Maldon Community Pantry

MALDON Community Pantry – no questions, no judgement, just the Maldon community helping each other out. The pantry currently assists around four to five households a week; we expect this to increase as news of the community support becomes more widely known.

The challenge to make every dollar stretch a bit further takes its toll, and sometimes despite every best effort the budget just can't cover the basic expenses. Most of us are only a major household expense away from having to decide between cutting down on food or paying an essential bill (rent, mortgage, power...). This could be an urgent medical intervention, a change of employment outside our control, a vehicle repair, or other unplanned event. This is not just a financial strain — it is a mental health challenge and, when nutrition gets compromised, a physical health risk. That is why it is a community pantry — our community, our pantry!

Some of the many ways that the pantry has assisted community members over the last couple of months (names have been changed):

- Clare has been able to save the bond for a rental by getting some help with her food and grocery costs. It means she and her family have been able to access secure housing.
- Sarah and Bill were able to visit family in Bendigo on Christmas day because they could save some of their

food and grocery money by getting a few staples from the pantry and get some extra petrol for their car.

- Helen found the week-to-week expenses difficult to get on top of after funeral expenses for a family member.
 The pantry offerings took some of the pressure off and helped her through an already difficult time.
- With all of Geoff's income taken up with day-to-day expenses, some much-needed house repairs had to be put off. Accessing the pantry groceries and food options has allowed the repairs to be undertaken and also meant that Geoff's mobility challenges can be accommodated at home.
- Jennifer and Frank generously took in some family members whose financial difficulties meant they were in insecure housing; the extra help from the pantry is enabling them all to access some basic food items to keep the shelves stocked while Jennifer and Frank help their family back onto their feet.
- Fiona was able to have a long over-due catch-up with her son and could contribute to some meals on a weekend break.
- Jackie's children have been able to have some school friends sleep over on the holidays without having to worry about the extra expenses of breakfasts and snacks.
- Darren is able to stretch his budget a bit further each

week while he is job hunting.

 Melissa and Will have been able to stop putting off a much-needed health care appointment by getting some food and groceries from the pantry.

So, if you're juggling finances, looking at your food cupboard and seeing some gaps, maybe your community pantry can help fill them. Open every Wednesday morning, 9-11am. Located in the church hall, 50 Main Street, Maldon. See you there! *Ali Brookes*

I love carving with tools that have been around for a long time and the mindfulness that comes with the practice. I also enjoy finding solutions to challenges that arise. There is a magic that comes with a print that you are never fully aware of until the final stage of printing, when you reveal your idea and the lino reveals its own. I like the surprise element that makes a piece feel more like a collaboration.


"I am also enjoying making monotypes as they are more immediate and spontaneous. Both processes seem to suit my method of working back to front."





National Heritage Bid



MALDON resident Michele Waddington is a woman with a mission. She believes that it's time the township of Maldon was recognised with a listing on the National Heritage List. Towards this end, she is currently working on a submission to the Federal Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water.

This will be Michele's second submission; her first submission was not successful. Her efforts to date have been stymied not only by a change of personnel within the Department but also changes in the bureaucratic goalposts.

But Michele's not about to give up.

According to Michele, Maldon occupies a unique place in the heritage sphere. After all, as she pointed out, the National Trust declared Maldon as Australia's First Notable Town in 1966. The township also set a precedent for the rest of Australia with the introduction of the award-winning Maldon planning scheme and design guidelines, which were implemented in 1977.

Thanks to the planning scheme and the work of local residents who have supported the need to preserve the town's historic streetscapes, Maldon has retained much of its heritage values.

Michele's second submission is still a work in progress. She has gained a positive response from Bendigo Federal MP Lisa Chesters, who has written a letter supporting the bid. She has also received valuable assistance from the Maldon Museum & Archives Association.

Support from Mount Alexander Shire, however, has yet to be secured.

In refusing Michele's first submission, the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water informed her:

"...the nomination did not provide evidence of support from the local government. Support from the local government could be provided as additional evidence in 2024 for consideration."

"It's obvious from that comment that the support of Council is important," Michele said. "So I'm continuing to work to that end."

With a 54-year connection to Maldon, Michele knows the town very well and has operated the B&B property Fairbank House for 30 years. Seven years ago, she bought the Carriers Arms in High Street. Built in 1857, the Arms is one of the oldest remaining buildings in Maldon.

Obviously, as a business owner of two historic buildings, Michele has a vested interest in enhancing Maldon's heritage status. But it's equally obvious, after only 15 minutes of conversation with Michele, that she is a great champion of Maldon's heritage.

