THE HOUSING CRISIS -NOT GOING AWAY

ast Home Partners: housing for single pensioners. There are many people concerned about our housing crisis, many talking about what needs to be done, some who have formed or joined committees-but who is actually doing something


Locally, two aged pensioners who share a rental property, Josie Emery and Clif Edwards, have registered a charity with the aim of raising \$3.5 million dollars to build long-term rental houses with secure tenure for aged pensioners facing homelessness. Josie says, "Our aim is not to provide short-term emergency housing but to get to people who are living precariously and put them into a nice, secure place they can call home for the rest of their lives-before they become homeless.'

Josie was on the Board of the Women's and Girls Emergency Centre in central Sydney in the early 2000s and witnessed first-hand the spiral of destitution that follows from losing your home to sleeping rough. Following the COVID years the

escalation of house prices and the turning of long-term rental houses into short-term B&Bs, Josie and Clif saw how desperately the district needed to find ways to house struggling people.

And so Last Home Partners was born, an organisation aimed solely at addressing the situation of aged pensioners unable to buy a unit or put up the money to get into Aged Care but whose pension would pay a minimal ongoing rent. Clif says, "We are working very closely with Mount Alexander Shire Council and, with their assistance, have developed a scheme that will Continued on page 3

Eat, Drink, Relax, Sing



MALDON is soon to have a new music-bar-pizza cocktail lounge—the *Blue Cockatoo*. Somewhere to eat, drink, relax, socialise, and go karaoke. Our local fish 'n'chip shop *Maldon Takeaway* is soon to open a cocktail lounge at the back of house. When you enter this fine establishment, it's like stepping into another world. What are Melitta (Lee) and Adam (Isaacs) from *Maldon Takeaway* waiting for to decide when to open? For the liquor licence to come through which, they are reliably informed, is imminent.

"With Maldon Takeaway, I eat really late," Melitta said. "Adam eats really late—like past 11pm at night. There's nowhere in Maldon where you can get food past 8pm at night. So that was our main consideration—to have somewhere locals and visitors can relax, enjoy a drink if they want, and actually get something to eat as well. It's evolved into a cocktail lounge.

"So, when our fish and chip shop closes on Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and then Sunday nights during summer, the *Blue Cockatoo* will remain open. And you'll still be able to get pizza

and a limited bar-type menu up until we close."

Melitta and Adam gave the *Tarrangower Times* a sneak preview of the almost-finished cocktail lounge last week. Both were still busy behind the takeaway counter but took time out to introduce the *Blue Cockatoo*. "Because we live at the back of the takeaway shop, we would often come to the back section we're sitting in now when the takeaway shop closed. To wind down and relax, we would do karaoke and jam ourselves. We would literally sing into fly spray cans as our microphones—all to an imaginary audience. One evening, we discussed creating a place where people can eat, drink, relax, sing, and all feel involved," said Melitta.

On reflection, the gem of the idea came much earlier.

"We did dabble in the garden that we had down the side here, and that was going really well. We had a really lovely space where people loved sitting, and they loved listening to our music when we played it."

Melitta explained how they always had people asking if they could enjoy a beer to have with their pizza or fish and chips. But a business needs a liquor licence to do that. As a result, they decided to investigate the music-bar-pizza idea properly.

The *Blue Cockatoo* name is in honour of their three birds. People come from all around Victoria to see them. And to hear them. Of course, cockatoos don't come in blue, but Melitta explained she and Adam have a blue macaw, "So we thought the *Blue Cockatoo* had a nice little ring to it... and it honours our three birds."

Simon Dow nominated for Martin Kantor Prize



THE face is in deep contemplation, hands in a prayer gesture. Simon Dow describes this self-portrait as "silent"; and has named it 'No Self'. It has recently been shortlisted along with 19 other photographic portraits for the prestigious Martin Kantor Prize.

