Changes to Camping Laws

MOUNT Alexander Shire is asking for community feedback on plans to remove permit requirements for people seeking to place a caravan, tent or tiny home on wheels on their properties where a dwelling already exists. The new law proposes to change Local Law 13 - Camping on Private Property, which currently requires property owners to apply for a permit to camp for up to six months. The changes mean people would be able to camp for an indefinite amount of time with no permit required.

A person seeking to camp or occupy a caravan or tiny house on wheels on a property where there is no existing dwelling is still required to apply to Council for a permit through the existing process.

Recent Fires

ACCORDING to Brendan McKnight, Captain of the Baringhup Fire Brigade, teams have been kept busy with fires breaking out in surrounding areas.

Baringhup firefighters were called to a large grass fire that had broken out in Woodstock on Tuesday, 31 January. The fire had been caused by some wire that got caught in a header that was stripping clover at the time, which sparked the fire. The fire also went through a large section of woodland which was much harder to extinguish. Three trucks and an SCV were sent to put it out. The fire destroyed 13 hectares.

Another fire broke out on Saturday 4

February in Dunluce (to the west of Maryborough), and two helicopters were deployed to drop loads of water on the flames. Units from Inglewood, Maldon, Lockwood, Dunolly, Marong, Baringhup West, Woodford West, Tarnagulla, Newbridge, Maiden Gully and Kangaroo Flat turned out to tackle the blaze. Ninety hectares were burnt out, and three houses were under threat.

A chopper dropped water on a bus used as a bedroom that had caught fire. The bus was put out, but the roof had caved in due to the water from the chopper. The cause of this fire is still under investigation.

Deputy Mayor Interview

PASSIONATE and personable, Cr Matt Driscoll, the new Deputy Mayor, is a local from Muckleford. He represents the Loddon ward and enjoys his role as an advocate for the people of that region.

Cr Driscoll decided to put his hand up for the job and was elected Councillor in October 2020 after watching from the sidelines for years and wanting to play a more proactive role in the community.

A father of two, Matt lives on a farm with a menagerie of pets, including horses, alpacas, two dingoes and some highland cows and sheep. He says he enjoys the role of meeting people and listening to their concerns and passions. He knows that the Council has a strong heritage responsibility to the district and explains that it is hard to get it right without community input in the planning and discussion stages. “People need to

be more involved in the consulting process,” Matt said.

Coming from a background in finance, politics is reasonably new to Matt, but as a keen learner, he has been willing to step in and become more involved.

The *Times* asked Matt: if Council had an unlimited bucket of money on hand, how would he like to see it spent? “Two important things on my agenda would be encouraging more industry and commerce to create jobs in the area that would entice people to move here,” Matt said. “The second thing is to create affordable housing and fix homelessness. The current rental situation is difficult.”

The challenge for the Council is to look at ways to make a profit so that services can be funded and sustained.

Cr Driscoll would also like to see a more flexible workforce and believes that it shouldn't be about a gender gap in pay but

equality in the workforce where people are paid for individual and equal output. Flexible work-life balance is essential to Matt, who wears many hats, as the Chair of Rotary as well as Chair of Workspace Australia, which supports micro-businesses in Central Victoria.

Matt is always available to talk with, and you can call or email him with your thoughts, issues and questions. You can find him on the first Thursday of each month from 10am to 12pm at the Newstead RTC, where he provides a listening post.

The latest additions to our collection have been the arrival of our two sculptors, Angie Hill and Wen Llewellyn. They both work in Terracotta Clay from South Australia and used their pottery to maintain sanity during the COVID-19 lockdowns. Having attended a gnome workshop prior to COVID, they both decided to use this industrious activity as a means of coping with their boredom and uncertainty of these difficult two years. Wen Llewellyn, of Welsh heritage, achieved a gnome a day, each gnome expressing how she felt each day. The gnomes are sad, thoughtful, strangled and most with long hair, as we all had, suffering senses of heart displacement and despair, masked and sceptical.

Angie Hill moved away from gnomes and put her energy into creating the most entertaining Welsh Dragons. Being born in Wales, she has expressed her heritage in humorous and loveable faces that are provocative, loving and dependant in some cases and ferocious and strong in other cases. All the gnomes and dragons have Welsh names. They are set up in front of one of Chris Moule's Grampians pictures, and this gives the atmosphere of a rocky home. Angie has ventured into the creation of Australian Native Animals, and we are displaying a Frog, Echidna, Platypus

and Pangolin (not Australian, but endangered).

Wen and Angie have mentioned in passing that they are keen to develop a group that wishes to meet and play with clay in the near future.

Pauline Robinson has certainly brought something different to the gallery, being the only 2D artist who has expressed a spiritual nature in her work. Angel Blue brings a sense of the spirit, and her four faces in one picture express the diversity of women. Pauline's scratchboard creations evoke a sense of mystery and universal consciousness. She scratches the blackboard, making white marks on the board. When the sketch is done, she then colours the white patches with very colourful and bright inks. One has to look at these spiritual creations that each tell a story and appear to be more interesting with each examination.

