiny House on Wheels is built to an energy efficiency rating of 6 that complies with National and State building codes and legislations, and the intended occupant wants to live in the Tiny House on Wheels as their permanent place of dwelling, what rationale is there for not recognising the suitability of that Tiny House on Wheels to be approved as a permanent dwelling in Mount Alexander Shire?

A recently formed community group called Castlemaine Society Incorporated (CASSOC) made a submission seeking a commitment from Council to preserve the Froomes Road Bridge. The bridge, which was built in 1874, is not protected by a heritage overlay.

Following the submission by Castlemaine Society Incorporated, there was a plethora of questions asked by ratepayers concerning the Froomes Road Bridge.

After question time, it was onto Council business, with some major items on the agenda.

Pools

Council voted to renew the Victorian YMCA's contract to manage the Shire's four outdoor pools in Castlemaine, Harcourt, Newstead and Maldon for a further two years (from 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2025) at a cost of \$1,117,770.51.

Froomes Road Bridge

Council rejected the recommendation of its officers to replace the historic Froomes Road bridge with a new two-lane bridge.

Cr Maltby's proposal to close Froomes Road bridge to vehicular traffic, and only allowing access to pedestrians bicycles and animals, was defeated.

Cr Driscoll's alternative motion - to refurbish Froomes Road bridge and introduce new pedestrian and road safety measures - was passed.

Solar Facility

Council was presented with a proposal for a solar facility of 9,400 panels situated close to KR in Richards Street, Castlemaine. The application was referred to Council for a decision as six objections to the project had been received, and the cost of the development was in excess of \$1,000,000. Once the panels are installed, the land will be used for general grazing.

Council voted to grant a planning permit for the solar facility and for the removal of native vegetation, subject to a list of conditions.

Residential Planning Permit

Next on the agenda was a matter relating directly to the *Times*' readership area: a planning permit application for the construction of a large house on a vacant block of land at 19 Harker Street. Situated on a rise, the large block adjoins five other residential properties.

The application was referred to Council because 10 objections had been received. Reasons cited for the objections included non-compliance with the Maldon Design Guidelines, excessive building height, the view that the design was not in keeping with the neighbourhood character and the fact that a tree was removed from the block before the permit application was lodged with Council.

Council approved the permit application, subject to a list of conditions. These included lowering the building height by a minimum of 500mm; a reduction in glazing or screening of said glazing on part of the building; a detailed landscape plan; and screening with vegetation of the front setback.

Local Law Change


Council voted to look at amending a local law that could potentially lead to tiny houses or caravans being used as temporary places of residence on private property without the need for a permit. Before any such decision is made, there will be a public consultation process calling for community feedback.

A postscript:

Following Council's decision regarding the planning permit for the proposed residence at 17 Harker Street, the *Times* spoke to two Maldon residents who had lodged an objection. They both attended the mediation meeting called between the applicant, Council officers and objectors. One of the objectors, Bruce Clements, also attended December's Council meeting. The other objector was prepared to speak to the *Times* but did not wish to be identified.

Both the objectors are disappointed with Council's decision and believe that the proposed house design is not in character with other buildings in the area and is not in keeping with the Maldon Design Guidelines. They cited a number of other concerns.

Could the matter be taken further - to VCAT? Mr Clements was not prepared to say. He said that he and other objectors were still waiting for formal notification from the Shire of Council's decision to approve the application.

Rocking Horse Restoration

ALLAN Trounson, 91 years young, is helping restore a very old rocking horse with his mates at the Maldon Men's Shed.

Allan remembers having a rocking horse exactly like this one as a child and wonders if it could be the same one coming full circle into his life once more. Allan has many tales to tell of his childhood and remembers when his horse was given to him as a young seven-year-old when its previous owner had outgrown it.

This horse's owner wants to keep it as a reminder of her childhood and has tasked the Men's Shed with the restoration of this beautiful piece of history. It will remain unpainted. This allows the horse to be seen in its raw beauty. The final finish is being debated as the original choice of beeswax has proven to be unsuitable.

It won't be going under the Christmas tree," Allan said, "as it won't be finished in time."

Looking closely at the finely crafted rocking horse, Allan tells how it is hollow and put together in segments, which can be seen now that all the paint has been removed. "It was a tricky job getting paint out of all the nooks and crannies."