The *Times* caught up with Simon over coffee at *Belle Espresso* last weekend to dis-

cuss his nomination. He is a wise, articulate and humble person who explained his ambivalence at even entering the competition, referring to his background in Ballet and having sat on dance juries. Should we even attempt to measure art, he asked, and rank one work as better than another? We discussed the works on display currently at Simon and Brad's EDGE Galleries in Maldon – one series visceral and confronting, the other spiritual and visually delightful. They reflect different sides of the human condition: who is to say which is better?

Simon entered the competition because it is widely

respected. Entry conditions included size restrictions and specified that the portrait subject be someone prominent in a public field. He was not convinced that his self-portrait would even be competitive, because it is "quiet". So, he was shocked to be nominated — especially after five previous unsuccessful competition entries.

Our conversation ventured into the area of portraiture and self-portraiture. Self portraits are common in art — Rembrandt and Van Gogh for instance did many — if only because looking in the mirror is easier than persuading someone to sit for you. To sit for a portrait is to give the artist your trust, to surrender your self-image to them, and can be a confronting experience. We have seen the responses of Anh Do's subjects in his popular TV series: Is that what I look like? or, Is that how you see me? And next level of course is posing nude. Enough said.

The Martin Kantor Photographic Portrait Prize comes under the umbrella of the 2023 Ballarat International Foto Biennale and runs until late October, when the winner will be announced. put modular rental housing on Rural Residential blocks. The State Government has already changed rental tenancy laws to allow us to write long-term rental contracts. We're now finalising designs and costings with modular house builders for single and two-person houses—not granny-flats or tiny homes—real homes at a lower price than what's being charged

for emergency housing modules and other short-term fixes." The next step is finding the land on which to put the houses.

Clif has his eye on a Maldon site that could take four homes as a 'proof of concept' build to demonstrate the project's viability—as well as provide housing for eight locals in need. He's in discussion with a potential land-supplier in Daylesford and there are other individual landholders interested in sharing their land.

In the meantime, Clif and Josie are getting ready to go public with their appeal for funds—starting with a lottery of over \$2,000 premium wines. "That's just the beginning," Clif says. "To pay for our ongoing legals, drafting, website and computing. We don't need all the \$3.5 million to get started. Once we can afford to build one house, we'll start work. Josie and I are sick of the meetings and the talk and the symbolic actions. We're people who do things!"

Know Your / Locals - Rick and Gillian Jacobs

AFTER a 12-month search for a home in Maldon, retired Police officer Rick and his wife Gillian, a visual artist, have spent the last five weeks settling into their new life as residents.

Gillian grew up in Barwon Heads and Rick was originally from Oakleigh; they met while serving in the Army during the 1980s. Based at Puckapunyal, they chose to move out of their married quarters to buy their own home and first renovator in Avenel. Eleven years later they were ready to leave for the pastures of Western Victoria. The family spent several happy years at a tiny police residence in the friendly farming community of Balmoral before moving to Tarrington, where they continued to renovate homes and establish gardens. Their last, an 1873 bluestone cottage in Penshurst, was restored and a large garden created over a five-year period. "The hardest thing about leaving that home," Gillian said, "was to leave our established garden. A home can be renovated reasonably quickly, but a garden takes time to develop and trees to grow. At our age, we don't want to have to wait too long." Their three children-now adults-enjoyed the benefits of a rural upbringing, amusing themselves outdoors with campfires in the backyard, climbing trees, playing down by the creek, keeping chickens and ducks, rearing lambs and, for their youngest daughter, horses.

"That all started with a free pony," Gillian said with a laugh. Where they lived was, until recently, determined by their employment. This is the first time that they have been in a position to choose where to live. They first visited Maldon with their children during a very hot January about 20 years ago, a holiday that included some family history research, and it left a lasting impression. They revisited on several occasions over the ensuing years, one being a fabulous night dancing to BABBA at the twilight dinner in 2016. However, it wasn't until the desire to move from Penshurst, and another stay early last year that they knew Maldon was where they wanted to live. Apart from the obvious charm of the town itself, the vibrant community, music and art scene, friendly and interesting people and wonderful community radio were just some of the reasons for their choice. Immediately after returning home to Penshurst they informed their family and friends of their decision, prepared their property for sale and began the real estate search. "We had mixed reactions; some assumed we were moving to be closer to our children, others thought we were brave or possibly crazy to uproot ourselves yet again," said Rick.

