Footbridge, Gutter Danger



☆ Care is needed when negotiating Maldon's gutters and footbridges.

MALDON'S heritage-listed gutters in Main Street and High Street may look good and are effective during heavy rain events, but they can be tricky to negotiate when getting in and out of your car. The wooden footbridges can also be dangerous, particularly for people with balance problems.

Take the case of Madeleine, aged 83, who tripped on the slippery footbridge in the rain recently and ended up lying in the stone gutter with water gushing past as she lay in the cold, wet drain. When the ambos were called, the instructions were to not move her. This was a dire situation, however, and the ambulance was a long way from Maldon at the time. Luckily a friend, a trained nurse, had been dining with the family and was on hand to check all was okay with the patient. Madeleine was helped into the safety of the dry car and on to the hospital for treatment.

The *Times* spoke to Madeleine's daughter Sandra Strongman about the incident. "She tripped on the trivet (the raised edge) of the ramp as we were reversing the car close to the curb to make it easier for my mother to get in from the rain," Sandra said.

Her mother suffered broken ribs and hairline fractures. "She has lost her confidence walking places since the accident," Sandra said.

Sandra and her mother hold no grudge, but Sandra said, "As Maldon is a tourist town with many visitors, I think handrails should be placed on the bridges."

Another local resident who chose not to be named also experienced a scary fall. She told the *Times* that on a rainy day, as a sleep-deprived mum taking the baby out of the car seat, she tripped and fell, almost dropping the baby. "Parking on the street in the rain and leaning in to unbuckle children can

be risky business," she said. She has no complaints with the council but often notes the struggles of visitors who park in the town as they manoeuvre the wide drains and the footpath. She wants to warn new mothers to be aware of the dangers, especially in the rain.

These events are not isolated incidents.

Most would agree that railings on the footbridges would help immensely in the prevention of further accidents. Take care when crossing the bridges and negotiating the gutters, especially during adverse weather.

Green Light For Slingo Depot

FOLLOWING a recent VCAT ruling, Slingo Earthmoving has been granted a permit to build a depot off Butchers Road in Muckleford, off the Maldon-Castlemaine Road.

Approval has also been given to remove native vegetation in order to widen that intersection. The VCAT decision overturns Mt Alexander Shire's refusal to grant a planning permit. The Slingo depot will occupy a 2.5-hectare site within a 40-hectare rural property.

Council's reasons for refusing a permit were that the site was within the Farming Zone; that there were potential safety issues relating to nearby roads; and that nearby properties could be affected by dust, noise and negative visual impact.

According to the VCAT ruling, the granting of a permit will not lead to significant loss of productive farming land as the area in question is one of low-quality agricultural land. This loss is acceptable when weighed up against the proposal's potential economic and employment benefits.

The issue of native vegetation removal will be, in VCAT's opinion, offset by new vegetation that will be planted as part of the proposed landscaping of the site.

VCAT discounted Council's concerns about the potential safety issue of slow-moving vehicles turning onto the Maldon-Castlemaine Road, where traffic travels at 100kmh and where there is a hill to the west of the Butchers Road intersection.

The VCAT judgement pointed out that heavy trucks carrying livestock etc., already use Butchers Road, and there have been no previous issues regarding those trucks turning onto the Maldon-Castlemaine Road. In addition, according to the VCAT ruling, road works proposed by Slingo will improve the intersection for all those using the road.

Satisfaction Survey

MOUNT Alexander Shire Council's annual community satisfaction survey will begin on Monday 30 January.

The annual survey is coordinated by Local Government Victoria and assesses the performance of Council-delivered services in Mount Alexander Shire. It is also a chance for Council to learn the value the community places on these services.

The telephone survey of a random representative sample of 400 residents will be undertaken by independent market research agency National Field Surveys from the end of January to mid-March. While the overall results are provided to Council, individual details and responses remain confidential.

Mount Alexander Shire Council's Mayor, Cr Rosie Annear, said that the annual survey is a great opportunity for Council to hear directly from members of the community.

"We want to know what matters most to our residents and how they think we're performing," said Cr Annear. "The results give us an inside look at the needs and expectations of the community and help us identify areas for continued improvement. We encourage residents to take this opportunity to provide feedback if they receive a call."

