

Deniliquin on the Edwards River. This meant that his bees were stranded for seven months in NSW, and he missed out on the lucrative pollinating season with Victoria's crops.

Then came the floods and an unseasonal spell of cool weather. It has not been a happy time for bees! They need nectar and pollen all year round, which means that hives need to be constantly shifted to follow the honey flow.

The good news is that when the Times spoke to Lindsay last week, his hives were now back in Victoria after two days of hard work. "The move was quick, short and sharp, and I'm so relieved the hives are back," Lindsay said. "It'll be ironbark and grey box for the bees now, and it's important to get them into good shape. From now until May makes a big difference in beekeeping. We need to build up momentum to get the bees through winter and ready for the almond blossom in August."

But so far, 2023 is looking very bullish. It'll be business as usual.'

Warral Maldon is a large operation, and there are now around 3,500 hives that need constant tending. Over 150 tonnes of honey and 2,000kg of beeswax are produced each year at the Warral Maldon factory in Boundary Road. Much of Warral's output is destined for the wholesale market, but there is a retail shop on the premises that sells honey, honeycomb and beeswax products.

Lindsay is the fifth generation of his family to work in the honey industry. And he loves his bees. "Did you know that a third of what we eat starts with a bee hive?" he said. "Five years ago, 40 to 50 billion dollars was directly attributed to bee pollination in the agriculture sector in Australia. That figure would be much higher now. Bees have a vital part to play in our economy and in feeding the world."

THE *Times* spoke to Porcupine Village owner Frank Hutchinson this week about the recent shutdown of works at the site.

From the start of this project, Frank and the management team were taking advice from a Town Planning consultant with over 30 years' experience. Unfortunately, some of this advice was flawed, specifically around what could and couldn't be done prior to permits being approved.

Frank is now working with a Melbourne-based group of town planners who have a great deal of experience in dealing with complex planning issues. He was meeting with them this week in order to work through the issues that to date have bedevilled the development at Porcupine Village.

"I'm confident that these planners will be able to guide the project through the planning process without any further problems," Frank said. "It has been a difficult time, and there have been instances where we didn't realise that we had overstepped the line. Ultimately, we take responsibility for that.

Correction

THE article in last week's *Times* that covered the Twilight Market contained some errors.

The Market, and also the Twilight Dinner, were organised by Pamela Jewson under the auspices of not-for-profit group Maldon Eat Drink Events Inc. The article did not make mention of this group, but instead referred to Pamela's role as Secretary of Maldon Inc. As is the case with many people in Maldon who are on more than one committee, Pamela is indeed Maldon Inc. secretary. And it is Felicity Howard, not Pamela, who should be acknowledged as the person who worked hard in her role as Market Coordinator to make the Twilight Market a success by inviting a diversity of stallholders to participate.

The Times apologises for these inaccuracies.

Porcupine Village Update

The most difficult part is that we had to put 13 contractors and employees off. From now on, we will be getting expert advice and making sure that everything we do is in line with council requirements."

Frank is very supportive of his managers Debra and Doug Baird, who he said have worked hard on the project. "They're straightforward and honest people with a high degree of integrity and they are doing an outstanding job," he said.

When it comes to the large white marquee, which has attracted some negative comments, Frank said that it is planned to soften the visual impact by using various methods, such as high brush fencing and natural colours.

A businessman of many years standing, Frank is involved in a family-run company in the automotive industry. "So you could say that I have business experience, but not a lot in the tourism industry," Frank said. "But Porcupine Village is something that I'm very enthusiastic about. It will be a wonderful development and will benefit not just Maldon, but the whole Central Victorian region."

Frank emphasised that during the process of applying for a planning permit, his door is open. "We want to work with everyone," he said. "We want to sit down and talk to people both groups and individuals. Let's work together. Our planning submission is available online for anyone to see. These complex projects require sign-off from a whole range of regulatory bodies (CFA, Vicroads etc.). Most of these bodies have approved our plan, some with conditions that we need to comply with."

Crunch Time for Aged Care Services?





Porcupine Resort

I was so optimistic and excited when Porcupine Village found a new owner who intended to restore the very neglected, existing infrastructure. I was optimistic that the restored historic village and motel units would bring renewed tourist business to our community and excited that we'd have another venue for dinner outings. I've dined at the restaurant several times already and am very impressed; I think it's now the best option in town.

