THE Maldon in Winter Festival continues with lovely community events bringing people together in various locations around town. On Saturday 5 July, this included an open day at Maldon Museum and a Beanie Parade on Main Street, both attracting lots of interest and smiles.

At the Maldon District Museum, there was constant foot traffic and animated chatter because it's a great place to discuss all sorts of things that are important to residents, including the wonderful history of the local buildings and land. The committee and researchers of the Maldon Museum & Archives Association were enjoying a convivial afternoon tea, having created a great and welcoming atmosphere at the museum. Visitors on the day, greeted at the entrance with a musical video showing historic photos of Maldon icons, were reportedly a mix of tourists and new locals.

And for a fashion parade with a difference, who could go past the Beanie Parade on Main Street? Winter weather was appropriate for the occasion — cold and drizzly — and the parade was an all-ages affair with lots of families cheering along. But young people were the absolute stars of the day.

Young Patrick was pleased as punch with his win for 'Best Technical', claiming he helped his mum to crochet his wonderful hat and saying he liked it because: "It's pretty." Covered in many detailed yarn flowers, it certainly was pretty and must have taken many hours to create.

Meanwhile, the other major prizes were taken out by crafters and besties Maddie and Rose, who had both constructed very special beanies. Rose won the 'Enchanted' category and said she was inspired by nature. "I was going for a garden and then I added some animals," she explained, pointing out the birds and butterflies on her beanie. Maddie had aimed to make something unusual for the Weird and Wonderful category. "When I thought of 'Weird and Wonderful' it sounded the most fun," she laughed, adding that she had crocheted her favourite animal. "Octopuses are just funny." A close look at the beanie revealed that her big pink octopus was enjoying a (melting) ice cream cone and



a coffee; definitely deserving of the 'Weird and Wonderful' prize. The winners were beaming as they posed with their prizes: enormous collections of candy from The Maldon Lolly Shop. Congratulations, what a fantastic display of clever craftiness and supportive community!

Deep Listening in Nature

A special event presented as part of the Maldon in Winter Festival program, 'Deep Listening in Nature' was an eloquent and persuasive talk by Andrew Skeoch on Sunday 6 July. The mood of the afternoon was set by the low lighting in the hall (illuminated only by historic stainedglass windows), perhaps helping to attune attendees to their aural senses.

Describing his field of Accoustic Ecology as being about a personal relationship with nature, Andrew said that while he had listened to birds since childhood, it wasn't until later in life that it occurred to him to really start listening to them, realising "how diverse and beautiful nature's sounds are. We are not taught to listen. We take it for granted," he said.

Andrew proceeded to use recorded sounds or soundscapes ("the sonic equivalent of a landscape") and projected spectrograms, which are a visual representation of sounds, to dive into the sounds made by birds. "This afternoon: get your ears tuned it, listen to specific species and how they use sound to get along in the world," he encouraged the people in the room.

Describing the fascinating physical attributes of birds, their social behaviours and their (often sophisticated) songs or calls, Andrew wove evolution into every point in his presentation. "The birds or creatures have evolved to support the way that they live," he stated. He demonstrated different songs and phrases, comparing them to a game and said the birds interact to change the song like a Mexican wave. "They're not just singing, they are listening; a form of acknowledging each other, working out their home ranges," he said. "They're



singing with a common repertoire, the same sonic identity, becoming a community of birds."

Andrew concluded with a plea for humans to listen and learn from the diverse, cooperative relationships in nature, saying:"We have to rethink our relationship with the natural world.... Listening is a powerful way to do that." He said that people should undertake deep listening in nature not to learn about nature but to learn from nature.

Home solar batteries program

Local business owners Tash and Kirk from K.A.W. Solar and Electrical joined Federal member for Bendigo Lisa Chesters MP for an announcement in Castlemaine, on Tuesday 1 July where they were installing a solar battery system for a client who used the government's new Cheaper Home Batteries program. The government says the program will bring down the cost of a typical solar battery by around 30 per cent or \$4,000, saving households with existing rooftop solar up to \$1,100 off their power bill every year, while those installing a new solar and battery system could save up to \$2,300 a year. Invest in small batch mobile olive processor