"We invented heritage, or at least the Lewises did," Michele said (referring to Miles Lewis, who began researching Maldon's history in 1964 and Nigel Lewis, who was Maldon's first heritage advisor). "And I believe that Maldon deserves national recognition."

Bronze, Silver & Gold

So how do heritage listings work?

We'll simplify it by comparing heritage to a sporting event.

A bronze medal would be the equivalent to a listing on the State of Victoria's heritage register.

Silver would win you a place on Australia's national heritage list.

Gold is the big one: a much-coveted World Heritage listing.

Maldon is well-represented in the **bronze medal** category, with around 20 buildings and other sites of historic significance listed on the Victorian Heritage Register.

The Castlemaine Diggings Park gained a place on the National Heritage list in 2005 - that is, a **silver medal**. This National listing is the one that Michele is working towards for Maldon.

What about a gold medal?

The bid for a World Heritage listing for the Victorian Goldfields region has been a long time coming. The idea has been floating around since 1989, but continues to gain momentum. A team that has the support of 15 local councils (including Mount Alexander Shire) across the goldfields area is working on a submission to the Federal Government in a bid to achieve World Heritage listing.

If the bid is successful, the Victorian Goldfields region would join 20 other places across Australia, including the Great Barrier Reef and the Sydney Opera House, that already have a World Heritage listing.

Save Maldon

The Beehive Chimney remains cordoned off. The Butts historic picnic shelter remains cordoned off. Carmans Tunnel remains cordoned off. Council handed care of all Maldon's reserves, including structures within them, to Parks Victoria some years ago. The blackberries and rabbits in Long Gully are thriving. The Wheel Cactus infestation at Cairn Curran can be seen from space. The gorse is growing back on the Derby Hill badlands, after Parks razed everything — including a 15yr old MULGA native replanting — leaving countless small birds homeless. Parks Victoria doesn't have the funding or personnel to handle the environment, let alone deteriorating heritage assets.

Meanwhile Council has allotted over a million dollars to upgrade lighting at the sports ground. Anything new, they know how to do. Conveniently, those other more pressing problems are no longer Council's responsibility. What central Vic goldfields World Heritage listing application?

The now unnecessary No Standing sign remains on the east side of Bank Corner. The main entrance to town features a new, modern construction (a helicopter landing pad?) in someone's front yard — heritage overlay be damned. The historic gutter stonework Council 'repaired' looks nothing like the original. The Streetscape Rejuvenation [sic] Project modernised town vistas. The bakery's cheery 'we're open' red flag was removed after being declared 'not heritage', then Maldon Inc put

those drab, unChrismassy, Council-funded flags all over Main Street, followed by Twilight Dinner flags. If Council was a person, you'd have to say they're lazy, sloppy and inconsistent. *But we undergrounded the power lines.* Yes, with a government handout. So much easier to spend.

The old catchphrase of 'In Maldon Today' on MAINfm – 'The town that needs to get over itself' – is an actual comment overheard leaving the mouth of a Shire councillor. Complain, people. To Maree Edwards, to the Victorian Ombudsman, to Parks Victoria. If you're optimistic, to Council. Maldon deserves better.

Happy Days


Just spent a leisurely couple of hours walking along the Loddon River at Baringhup. From 11am to 1pm (late for us).

Some interesting bird life, eg Little Eagle, pair of Brown Goshawks, Diamond Firetail and the beautiful Rainbow Bee-eaters which are around until March before heading back north.

Celebrating January 26

In his 2021 book, *Truth-Telling: History, Sovereignty and the Uluru Statement*, Tasmanian historian (and national living treasure) Henry Reynolds reports on the widespread confusion about why January 26 was chosen as Australia Day.

A national survey carried out in 2017 identified that while 70% of participants believed a national day was important to them, most could not correctly identify why January 26 was chosen in the first place. Which event did it commemorate? 8% believed it marked the arrival of the first European to the continent. One in five selected Captain Cook's first arrival on the east coast of Queensland. One in six thought it was the date of Federation. Seven percent believed it marked the signing of a treaty with the First Nations. The same proportion identified it as the date when Australia ceased to be a British colony. Two percent stated that it was the date of an important battle in the First World War. 14% said they did not know (perhaps they thought it marked the first AFL fixture Collingwood v Richmond). Only 43% correctly identified January 26 as the date of arrival of the first ship of the First Fleet.

In 2018 Mount Alexander Shire Council decided to formally dual name events held on 26 January as Australia Day – Survival Day, to recognise how celebrations on this day impact the First Nations community. This acknowledges that for many January 26 is a day of mourning.