When the large white marquee was erected last Easter for a wedding function, I assumed it was a temporary structure. However, after the wedding, every time I drove past, and it was still there, my blood pressure would rise higher. I think it is extremely inappropriate and should never be permitted in the location along this major approach road to our heritage town. Over the past many months, I've continued to drive past the marquee feeling very angry, assuming that the Shire had permitted this structure. I also assumed that I'd missed the opportunity to object to its permit.

Since I recently became aware that the owner does not have an approved permit for this marquee, I am even more upset! It does, in fact, contravene Mt. Alexander Shire's Significant Landscape Overlay 1 and 3. I've since become aware that other works have been performed without an approved permit, about the proposed loss of native habitat and heritage gold-mining landscape, the potential problems with sewerage treatment and animal enclosures; all for the construction of a totally new, excessive, 'resort-style' development.

I feel like I've been cheated and fooled by the new owner/ developer. I originally believed Maldon's community was gaining a restored Porcupine Village, but what we're getting is an enormous private business venture that will be unlikely to bring increased patrons to other businesses in town. I've also read the comments posted on the Maldon Notice Board Facebook page, which have led to much stress and anxiety in our community, and for this reason, I have also decided not to go public.

All these very disappointing factors have led me to submit an objection to Mt. Alexander Shire. I chose to live in Maldon because of its unique heritage features and charm. Every time one of these features is altered, the original heritage values of our town are gradually eroded and lost forever. *Name and Address supplied*

Maldon Streetscape Rejuvenation Project

For those in the Mount Alexander Shire who have an appreciation for Maldon as Australia's First Notable Town, the current changes to the town centre are cause for much concern.

Installing power underground as part of the Streetscape Rejuvenation Project has been a superb success. Not so, the rest of the project. It started with a joke and is ending as a travesty! Gravesites in Main Street evolved into ducks on ponds, and we all had a good chuckle. We didn't know that much worse was to come.

Any regard for the uniqueness of Maldon appears to have been completely ignored with the adoption of stock, non-specific designs that are unsightly, lack cohesiveness, are hazardous, and are not at all suited to Australia's First Notable Town.

Are the unique, significant stone gutters lost to us forever, or will there be remedial works undertaken to rectify the mortaring and laying patterns so inconsiderately used? Second-hand garden sleepers bolted onto the roadway as a design feature – come on!

Oversized tree outstands that seem to keep the water AWAY from the trees and just too far out onto the road; high edges on crossovers presenting a trip hazard for pedestrians; road excavations again and again on multiple occasions; and pedestrian crossings that aren't really.

Where did these ideas come from? Did the planners even visit Maldon? It all seems to be symptomatic of what has happened to design and planning in Maldon; very generic, with no consideration given to its unique and original character. Do we have to accept this second-rate design and workmanship? \$4.5 million, what a waste of our taxes. Will Council step up and rectify the problems? Can they?

I urge those dissatisfied with the project to make your concerns known to the Minister for Local Government, the CEO of Mount Alexander Shire and our Councillor S. Gardner. Whilst I have had no response from the last two, who knows, you may be lucky!

<u>30 Lowther Street - permit for nine-lot subdivision,</u> removal of native and non-native vegetation

It is to be hoped that there may be people in the Maldon vicinity who have concerns re. the above application. The land is close to the junction between Lowther Street and High Street and is the western gateway into Maldon. The land supports various wildlife and has, on its perimeter adjacent to Lowther Street, a magnificent, healthy old oak tree. The future of this tree is uncertain. It would be a sad loss to the streetscape should it be felled.

Nine lots would seem to be a case of overdevelopment and inconsistent with other recent properties built along the same side of the road on larger individual blocks towards the Church Street junction. Due to its proximity to the High Street junction, there seems to be a potentially dangerous situation. This is the designated route for large trucks. The application includes three access points directly onto Lowther Street within metres of each other. One would hope that the Road Safety Authority would have grave concerns.

This particular development may set a precedent of greater density for future projects and is something that should not be happening in Maldon if it is to retain its appeal.

Comments / Objections can be submitted to the shire and time is short. Please support this move to drastically reduce this overdevelopment which will be detrimental to the nature of Maldon.