Col Brown will be missed with his humorous 'Grandma's Sitting Room' and 'The Dunnyman' and then his realistic renditions of the bush and his attractive interpretation of a Snow Gum in the snow 'Reaching for the Sky'.

Joe Jakitsch, with his more contemporary approach to the bush around his hometown of Tarnagulla, brings to the gallery a sense of freedom in the way he creates forests that appear to be moving and dancing.

Leonie Auhl, who has produced much bold and colourful Linocut work in previous shows, now has presented us with aquatint etchings, exhibiting the detail she is able to produce in her work.

Mal Gilmour has changed his collection somewhat. He brought us miniatures to hang but has recently added two larger works, both charming and packed with interesting detail. He creates the Mallee Bush astoundingly with brushes with one and two hairs. His studio is full of long skinny containers, graded according to how many hairs are in the brushes.

Lyn Cook, with her glorious renditions of Australian Birds, continues to bring great joy to those who inspect the detailed works. In the last few weeks, we have acquired a pair of Black Cockatoos, as well as a Green Tree Frog focusing on a native Blue Banded bee that is about to be devoured. All six of the hung works are exacting and precise.

Serge Daeffler continues to colour our walls, and we have some very attractive and well-executed new works of his at Hoppers.

The show is changing all the time, so be sure to come in and view it before it is gone forever. Works may be purchased and taken on the day. We have electronic banking facilities.

Electoral Structure Review Underway

THE electoral structure review for Mount Alexander Council began this week, with preliminary submissions opening on Wednesday 8 February.

At present, the Shire is divided into five wards with a total of seven councillors. One ward (Castlemaine) is represented by three councillors while the other four wards (Calder, Coliban, Loddon River and Tarrengower) have one councillor each.

Mount Alexander Shire is one of 12 rural shire councils that will undergo electoral structure reviews throughout 2023-24. Under the Local Government Act 2020, the changes stipulate that all small and large rural shire councils must now have electoral structures that are either unsubdivided, subdivided with single-councillor wards, or multi-councillor wards with an equal number of councillors per ward.

The reviews will be conducted by independent electoral representation advisory panels.

The Victorian Electoral Commission (VEC) will provide technical and administrative support to the panels. Mount

Alexander Shire Council's review will continue until 24 May.

At present, Mount Alexander Shire is one of 39 councils across Victoria that must have a compliant electoral structure in time for the October 2024 elections. Issues to be considered are: what is an appropriate number of councillors (the number should be between five and 12)? If subdivided, how many wards should there be? How many councillors should represent each ward? Are the ward boundaries appropriate? Should the names of wards be changed?

The *Times* inquired this week whether the Council would be making its own submission to the review. Information regarding the nature of that submission - or whether in fact a submission was being made at all - was unavailable.

2023 is well and truly upon us, and there is no stopping the Maldon Market. Our wonderful stall holders keep on coming, no matter the weather or time of year. Hail, rain or shine, month in and month out, on the second Sunday of every month, Maldon Market brings it on!

A regular stall is our much loved sourdough bread-making specialists, 'Bread Builders'. Ken and Amy who have worked tirelessly to bring us their organic artisan bread for the past 10 years, never missing a market that we can recall.

Ken Hercott became interested in bread and baking at an early age, growing up on an organic wheat farm in the Loddon Mallee region. He taught himself to bake using wheat milled on the family farm and sold his first loaf of bread to neighbours in the nearest town, Swan Hill, aged 19.

In 1993, aged 23, Ken did an informal apprenticeship in the USA, under master baker Richard Bourdon of Berkshire Mountain Bakery. This raised Ken's baking skills to a professional level and cemented his commitment to making quality 'naturally leavened' bread. Next came 10 years of baking and honing his wood oven skills in Melbourne. Then to Europe with his family in tow, where Ken embarked on a Parisian bakery crawl and helped with the re-emergence of 'real bread' in Britain. He lived, baked and taught on Barbiolla, an organic farm in Tuscany, for two years. Ken's love of the leaven has taken him around the planet. He and Amy settled in Maldon in 2011 and found that the town did not have any naturally leavened bread.

Making quality Sourdough bread requires an understanding of the science of a natural living yeast (starter/leaven) which is used to rise/prove the bread before baking. "Keeping a healthy, happy starter makes for a good loaf of bread," says Ken, who bakes bread once a month for our local Maldon Market. Ken and Amy have been baking as 'Bread Builders' for the Maldon market since 2013. They do a fantastic job, and not only do they use Victorian organic flours, but Maldon Market is the only place you can get a loaf of Ken's French-styled sourdough bread.