The majority of Victorian councils participate in this state-wide survey. The results are benchmarked against a state-wide average and similar-sized local government areas.

Creeping Gentrification (a reply)

There are a number of items that I would like to expand on in connection regarding the letter to the editor from Bruce Clements (TT 13 January). I certainly agree with Bruce's sentiment regarding the demise of Maldon's heritage protection and various works under the auspice of the 'Maldon Streetscape Project'.

With regard to studies, guidelines and policies, as well as general history books, Maldon is probably ranked number one within the shire's towns for having the most of these undertaken by the council, especially when you consider those from the former Shire of Maldon as well as those from the current Mount Alexander Shire.

As for either a Maldon Heritage Committee or even one for the whole of Mount Alexander Shire, the current council fail miserably in this respect. Prior to the shire amalgamations in 1995, Maldon had its own Heritage Committee, which remained post-amalgamation for a number of years. Post amalgamation there was the Mount Alexander Shire Heritage Advisory Committee, along with the Maldon Heritage Committee who maintained watch over Maldon's heritage. But in the wisdom of the Mount Alexander Shire about 12 years ago, they decided to disband both of the heritage committees to form one shire-wide committee. Initially Maldon was lucky having a couple of voices on this new committee amongst those from other parts of the shire. But all this disintegrated about six years ago when the four-year community membership term expired with no renewal of membership and consequently disappeared onto the dusty shelf with all the other studies and guidelines about Maldon. The shire has now decided to go down the path of establishing 'Public Advisory Groups' (PAG) for projects like the Maldon Streetscape and the recent Castlemaine Study, which was starting up towards the end of last year. These PAGs might be suitable as you get members who are local and interested in the project at hand, but you do

not have the benefit of corporate knowledge that is generally contained within a shire-wide heritage committee with a stable long-term membership. This long-term membership of a shire-wide heritage committee is beneficial as the members have a solid understanding of the Planning & Environment Act and how it relates to the council planning scheme, along with the Heritage Act and the protection this brings to the shire's heritage. On top of this, the former shire-wide heritage committee was the main group in the development of the Mount Alexander Shire's Heritage Strategy and Heritage Priorities Plan, which hasn't been updated since 2016.

All this from a shire that promotes itself on heritage, heritage-related tourism and is involved with the current push for World Heritage Listing of the Central Victorian Goldfields. If they are not careful, the entire heritage showcase might disappear before the next generation gets a chance to see it in its grandeur.

Porcupine Village - More Comments

As some readers may be aware, there has been much activity of late on social media regarding progress on Porcupine Village. Those posting and commenting would have you believe that those with concerns about the impacts of the project are anti-progress or anti-fun. Nothing could be further from the truth. Any concerns relate to impacts on the landscape character and environmental and amenity values of this gateway and rural living area outside of the town centre.

When it was announced that the Village had been purchased, I believe that the sentiment was almost universally positive – that a restaurant, refurbished motel, and refreshed replica mining village would be of significant benefit to Maldon. What was less obvious then, and still may not be obvious to many, was the proposed additional development contained in the planning application, which also included a caravan park, 'Glamtainer' accommodation units, as well as the highly visible licensed function marquee (the infrastructure of which was installed in April 2022 without a permit).

These additional items will require the clearing of 90 trees, which is a large proportion of the existing trees on site, within a significant landscape planning zone intended to protect the character of the gateway to Maldon. The total proposed site capacity is, conservatively, more than 700 people (which is more than one-third of Maldon's population). In the event of fire, these people need to be evacuated safely.

Those objecting have every right to do so, as do those who submit letters of support for the project. However, this should be contingent upon awareness of the full facts. The social media posts and vitriolic comments have sought to blame others for the Village management's casual disregard for planning regulations and liquor licensing rules. It is pretty poor form for members of the community to know the rules that apply to your business better than management itself. Works have been stopped by Council as the more expanded plans have not been approved. Amplified concerts have been stopped by the State, as the liquor licence only allows for acoustic music. I suggest you visit the Roo or Maldon Hotel