The horse will live on for perhaps another 100 years after the boys have finished with their restoration work. Keeping to the authenticity of the original, it will have horse hair for the tail and mane as well as new reins and a bridle. The owner plans to display it in her home as a decorative piece. It was passed on to the owner when she was a child after the previous owners had outgrown it and were moving house. This rocking horse is an example of a craft of days gone by, and a wonderful example of the rewarding work done at the Men's shed in Maldon. Blast from the Past

THE 'V' SIGN ON PREECE'S HILL



In November 1917 Maldon was bitterly divided over the question of military conscription. On 28 November the *Tarrangower Times* reported that the Maldon Anti-Conscription League had constructed a 20-foot long sign reading 'VOTE NO' on a hill off Parkins Reef Road. The sign was made of large whitewashed stones on the property of the League's president, Cr William Preece. It could be seen for many miles away.

After a majority voted 'No' in the plebiscite, both nationally and in Maldon, the sign remained as a memorial to the anti-conscription campaign. In May 1918 the sign gained national attention when visiting soldiers made two attempts to blow it up. After each incident the Anti-Conscription League rebuilt it. The sign was vandalised and repaired on at least two further occasions. It was still in place in May 1919 when Catholic Archbishop Daniel Mannix visited Maldon and congratulated the town on its stand against conscription.

In January 1941, starting in Belgium, the Allied Forces adopted the 'V for Victory' sign as an emblem of resistance to German expansion. In July 1941 British Prime Minister Winston Churchill gave his support to the movement and started to use his famous 'V for victory' hand sign.

In Maldon a group of boys at the Baptist Sunday School picked up on the idea and in early September 1941, under the supervision of Reg Rewell, went to Preece's Hill where they whitewashed and rearranged the stones. The boys formed them into a giant 'V', 60 foot high and 30 foot wide. At the time the sign could be seen from 20 miles away. Soon after Colin McArthur photographed the sign. He then had postcards printed that he donated as a fundraiser to the local War Relief Fund.

In more recent years the 'V' sign has been restored. In about 2003 it was repainted and a small '150' was added below the sign to celebrate the 150th anniversary of Maldon's founding. Later the '150' was changed to '100' and a red poppy was added to commemorate the centenary of the Gallipoli Landing. The sign is an historic reminder of Maldon's involvement in both World Wars.

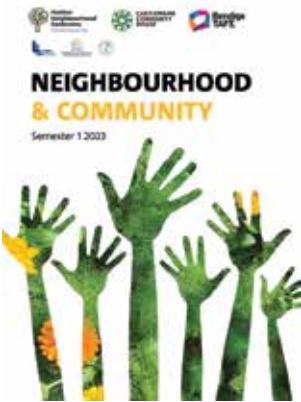

Regional Unemployment - All-Time Low

REGIONAL Victoria is seeing a rise in employment and communities benefiting across the State. Employment has risen by just under 150,000 jobs to more than 807,000 since November 2014.

The number of unemployed people in regional Victoria has dropped by more than 20,000 and regional unemployment sits at a record low of 3.1 percent.

Geelong has been one of the state's strongest performers with a drop of 5.6 percentage points in its unemployment rate to 2.6 per cent. Over the same period, the unemployment rate in Bendigo has fallen by 5.4 percentage points to 1.6 per cent – and in Ballarat by 5.2 points to 1.7 per cent.

The Victorian economy is growing faster than any other state, and the overall unemployment rate of 3.7 per cent is around the lowest in nearly half a century.

Preece’s Rock

I’m replying to the letter to the editor entitled ‘Lost and Found’ regarding a found diary (of which I know nothing) and a request for information on Preece’s Rock (about which I know only a little).

Preece’s Rock is located in the Maldon Historic Reserve on the far side of Mt Tarrengower, about 250m SW from the point where the Cox Track meets the Ridge Track.

It is a large granite slab and was first inscribed by W. E. Preece in 1864 (possibly a very young William Edward Preece, 1855-1940) and has been carved by a few other Maldon identities over the years.

I’ve attached some photos I took in August this year when I finally located it after reading a very short description about the rock in the Historic Reserve Management Plan from 1988.

Another Correction

To correct your correspondent Brad Hooper, (23/12) who wrote in to correct me... An architect *was* initially involved with the Maldon Streetscape Ruination Project, the kerb outstands specifically.

I’ve been agitating for a reassessment of the project since the first plans were posted in June 2020. Back then Jeff Jackson was Project Manager. During a telephone conversation, he informed me that he was the architect responsible for Centennial Hall, that incongruous mirrored box stuck to the side of Melbourne’s Royal Exhibition Building in 1980. A waste of public money, as it turned out. In the ‘90s it was demolished to enable heritage listing for the Exhibition building itself. Is there a pattern here?