Small scale olive growers often struggle to harvest the minimum amount for processing by commercial contractors, so Bendigo-based The Long Road Olive Co-op is looking to solve this problem by purchasing a mobile processing line. A steering committee, driven by community advocate and passionate olive oil producer Ceilidh Meo, is forming the co-operative to foster community benefits for both olive producers and consumers. The catch is that the funds to purchase the processor must be raised by the end of July. "It's been an all-consuming project to get the co-op to where it is over the last 18 months, and we're not quite at incorporation stage, but we're just finalising the rules and disclosure statement, so we're really close," Ms Meo said. "And now we've launched a fundraising campaign via GoFundMe to ask for community support to purchase a community-owned asset." She explained that the mobile processor will also reduce transport costs for olive growers. "Savings in production costs translate to savings for consumers who purchase the oil from any small or medium scale producer. It's a winwin." Heritage crumbles under Council watch – reply

I don't disagree with the point that Mount Alexander Shire Council doesn't care about many of the outlying areas of the shire and various aspects of its heritage, not just Maldon.

The chimney at 'The Mill' in Castlemaine is privately owned, and presumably repair works carried out on it would have been privately funded. Even if the works were identified by MASC as part of the redevelopment of the site for its current purposes due to such close proximity to high public traffic on the site.

The management of the reserves surrounding Maldon happened well before the council amalgamations of the Kennett era c.1994-96. Much of this work was undertaken by the Land Conservation Council (now known as the Victorian Environment Assessment

Council), which saw the development of the Maldon Historic Reserve Management Plan in 1986-88. The management of the Maldon Historic Reserve has passed through many government departments since the introduction of the Management Plan in 1988, starting with the Department of Conservation, Forest & Lands, Department of Natural Resources & Environment, and finally to Parks Victoria. But having said that, where there are parts of the reserve that fall under the operation and management via a local 'Committee of Management' generally these areas are then under the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action of Victoria (DEECA), as Parks Victoria cannot implement committees of management under their governing Act passed by Government Legislation. There are a number of reserves either within or surrounding Maldon that fall into this category - Bill

Woodfull Reserve, Carmans Tunnel, Maldon Athenaeum, Maldon Caravan Park, and others. In many cases, these committees of management take on many forms, whether they are a community committee of management reporting directly to DEECA, or whether the local council is the committee of management reporting to DEECA, and then forms a local committee to manage the site.

As for the site of the Beehive Chimney the former Maldon Shire Council was certainly at the forefront of lobbying to get 17 perches of land surrounding the chimney reserved for Memorial purposes. This was gazetted in the Victorian Government Gazette on 23 December 1953 and was revoked in the Victorian Government Gazette on 23 September 1987 so that the area could be gazetted as part of the Maldon Historic Reserve.

While for the maintenance of the Beehive

were major works undertaken on the chimney to repair it, which also included shortening its height due to damage from a lightning strike it sustained many years prior. This work was undertaken in a joint partnership between the former Maldon Shire Council and the Maldon Historical Promotion League. Then in 1996 there were minor repair works undertaken, predominately repointing of the brickwork by the Department of Natural Resources and Environment. Unfortunately, the Beehive Chimney hasn't had a maintenance schedule developed to try and alleviate the detrition to the brickwork and its overall structure for the long term. Yours &c.

Wine myths busted

Debunking sabering fears and bottle lore

WINE has been around for thousands of years—and with it, plenty of myths, tall tales, and slightly exaggerated 'rules'. At Panacea Estate, we love a bit of wine tradition. We love the drama of popping corks, the elegance of swirling glasses, and yes—the sheer fun of sabering a sparkling bottle now and then. But we also believe in keeping wine accessible and fun, not intimidating.

So, let's uncork some common myths especially around big bottles, sabering, and other old-school wine 'rules'—and separate fact from fiction.

Myth #1: sabering is dangerous and only for experts

Truth:

Sabering *looks* dangerous—but when done properly, it's actually quite safe (and very fun). In fact, at Panacea Estate, we saber bottles at some events and it's always a crowd favourite.

Sabering works because of **physics**, not brute force. Sparkling wine bottles are under high pressure—when you strike the seam just below the lip with a blunt blade (not sharp!), the pressure pops the neck cleanly.

Key tips for safe sabering:

- Chill the bottle well—cold glass is less brittle.
- Use a blunt knife or saber, not a kitchen knife.
- Aim the bottle away from people and valuables.
- Commit to the motion—hesitation causes accidents.