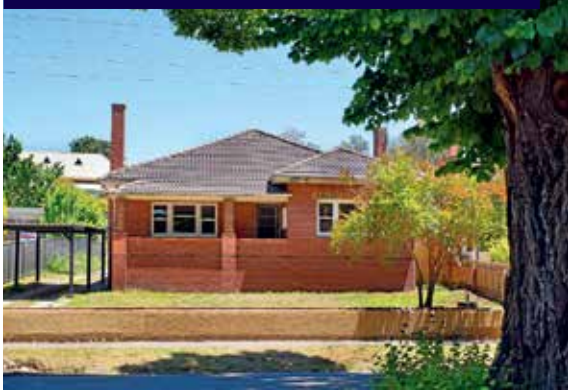

Dear Andrea,

Our children have been nagging us for some time to get a dog, and I'm thinking about finally giving into them. We want a breed that is child-friendly, doesn't shed too much, is easy to train and doesn't need too much exercise.

Any suggestions?

Hi Amy,

This is a great question and a very important one to consider when choosing a new dog to join the family. Here are some suggestions of dog breeds that may suit a young, busy family:

Poodles | poodle crosses ie. cavoodles, schnoodles, groodles etc: These have become very popular due to their low shedding coats and hypoallergenic hair. They are, therefore, very attractive as pets for people with allergies or families with young children. Although they don't shed much hair, their coats may still require a bit of effort and dedication in keeping them clipped short and well-maintained. They are also intelligent, which makes them relatively easy to train. On the flip-side, ensure you have enough time to spend playing and interacting with them; otherwise, they may become bored.

Maltese | Shihtzu | LahsaApso | Bichon Frise: Size is another important consideration. Smaller dogs are generally easier to handle, plus their small size means they are lower cost in terms of food, bedding, parasite preventatives and medications. These small breed dogs are the perfect companion or lap dog, are relatively easy to train, enjoy playing games and don't require extensive amounts of exercise. They don't shed too much fur and are lower allergenic, but their coats may require some level of maintenance.

Whippet | Greyhound: These breeds have a gentle, loving nature and don't require extensive exercise. They don't shed as much hair as other breeds, and their coats require almost no maintenance. Ensure you have enough space for them to roam around if they require, but they will also be just as happy lazing on the couch with you.

Golden retrievers | Labradors: These larger breed dogs are known for their beautiful, loyal personality. They do require a moderate level of exercise and maintenance but are suitable for young families due to their gentle nature, good behaviour and ability to train them well.

These are just a few ideas, but there are many other breeds of dogs out there that may fit in with your family. You may also consider adopting a dog – many older or more mature dogs may already be well-trained, and may also be less energetic and more independent than a puppy or younger dog. The other benefit is their personality is already developed, so you may have a better idea of whether they might be a good fit. I'm sure the right dog is out there waiting for you!

All community input received will be collated and provided to Councillors for their review and consideration during the budget process. Councillors will consider the draft budget for adoption at the meeting of Council in June 2023.

Porcupine Village - Further Comments

There is much I wish to say in this letter, but perhaps I'll begin with why I'm not putting my name to it. The recent comments on social media that blame objectors for the current stop-works at Porcupine Village have turned the matter into a divisive issue, and some residents, myself included, do not want to become the focus of these baseless and intimidating remarks. This is an example of how negative use of social media discourages free and open speech – a topic for another day.

It is a nonsense to suggest that the current situation has been caused by objectors when in fact, Mount Alexander Shire is following due process, as set out in the Planning and Environment Act and local planning scheme, to ensure that relevant permits are applied for and issued for all works proposed for the site before construction begins.

Most people I have spoken to welcome the reopening of Porcupine Village in a form that reflects its former operation. However, what is planned for the site is much more than this and includes a 38-site caravan park, 26 'Glamtainer' shipping container accommodation units, a 250-person licensed function marquee, a 100-person licensed restaurant (and music venue), swimming pool, petting zoo and wildlife enclosure.

This is a large and complex proposal, and some community members, understandably, are worried about the potential impact of the size and density of the planned development,


which could see some 500 people on the site at a time. Concerns include impacts on existing vegetation and wildlife habitat (90 trees to be removed); impacts on the landscape and approach to Maldon (protected under Significant Landscape Overlays) caused by the installation of signage and built structures, such as the large marquee already erected on site; detriment caused to neighbours' amenity by noise and light; and heightened bushfire risk and increased traffic management issues, including emergency access.