"You do need to be brave; change is scary but also exciting. We've left dear friends and a house we loved in Penshurst to start our new lives and yet another renovation," said Gillian. As mentioned, she is a visual artist and, until recently, was producing works in traditional watercolour, influenced by her artist father. She has in recent years furthered her interest and knowledge in printmaking by attending workshops and courses. Her new home will include a studio where she can further develop her love of both subtractive printmaking, mixed medium and watercolour technique.

Once settled they intend to get out, try new things and experience what the community of Maldon and surrounding

area has to offer. "There is so much to do it's hard to keep track," said Gillian. "Rick and I love an occasion to dress up in a costume; unfortunately we weren't prepared with our Gothic outfits this year, but I'm sure there will be many other opportunities to get the sewing machine out."

They have been heavily involved in community organisations in the past but at this point in their lives don't want to overcommit themselves so as to allow time for family and travel. "We're looking forward to being able to get the train to Melbourne and the easy drive to the airport," said Rick. "It's something most people probably take for granted unless they've lived in a regional area; now we're here, we look forward to forming new friendships and having fun!"

HOW'S BUSINESS?

#3 of a series: Rebecca Barnett, The Maldon Bakery - Australia's oldest, continuously running bakery.



WHAT have you learnt about Maldon, the locals, and business during your first 10 months of taking over Maldon Bakery?

"The first 10 months have been a real baptism by fire actually. I've got to say, it's a very different beast to what I thought it would be. It's really grown, and I've had to really adapt quite quickly as required. And I love it."

"Maldon's a really vibrant, beautiful town. I would come here often, almost every weekend from Castlemaine just to have a wander. My sister lived here, and I'd come to visit her and help her in her garden, and we used to hang out. Then I saw the bakery up for sale.

"I was sort of in between jobs. I had a really lovely job at La Trobe University teaching teachers. I got retrenched during COVID. Then I got a job being a builder's labourer, which was great. I was digging post holes and making fences and building decks and architraves and all that sort of stuff. And I loved it. I loved the hands-on work. I loved the fact that there were no inane meetings, and data for the sake of data. I like tangible work where you can make something with your hands and be proud of it and do a good job."

From hands-on builder's labourer to hands-on baker...

"When I first left school, my first job was in a bakery, just serving behind the counter, and I was in all sorts of different hospitality jobs as a young person. I worked in French restaurants—high-end French, five-star restaurants—and it was very hierarchical. It was "Yes, Chef!"... "I heard, Chef!" You would learn quickly the proper way to do it. And you had to work really fast. You had to pick up the pace when it was required. You had to have exacting standards all the time. And I really liked all that."

And you have to try things, don't you, and make things, and have a go with things... it keeps you sane, and it's part of the fun, isn't it?

"Oh, absolutely. And the thing is, I would get bored if I didn't make new things ... and I wouldn't be satisfied if I didn't make products that I was proud of and excited about. Producing food that I'm really proud to sell, and I know the quality is really good, keeps me going. It feeds you as a business person."

Time to turn over your first letter...

The letters M, A, L, D, O, N were face down in front of Rebecca Barnett from Maldon Bakery. One by one, the letters were revealed and the conversation captured.

A. Attitude.



"Of all the words that could pop into my head... Attitude. But that is what I want - attitude. Attitude is everything. If you don't have the right attitude, you're going to fall in a heap. And if I've got really good people around me who have an excellent attitude...

they're all hardworking, and it's got to be an enjoyable atmosphere. 'A' for *attitude* and *atmosphere*. I spend much more time at the bakery than I do at home. The bakery has to be a nice atmosphere. Because if I'm enjoying it, and my team is enjoying it, then the customers are enjoying it."