Will Councillors examine this application carefully? As it stands, it would set an undesirable precedent for the future. *Concerned Resident Maldon*



On Our Selection: The Original Dad and Dave Stories by Steele Rudd

This Australian classic, first published in 1899, has entertained generations of readers with tales of the fictional Rudd family. Our version was published in 1995, complete with the original illustrations, to coincide with the release of the film Dad and Dave: On Our Selection. The front and back covers have photos of the cast, including Leo McKern (who played Dad), Joan Sutherland (Mother) and Geoffrey Rush (Dave). This little gem is not new to our collection, but for a long while now has been hidden away on a bottom shelf in the corridor amongst non-fiction books. Dear Andrea,

I have a Jack Russell who follows me everywhere and stares at me when I am sitting down. Why does he stare at me? *Mel*

Hi Mel,

There are a few reasons dogs may follow us around and stare at us, and in many cases, this behaviour stems from them trying to communicate something to us or waiting for a command. If a dog is sitting and staring at you, have a look at what their body language might be saying. Are their ears pricked and their head cocked in curiosity or listening for a verbal cue? Are their eyes alert or fearful? Is their body relaxed or rigid, tail wagging or still? Dogs have many ways to communicate with us using their bodies, and it can take a bit of practice to interpret what they may be trying to say.

A dog that follows its owner around may be looking for interaction or attention. Do you have a routine for walking your dog or a set feeding time? They could be telling you it's time to grab the lead and take them for a walk or have some play time outside. If it's time for a meal, they may be following you around, hoping you'll go to the fridge or pantry and get their food ready. If you have a strong bond with your dog, it may stare at you simply because they are waiting for your companionship or company. Some dogs have a personality that makes them more likely to want to be close to their human counterparts. It is possible that a dog that constantly follows its owner around may have a clingy personality or suffer from a bit of separation anxiety. If this is the case, training your dog to become more independent or having ways to manage their anxiety may help them feel a bit more comfortable in their own company, especially when they're at home on their own.

Maldon Landfill

MT Alexander Shire Council will be resuming the management and operation of the Maldon and Castlemaine transfer stations following DRE Earthenviro's contract expiring.

After more than 10 years of waste management facilities being operated by contractors, Council has decided to bring the service in-house from 1 February 2023.

Council would like to thank DRE Earthenviro for their services over the years. The company began managing both the Maldon and Castlemaine facilities in late 2015 and later helped transition the Castlemaine site to become a transfer station when the landfill closed in 2020.

The Council-run transfer stations are expected to result in more effective sorting and recovery of valuable resources, and increased flexibility to meet changes in the sector as well as meeting community needs.

Blast from the Past

TOMMY BENT IN MALDON

The Victorian Premier, Thomas Bent, arrived in Maldon by train on the evening of Thursday 7 September 1905. Local MLA, Harry Lawson, had invited him to visit the town and present the prizes at the local ANA musical and elocutionary competitions. The competitions were held over five days at the Masonic Hall (now the Christmas Shop) and were to culminate in a grand concert on Friday night.

In the 1880s, Tommy Bent had earned a reputation as one of Victoria's most colourful and corrupt politicians. Despite being discredited and losing his seat in 1894, he returned to politics in 1900 and by 1904 found himself both Victoria's Premier and Treasurer.

After arriving from Castlemaine on the evening train, Bent and Lawson went straight to the Masonic Hall, where the impromptu speech contest was taking place. The audience welcomed him enthusiastically and broke into an original song to the tune of 'Dolly Gray' that ended with the lines,

We will ask no awkward questions, Such as how's your surplus spent. We'll not mention the elections, What ho! Tommy Bent.

Bent acknowledged the crowd but said he thought their poetry was hardly up to Shakespeare's standards. He then replied with his own verse, This is a night for fun and frolic, To carry off spleen, physic, dull care, and colic

Those who wish to be joyous and gay, Try a trip to the Masonic Hall at Maldon to drive dull care away.

Bent remained in the audience until the night's competition was completed and stayed in Maldon overnight. The next day he visited the Hospital and the North British mine before travelling to Laanecoorie where he visited the State School. On returning to Maldon, Bent and Lawson dined with the Shire Council and discussed funding for road projects in the Shire,

In the evening, the ANA competitions culminated with a grand concert featuring all the prize winners. A capacity audience filled the Masonic Hall in anticipation not only of the planned entertainment but also to hear the Premier speak.

Bent did not disappoint the crowd. Before distributing the prizes, he praised the ANA for the role their competitions played in community education and then, in response to calls from the audience, recite some verse and sang a comic song. After presenting the prizes, Bent provided an encore by reciting passages from *The Taming of the Shrew* and *Romeo and Juliet*.