Sabering isn't about skill—it's about confidence, common sense, and a little showmanship.

Myth #2: Bigger bottles are just for show

Truth:

Large-format bottles aren't just impressive to look at—they're actually *better* for aging wine.

The reason? **Oxygen exposure**. In big bottles like magnums or imperials, there's a lower ratio of oxygen to wine, which slows down the aging process. This means:

- More gradual development of flavour and aroma.
- Smoother, softer tannins over time.
- Longer life in the cellar.

That said, they're also perfect for making a moment at celebrations, which honestly, isn't such a bad reason to go big either.

Myth #3: Only expensive wines come in large bottles

Truth:

Not necessarily. While many producers reserve large formats for premium or special wines, there's nothing stopping smaller wineries—like us—from bottling larger sizes simply for the joy of it.

At Panacea Éstate, we have made double magnums and 6L Imperials for:

- Weddings
- Birthday CelebrationsJust because we like a bit of fun!

They aren't about price tags, they have all been gifts to date —they're about creating an experience worth remembering.

Myth #4: Sparkling wines must be opened quietly

Truth:

The traditional 'quiet hiss' is lovely at a fine dining table—but sometimes, you want a pop!

There's no strict rule here—it depends on the setting. A soft sigh might suit a dinner for two, while a hearty *pop* (or a saber swing) might be perfect for a gathering under the stars or a vineyard celebration.

At Panacea Estate, we believe wine should match the moment. Some nights call for a quiet pour. Others need a loud cheer and a cork flying across the paddock.

Myth #5: Older wine is always better Truth:

Not all wines improve with age, and not every bottle benefits from sitting around for years.

Some wines—like young rosé or fresh, vibrant whites—are best enjoyed within a year or two of release. Others, like structured reds or barrel-aged wines, can evolve beautifully over time.

Our advice?

Drink what you love, when you love it. Wine is for enjoying, not stressing over.

On a personal note, I've seen or been told of every kind of wine myth that makes people nervous or uncertain. What I've learned is that wine is at its best when it brings people together. Sabers, big bottles, or everyday screw caps—it's all part of the fun. At Panacea Estate, we'll keep honouring traditions—but only the ones that add joy, not pressure. Natural Newstead

They 'arrived' a few years back, in ones and twos, to both sides of the river.

Australian King Parrots are splendid birds – the male is entirely red on the head and underparts with deep green upperparts, punctuated by a pale blue stripe on the shoulders – the female is lighter green on the head and upperparts and then bright red underneath from the lower part of the breast.

I've been hearing them on a regular basis with occasional sightings in the garden and late on Thursday afternoon a single bird arrived to perch, sentinel-like on a Red Ironbark. It was soon joined by another five individuals – taking turns to feast on Pomegranate fruits. This number is the largest flock I've seen locally and suggests that numbers may be slowly increasing, now seemingly resident.

Australian King Parrots are at home in the wetter forests along the Great Divide where they feed on seed, fruit, blossoms and insects. It is suggested they may be colonising parts of central Victoria by following watercourses north during dry times. Home gardens and their bounty of winter fruits are no doubt part of the reason for these movements. They are strong fliers and it is no surprise to see them locally when they are common not far to our south around Trentham, Blackwood and Daylesford.

This flock comprised one adult male, a couple of females with the remaining three birds appearing to be immatures. To be honest I have some difficulty separating females from immature birds, the latter tend to have a darker iris and pale bill.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

A few Maldon earthquakes

MALDON occasionally experiences earthquakes mainly due to the Muckleford fault that runs north-south and crosses the Castlemaine Road between the Butchers Road cutting and the Muckleford Creek. The following are descriptions of two quakes that occurred in the 1870s.

At 5am on Thursday 8 August 1872 two distinct shocks in sharp succession were felt in Maldon and Baringhup. Local bakers Joseph Crossley of the Scotch Pie House and Alex McArthur were at work and both thought that the nearby Beehive mine had caved in. Patients at the Hospital and several mine workers were also startled by the shocks. At Baringhup young John Hayes, who was feeding his horse before riding to Castlemaine to catch the first train to Melbourne, thought his stable was about to collapse.