M. Money.



"As a businessperson, I'm thinking *money*. Of course.

"And above all else, that's the super objective. It's the business. You've got to make money. Because if we're not making money, then it all falls apart. Then no one's got a job. And Maldon doesn't have this amenity, which is a bakery. The been a full-on ride. And I've just

first 10 months has been a full-on ride. And I've just been like, "Holy cow." Like a galloping horse, basically, and steering it. And I've invested a lot of money. And I've invested a lot of money back into the business, so now I've really done a lot of work in the back of house. It has a proper kitchen now with really good facilities. I have ovens that increase productivity and to make it easier for my staff to produce more and different products. This first year has been about getting a feel for the business—what was existing, what the potential is, what people want, and then making that happen by investing back into the business to make it a streamlined production, so we can keep doing that."



D. Dogs.



"Dogs? Of all the 'D' words to pop into my head...

"The Bakery is for the community. You've got to make it accessible for everyone. You don't exclude people with dogs; you don't exclude anyone. You get to know the names of people and their dogs. The garden area is accessible to dogs... and their

owners. I want people to feel that they can come in and relax, have a pie and coffee, and meet their friends. And people are doing that now. They're really taking advantage of that area."



N. Nana.



"My nana came to mind. Now I'm thinking about people who have come before in the bakery, and that's something that I really want to explore as a business. There have been generations of people that have had a real sentimental attachment to the bakery, and I would really like

to honour that. Mister McArthur and Mister McArthur Junior... the father who built the bakery and then his son who took it over... I would like to put up portraits, photographs and all the information I can get from all the generations of bakers that have gone before. I want to honour that history because I find it fascinating."



Barry Robinson, President Maldon Inc.

"I'm here for the long term, and I want to make the bakery something people will keep coming back to. Maldon has a real sentimental attachment to the bakery, and I do, too. There's such an emotional attachment to baked food that warms your tummy. I want to continue that legacy."

"Openness springs to mind. When I first bought the bakery, I thought it was such a shame to close down a beautiful little section of the shop. A section that had been closed for 17 years and used to store flour. I thought it would be lovely to open it up, even though it's not a good retail space because it's so tiny. But the

only way really that I could justify staffing it was to open a coffee window and have a turnover of coffee. And that's working really well. And now we've opened up the bakery with chairs and tables out the front. That's been terrific because it's visible from the street. And people tell me it helps bring more life to our end of the street."

Q. Hi Andrea

My pug, Honey Bear, has a habit of licking odd surfaces such as furniture legs and walls. Why might she be doing this and is there anything I can do to stop her?

An interesting question! There are a number of reasons why dogs may develop a habit of licking surfaces. One of the most common reasons is that it's a way of comforting themselves when they're feeling anxious. When a dog licks it releases endorphins, which is a hormone that reduces stress and makes them feel good. Observe your dog's behaviour to see if they are exhibiting additional signs that may indicate an underlying anxiety. Sometimes excessive licking can also be a sign that they're bored or under-stimulated, so we need to ensure our pets are getting enough daily interaction, play and exercise.

Another reason dogs may start licking surfaces might be because they are hungry or thirsty, or they may have a nutrient deficiency. Check that their diet is complete and balanced and that they are receiving enough calories for their body weight and activity level. You could try feeding smaller more frequent meals, and ensure there is plenty of fresh water available. However, if your dog seems overly hungry or thirsty there may be other health concerns which would require a visit to the vet for further investigation.

Itching can also be a cause for dogs to compulsively lick themselves, and sometimes they will start licking other surfaces as well. Ensure their parasite protection is up to date, and if you notice that their licking is causing skin irritation or sores then they will likely need further treatment by a vet.

It can be a little frustrating hearing your dog licking all the time, and repeated licking may cause damage to furniture and walls. One way to distract them is to provide them with a lick mat. These are silicon or plastic mats with grooves or nubs that you can spread with soft treats e.g., dog-friendly peanut butter. As the dog licks the food off the mat it provides mental stimulation, release of endorphins and can also help to slow down their eating. These mats often have suction cups on the back so they can be secured to the floor or wall. Remember that there are many other reasons why dogs may lick strange surfaces or lick excessively, so it's always best to have them checked by a vet to rule out or treat potential underlying medical conditions.