Also available at the market is fresh seasonal produce with stone fruits from 'Jim and Jen' and garden vegetables from 'Sandors' Harvest'. It's a real treat having these stall holders support our market and our town with fresh produce.

This month's community group is the Maldon Golf Club; please give generously at the gate donations and grab one or two of our local Biodynamic Brad's sausages at the BBQ.

Come along and enjoy the local music (members of the 'Darling Buds of Maldon'), the food, the fun and the artisan's fare of Maldon's Market. There really is something for everyone.

Beware of Smishing Scams

TEXT message scams, also known as 'smishing' or SMS phishing, have become increasingly common in recent years, and the effects can be devastating for those who fall victim to them.

One of the most prevalent types of smishing involves criminals posing as family members, friends, or loved ones in order to trick people into giving them sensitive information or sending them money.

For example, the *Times* received a text message recently claiming to be from a family member who had supposedly dropped their phone down the toilet and was using an old one. While this may seem like a harmless request, it is important to remember that scammers can easily impersonate someone's phone number or contact information.

If you receive a text message from someone claiming to be a loved one in need, do not immediately respond or provide any personal information. Instead, try to verify the authenticity of the message by reaching out to the person directly through a different method, such as a phone call or a message on a different platform.

Ask Your Vet

Hi Andrea,

Our blue heeler Gus has a habit of running after and chasing us whenever we're out riding on the mower or our bikes and biting at the wheels. I'm guessing he's doing this because it's in his nature as a working dog? Is there any way we can stop him from doing this, as we're worried he'll injure himself one day?

Hi Grace,

You're right in thinking Gus is just doing his job! Blue heelers, also known as Australian Cattle dogs, are herding dogs that were originally bred to work on farms or stations. The modern cattle dogs that are around today have actually been developed by breeding herding dogs with dingoes. As a breed, blue heelers are very intelligent, hard-working and highly energetic, which makes them well-suited to rounding up sheep or droving cattle over long distances and rough terrain. They got the name 'heeler' due to their way of nipping at the heels of cattle to make them move. These days they have become less popular as working dogs in favour of other breeds, such as kelpies or border collies. It is common to see them now as loyal and affectionate pets; however, it's important to remember they still retain the natural herding instincts and personality traits that made them good working dogs.

My guess is that when Gus sees you out riding around, he may be trying to round you up by nipping at your wheels like he would with cattle. It may be very difficult, if it's even possible, to train an instinctual breed behaviour out of a dog. Depending on Gus' age, you may find ways of managing this instinct, such as setting up a structured regimen with command and crate training. It's important to remember that if he's not working, he will need daily bouts of high-level physical activity and mental stimulation to prevent him from becoming bored and destructive. You could consider agility training or herding classes to provide an outlet for his energy. If these options are not feasible - perhaps due to his age, home environment or family situation - then is there a way you could contain him in a run or different area of the property, so he's not chasing after you? As you've mentioned, it would be a concern if he were to injure himself by biting on turning wheels, especially at speed. Hopefully, you'll be able to work something out that will be sustainable and stress-free for both you and Gus.

Blast from the Past

IVOR SAMPSON'S OLD STOCK

In April 1976 film producer Pat Lovell and director Ken Hannam started shooting the movie *Break of Day* in and around Maldon. It followed closely after Peter Weir's highly successful *Picnic at Hanging Rock* on which Lovell had been the executive producer. *Break of Day* was set in 1920 in a quiet country town and traced a Gallipoli veteran as he tried to adjust to civilian life. Filming in Maldon took about five weeks, and many locals were employed as extras.

Wendy Dickson, Ken Hannam's wife, was the film's costume designer. In December 1976 she was interviewed by Kay Keavney for the *Australian Women's Weekly*. In the interview, Dickson spoke about her encounter with Ivor Sampson and his drapery store. Sampson was a descendant of the McFarlane family and continued their business in High Street, which had been established in about 1862.

When Dickson entered Sampson's store, she said it was like something out of her childhood. It brought back fragrances from her youth, and she felt sure that she would find something wonderful. She asked Ivor Sampson if he had any old stock, and Ivor said that he thought not, but she could have a look around the storeroom.

When Dickson entered the storeroom, she said she felt like Alice in Wonderland. It was a treasure trove full of clothes never worn, including long-forgotten shoes, stockings and gloves. Many of the items were from the period in which the film was set. She also found authentic 1880s corsets and boxes of celluloid collars.

Dickson used many of the clothes she found in Sampson's storeroom to outfit extras, particularly in a scene depicting a picnic cricket match. The stock had included old cricket creams and flannel shirts. The film crew were so taken with the old stock that they bought most of it up before they left town. They offered to pay the current value of the clothes, but Ivor would only accept the original prices marked on the garments in pounds, shillings and pence.

Ivor was just one of the Maldon locals who got behind the production of *Break of Day*. Wendy Dickson said that, while the cast and crew all did a great job, it was Maldon and its locals that really shone in the end product.