For those interested, the planning application for the proposed development can be viewed on Mount Alexander's GreenLight permit web page and at council offices. If anyone has concerns about the development, objections can be posted or emailed to council's planning department.

Blast from the Past

WILLIAM EDWARD PREECE



William Preece and his family.

AT some time William Edward (Bill) Preece chiselled his name on what is now known as Preece's Rock at the back of Mount Tarrengower, but who was W.E. Preece?

William was born at Tarilta near Guildford in 1855. His parents, Isaac Preece and Elizabeth James, had married in 1846 in Glamorgan, Wales, and came to Victoria with their two eldest children just before William's birth. In 1864 Isaac and Elizabeth, with their then seven children, moved to Maldon and settled in Parkins Reef Road.

As a young man, William performed in local concerts and was probably a member of the Parkins Reef Brass Band that his uncle, Richard Preece, formed in 1874. Later, William played piccolo in the Maldon Brass Band and became its bandmaster in 1888. He was also an active member of the Australian Natives Association and occasionally had his poetry published in the *Tarrangower Times*. In 1891 William wrote a rousing song that was sung to celebrate the Maldon Junior Football Club's premiership win over Castlemaine.

William worked as an engine driver at the Derby United mine. He was a very active unionist and, for 23 years was the local secretary of the Engine Drivers' Association. He was also an early member of the Maldon branch of the Political Labor Council, a forerunner of the Australian Labor Party. William was elected to the Maldon Shire Council in 1915 and served as a councillor for three years.

During the First World War, William opposed Billy Hughes' attempts to introduce conscription. William was the president of the Maldon Anti-Conscription League and constructed the famous 'Vote No' sign on Preece's Hill south of Maldon.

William always insisted that while he opposed conscription, he did not oppose Australia's war effort. At the same time that he was building the 'Vote No' sign he was also the secretary of the Maldon Progress Association that was planting out Anzac Hill. The Maldon Museum has his original design for the planting that he sketched on the back of a certificate he had won for singing at an ANA competition. In 1918, as secretary of the Progress Association, he joined with Thomas Brookes to purchase the Beehive Chimney so that it could be preserved as a memorial to Maldon's early miners.

William married Mary Catherine Miller in 1877. They had eight children, six of whom survived them. Mary died at age 79 in the Bendigo Hospital in July 1935, and William died at age 84 in Maldon in September 1940. They are buried together in the Maldon Cemetery.

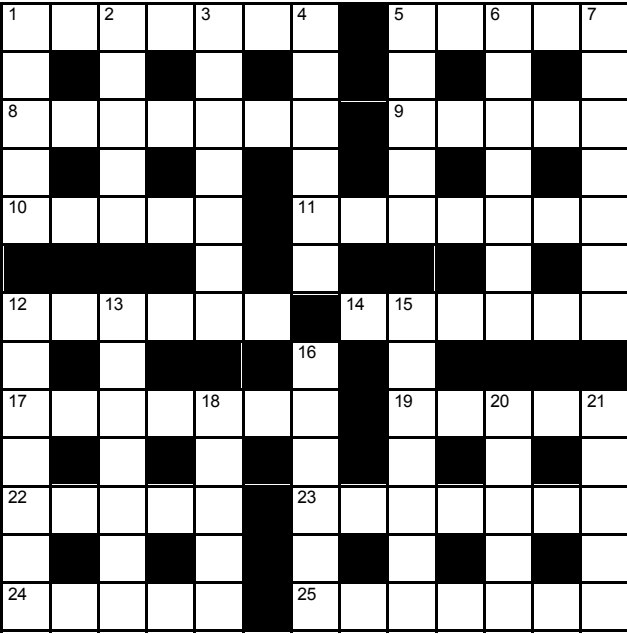

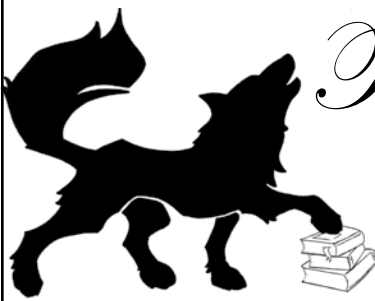