January 26 also marks the 161st birthday of the Maldon Athenaeum Library! Well done, Maldon, a great achievement for an engaged and active community.

Book Reviews

To mark Australia Day-Survival Day, an eclectic mix of recently donated books.

1788: The Brutal Truth of the First Fleet by David Hill, 2008

In 1788, 11 small ships set sail from England on an eightmonth-long voyage over the roughest of seas, carrying 1,500 people, food for two years, and all the equipment needed to build a colony of convicts in a land completely beyond their experience and imagination. In Portsmouth, the fleet's preparation was characterised by disease, promiscuity, and death. The journey itself was one of unbearable hardship, but also of extraordinary resilience. Upon their arrival, however, the colonists faced their biggest challenges of all: conflict, starvation, and despair. Combining the skill of a vigilant journalist with the magic of a master novelist, this entrancing history brings the sights, sounds, sufferings, and joys of the 'First Fleeters' back to life. Journals, letters, reports, and pleas to England are all interwoven here with the author's own insight, and together they convey the innermost horrors and joys of the very first European Australians. The result is a narrative history that is surprising, compelling, and unforgettable.

The Penguin Century of Australian Stories, edited by Carmel Bird, 2000

This landmark collection brings together the best Australian short stories written in the twentieth century. From early bush life to contemporary urban existence, *The Penguin Century*

of Australian Stories celebrates our finest writers in all their modes: the lively comic fiction of Henry Lawson and Steele Rudd, the distinctive imaginations of Christina Stead and Patrick White, the experimental style of Peter Carey, and the highly lyrical prose of Brenda Walker and James Bradley. Selected by Carmel Bird, these stories mirror the concerns of Australia's past and present.

Dark Victory by David Marr and Marian Wilkinson, 2003

A stirring account of the Australian government's handling of the Children Overboard affair and the Pacific Solution is a remarkable piece of investigative journalism.

Cricket Kings by William McGinnes, 2006

Step into the lives of a team of regular middle-aged men who meet each week to play cricket in their local park. With these characters William will make us laugh and cry. Never again will we think that someone is just a regular bloke: everyone can be a king or a queen in their own suburb.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

JUSTICE TO ALL

ON Friday 29 November 1867 seven Chinese men appeared in the Maldon Police Court before Frederick Courtin JP charged with breaking into a house and stealing a pair of trousers. Thomas and Elizabeth Blamey gave evidence that two weeks earlier they had returned home to find their front door had been forced open and clothing, including a pair of trousers, had been stolen. Thomas identified the trousers when they were produced in court.

Constable John Croake said he had gone with other police to the tent where all the accused lived. There, one of the Chinese, Ah Ching, gave him a parcel containing the stolen trousers. Croake then arrested all of the Chinese present and proceeded to search the tent and the men's locked boxes. Nothing further was found.

Two of the accused, Shy Fat and Pack Sing, said that another man, Ah Hung, had brought the trousers to their tent on the night of the robbery and offered them and a pair of boots for sale. They were not interested, but eventually, their friend Fy Wong purchased the goods for 12 shillings. Ah Hung was unable to be found.

George Merrifield, who represented the accused, submitted that it was ridiculous to charge seven men with the theft of one pair of trousers. He also said there was no evidence that any of them had broken into the Blamey's house and stolen the trousers. Merrifield said that although his clients were Chinese they were 'most exemplary characters' and he called local businessmen, including Samuel Dabb, to support his contention. Merrifield asked for the case to be dismissed, but Courtin found that although the Chinese did not break into the Blameys' home they were somehow involved in the robbery. There was uproar in the court when Courtin sentenced them all to three months hard labour.

The police then proceeded to charge the prisoners with the theft of the boots Ah Hung had sold Fy Wong. Before this matter could proceed, Merrifield reminded Courtin that a justice of the peace sitting alone could not impose prison sentences. Courtin accepted his objection and remanded the accused on bail.

Following the trial, the Tarrangower Times, in an editorial headed 'Justice to All', said the verdict was based on the flimsiest of evidence. The conviction of these law-abiding Chinese resulted from a prevailing assumption that all Chinese were thieves. The Times insisted that the Chinese were entitled to the same treatment before the Law as any European.

A week later, the seven Chinese appeared before Police Magistrate John Cogdon and two other JPs. After hearing the evidence, the magistrates immediately discharged the accused but warned them to be more careful in future when purchasing goods. Outside the court a large crowd of friends celebrated their release and their countrymen in Castlemaine sent boxes of crackers as their contribution to the celebrations.