THE FIELD EXCURSION

ON Friday May 11 1907, senior primary students from State and private schools throughout the Castlemaine district came to Maldon for a field excursion to study the geology, flora and fauna of Mount Tarrengower and the surrounding region. Twenty-nine primary schools took part in the event.

An excursion train ran from Harcourt via Castlemaine, arriving in Maldon at about 10am. Aboard were 650 children, teachers and parents. In Maldon, local students and others from schools around Baringhup, Laanecoorie and Newstead joined them. Altogether 1,200 children and adults attended.

After gathering at the Railway Station the great swarm of children set out for the Butts, led by Inspector John W. Leach, the Education Department's most able nature studies teacher. Along the way, Leach stopped frequently to point out and explain geological formations. In Reef Street he pointed out the hard and soft layers of rock they were walking over and the erosion caused by water. Further on, they examined a miner's shaft and Leach explained the way alluvial gold deposits were formed.

On the road to the Butts, an explanation was given of the formation of sandstones. Leach also stopped by a wattle tree to point out an infestation of cottony cushion scale and to explain how the insect had devastated Californian orange groves until the Australian ladybird was introduced. A little further on, he gave a short lecture on the formation of the Nuggetty Ranges.

At the Butts, the crowd formed into picnic groups and enjoyed a lunch provided by teachers and local shopkeepers. Many of the teachers took advantage of the break to catch up with friends and colleagues from other schools. Several amateur photographers were also seen taking snap shots.

After lunch, Inspector Leach explained the formation of the flat area around the Butts before a start was made up the Mount. On the way up mistletoe hanging from a tree provided an opportunity for some comments on the relationship between the plant and the red-breasted swallow. A short break was taken near a quartz outcrop before setting out for the summit. As they went along Leach discussed some of the local fauna, including goat moths, scale insects and lizards.

When the top of the Mount was reached at about 3 o'clock, the magnificent view was admired by young and old. Local school Inspector Thomas Bothroyd gave a short talk on the surrounding landmarks, commenting on the main peaks and ranges that could be seen. Inspector Leach then gave his final talk on the Loddon Valley and described the role of glaciers and volcanoes in its formation.

At the end of Leach's talk, Inspector Bothroyd thanked the Maldon Council, local teachers and shopkeepers for their help in organising the excursion. He then called for three cheers for the people of Maldon to which everyone heartily responded. The whole party then descended the Mount and at 5.30pm the train for Castlemaine steamed out with 650 tired but happy passengers on board.



A WORD FROM YOUR LOCAL CHURCH

First Words

THERE is an event which many of us spend time waiting for; the moment of 'First Words'. Parents hover over a child waiting for those first words. Unfortunately, one of the parents may be disappointed as the child's first words are often "dad, dad, dad" or "mum, mum, mum".

Voters wait excitedly for the first words of their newly elected leader. These words are often in the form of a promise of what they will do now they are in power. Again, some

However, there are some 'first words' which are not disappointing. These are the first recorded words spoken by God. Genesis chapter 1 verse 3 says God said, "Let there be light" and there was light. Of all the things God could have said, why was "Let there be light" the first thing He said?

If we read the verses before His first words, this is what we find. Genesis 1 v 1 & 2: "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters." There was only darkness and emptiness, so God brought light into the world.

Verses 4 & 5, which follow God's 'first words' say, "God saw that the light was good, and He separated the light from the darkness, and He called the light 'day' and the darkness 'night'. And there was evening and there was morning – the first day.

In the very beginning God brought physical light to a physically dark world. However, 2000 years ago, God could see how dark the world had become spiritually, so the light He sent this time was spiritual. That spiritual light came in the form of a person, Jesus Christ.