A high profile architect such as Jackson, along with his heritage ‘expertise’, would not have come cheap. Those four trial Main St. ‘grave sites’ were his designs. But what the hell, with \$4 million to play with, Council was living large. In that same conversation with Mr Jackson, he mentioned that the initial suggestion for kerb outstands in Maldon came from a company that installed them.

While we’re on the subject, could these disruptive ‘crossing point’ installations have been undertaken at a worse time? Peak holiday season; tourists get a cluttered, ugly street vista; we get an extra long delay until completion.

Shop and accommodation owners, local businesses...your tourism-based livelihoods are being steadily undermined by Council’s ill-conceived decisions. 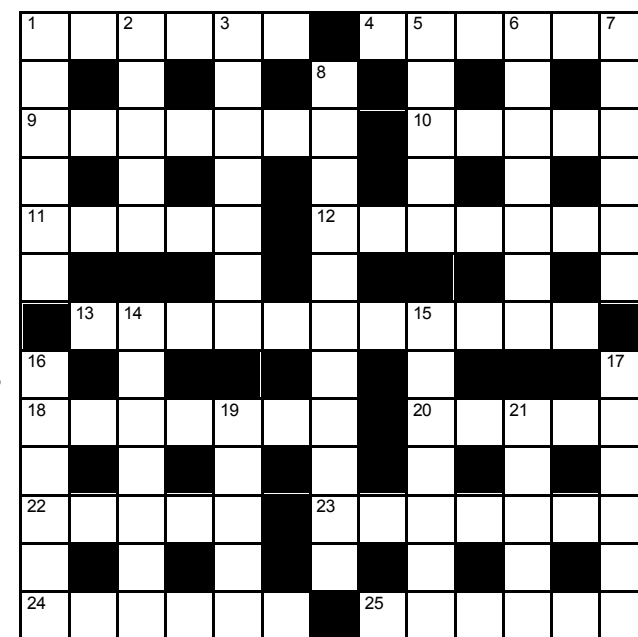

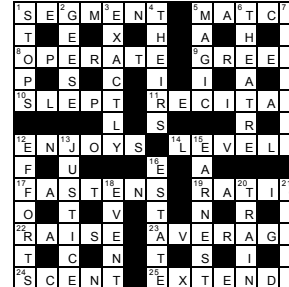

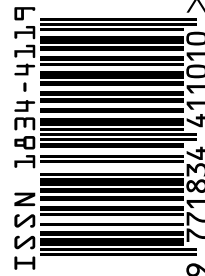

Horse by Geraldine Brooks

Pulitzer Prize-winning author Geraldine Brooks has done it again. This time she brings us an engaging, meticulously researched historical novel with the famed American thoroughbred Lexington, at its centre. Based on real horses, people and facts, this is a skilfully structured tale set in three time frames and three main locations. The first is the deep south in the 1850s, the home of Lexington, the rich white men who owned him and the Black slaves who tended and trained him, in particular the real-life trainer Harry Lewis and his fictional son, Jarrett. We also meet Scott, the itinerant painter of racehorses in these pre-photography days, known to have done portraits of Lexington, one of which may have been in the collection of art critic Martha Jackson who lived in New York in the 1950s, the second time frame and strand of the story. The final strand is set in 2019 and involves an Australian-born scientist, a Black art historian, a dumped painting of a horse, and the skeleton of a horse in the attic of the Smithsonian Institution in Massachusetts. This is not just the story of a famous racehorse who sired a dynasty; it is also a fascinating interweaving of art, science, racing and racial injustices that reverberate across centuries.

Not Now, Not, Ever edited by Julia Gillard

Few will forget the day 10 years ago when Prime Minister Julia Gillard delivered her searing speech in parliament to excoriate Tony Abbott, then Leader of the Opposition, for his contempt for women's equality and his hypocrisy. It was a speech that reverberated around the world, being, as one contributor commented, 'the most outspoken attack on sexism in political history'. The book, after printing the full text of the misogynist speech, opens and closes with essays by Gillard herself. In between these first and last words is a collection of thought-provoking essays and comments from a range of women, including Kathy Lette, Quentin Bryce, Anne Summers, Tanya Plibersek, Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala and Hillary Clinton. Along with interviews with three of today's next-generation feminist activists, the collection is a poignant reminder of the impact of the speech, how far we've come since and how much further there is to go.

Women and Leadership

by Julia Gillard & Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala

The trail-blazing authors of this outstanding book first met at a Commonwealth Heads of Government meeting when Gillard was the first, and still, only female Prime Minister of Australia and Okonjo-Iweala was the first female Finance Minister of Nigeria. Continuing to meet over the years at international forums, they were driven to write this book by their 'passionate belief in gender equality and tearing frustration that we have not yet achieved it'.