Those who felt the shock generally agreed that the rumbling came from the north and died off to the southwest. Old stories that Mount Tarrengower was a slumbering volcano were revived, with some hoping the quake might reveal new veins of gold.

Another earthquake that occurred at 10.20pm on Sunday 21 January 1877 was described in detail by the *Tarrangower Times*. There were some differences of opinion, but most people agreed that the shock came like a wave from the south. A rumbling sound was heard before the earth trembled and, although the sky was perfectly clear, after the shock two small black clouds were noticed towards the south.

The next day there was much speculation and gossip about the quake. Many had first thought that Warnock's Flour Mill in High Street had blown up. Others thought that the reservoir above the Shire Reserve had burst or the Powder Magazine at the top of Adair Street had exploded. Some expressed relief that the quake had not activated any of the district's old volcanoes. One wag said that when he was awoken from his sleep, he thought that the railway had finally arrived in Maldon.

One respected local couple were sitting at their dining table reading by the light of a kerosene lamp when the severe shock rattled their table and caused them to drop their books. They said the shock was followed by a rumbling noise, similar to distant thunder, lasting for about four seconds. When they went out into the street they saw dark clouds on the southeastern horizon.

The *Times* tried to provide a scientific explanation of the event. They observed that the rumbling caused windows and doors on the west side to be pressed inwards while those on the east side were pressed outwards. The tremor was then followed by a stiff breeze from the southwest. Reports of the quake came from Campbells Creek, Guildford and Yandoit but not from Daylesford. The *Times* then proposed that the quake originated at Mount Consultation, southeast of Muck-leford, and radiated out until it struck Mount Tarrengower and then rebounded towards Maldon. They also referred their readers to the latest scientific writings on earthquakes.

Library news Book sale

Thank you to everyone who came to the library book sale last Saturday. It was great to see so many locals and visitors despite the cold weather. Don't forget, the library is always warm and welcoming (or cool and welcoming in summer) and a good place to sit and read a book. As a small, independent, volunteer-managed library, fundraising events such as book sales are necessary if we are to continue providing a service to the people of Maldon and surrounds. We count on the generosity of the community (and visitors) to keep the library going. The books we sell are generally donations that are duplicates of titles already in our collection. And it is good to see these books getting a second life.

Do small local libraries matter?

We love our small library and believe it has an important role in the life of Maldon. However, it's good to know that recent research confirms that libraries like ours do matter, especially in regional areas, and not just as a supplier of reading material for cold winter nights. A survey of more than 100 Australian librarians, conducted by Griffith University researcher Dr Amber Marshall, has shown that rural libraries are 'especially valued by their communities' and are seen as 'a key facilitator of social inclusion and interaction'. They are safe places where everyone is welcome, where connections are made and maintained, and good conversations can occur. Libraries can also play a key role in preserving and celebrating local history, something that the Maldon Athenaeum Library has embraced through its Archive Project and History Vignettes: https://maldonlibrary.org.au/ history/. However, the value of a library is tricky to measure, according to Dr Marshall. Just counting the number of users, or even the number of potential users, is not necessarily the best way to judge its worth. A 2024 paper commissioned by non-profit group Friends of Libraries Australia found rural and remote communities were particularly disadvantaged by funding models based around such spending per capita. In regional and remote areas, where population density is lower and people can easily feel isolated, the library is a meeting place, a place where conversations with another person can occur. In this way, the existence of libraries in rural areas can offer opportunities for social connectedness and well-being.

So, please come and visit the Maldon Athenaeum Library. Become a member (only \$30 a year) or, even better, volunteer for one of the many activities based at the library. We are open Monday, Wednesday and Friday, 2-4pm and Saturday 9.30am-12noon. We are next to the Post Office at 97 High Street.

The Royal Librarian by Daisy Wood, 2024 Windsor, 1940: Secretly tasked with foiling a suspected plot, Sophie Klein is placed in the Royal Library at Windsor Castle, where the princesses reside. Ranging in time and place from her childhood in the Australian outback to heady youthful days in Paris of the '60s, to slower-paced recent years in the gardens and open spaces around her north London home, these poems are full of a colour and energy that paint a picture of life lived to the full, and also a reflectiveness, a gentle humour, and occasionally a sense of loss, as the poet looks back on times past.
