Joshua, who has Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy and dreamed up Henle Gardens in hospital after a serious medical episode, seems to have had a great time with the team from *Gardening Australia*. He told the *TT* that the producer of the segment is also a local from Castlemaine, saying that she did an incredible job pulling the story together after filming at the property late last year.

Joshua said of the experience: "Humbled and privileged to be able to share my story so far on *Gardening Australia*. When you put yourself out there, opportunities open their doors. Gardening is such an integral part of my life and identity and it was an honour to share my slice of Maldon with the wider Australian community."

Wrong signage puzzle

RESIDENTS of Maldon continue to be perplexed about errors with local road signage, with a new incorrect sign — naming Phoenix Street as Vincent Street — appearing in the past few months.

It comes after queries to Council about why the street sign at Langs/Woodlocks Lane was changed (at some unknown time in recent years) and when it might be amended.

The Phoenix Street sign is located at the corner of Main Street and wrongly labels a short stretch that leads to Vincents Road. Community members have informed the *Tarrangower Times* that council staff members have told them that they are awaiting a "name change" on "Vic Maps" before proceeding to correct the sign at Phoenix Street.

The *TT* notes that Google Maps showed the street as 'Vincents Road' as at Monday 9 June; corrections have since been submitted to Google by the *TT*. This error doesn't explain why the sign currently says *Vincent Street* and councils do not rely upon Google Maps.

The council staff member may have been referring to the Victorian Government online tool called Vicmap Viewer, which shows the stretch of road correctly labelled as Phoenix Street. A different Victorian Government online map tool called MapShareVic is available on the website of the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action; the stretch of street is correctly labelled there. A third online map called VicPlan, which is apparently designed for property and planning use, labels Phoenix Street correctly as winding all the way from the South German Mine to Main Street. Perhaps there are too many maps.

The *TT* has been in contact again with council about the issue and has been assured that it is being investigated. Puzzled residents look forward in the hope that the incorrect signs can be replaced and costly errors avoided in future.

Weather challenges for road crews



Mount Alexander Shire Council (MASC) is alerting the community to the difficulties that dry weather has caused for road maintenance during the first half of 2025. The Council said on 4 June (prior to the weekend's rainy days) that March or April usually signals a recovery period for roads from dry summer conditions as moisture returns to road surface materials. Road maintenance efforts are hindered by the dry conditions, MASC said, but rain in the past week may mean works can progress. Council said it still intends to achieve the planned works program for the year.

"Council is working to improve road conditions as quickly as possible and additional resources have been engaged to help accelerate maintenance efforts across Council's unsealed road network," MASC said. "Council's grading program will become more effective and response times will gradually reduce when weather conditions are more favourable."

Residents are still encouraged to report any specific road concerns by lodging an online service request at [mountalexander.vic.gov.au/Council/Report-an-issue](https://www.mountalexander.vic.gov.au/Council/Report-an-issue) or contacting Council on 5471 1700. Council encourages community members to exercise caution both on the roads and near work crews.

Djaara Leadership Change

Dja Dja Wurrung Clans Aboriginal Corporation (known as Djaara) has announced that Rodney Carter, who has held the leadership position for close to a decade, has concluded his term as Chief Executive Officer. The group acknowledged Mr Carter's numerous contributions saying: "Rodney's legacy of services enables Djaara to enter its next phase of achievements with

confidence." Examples include an updating of the Dhelkunya Dja Country Plan, development of supporting strategies and establishing a foundation for long term and sustainable success of the Dja Dja Wurrung Group. Cassandra Lewis, who has been Djaara General Manager for five years, will step into the role while a replacement for Mr Carter is sought.

Community events funded



Mount Alexander Shire Council has announced the latest recipients of its Event Grants program.

Council has awarded 14 groups with funding to deliver events across the shire that foster connection and community. Events that have received grants include Gather Harcourt's New Year's Eve celebration, a celebration of Newstead Community Centre's 30th birthday, Muckleford Community Centre's Winter Warmer, and the Resonance String Orchestra's annual concert.

Pre-existing events such as the Rotary Truck Show, Maldon Folk Festival, Castlemaine and District Show, Town Folk Festival and Maldon in Winter festival have also been awarded funding, helping them to continue to run.

Mount Alexander Shire Council's Mayor, Cr Rosie Annear, said that Council is proud to support local events through the grants program. "The 14 events that have received funding for next year are a great mix of existing and new events, and will all be wonderful additions to our shire's already packed calendar. I know they'll bring people together from near and far to visit our region, connect with others, experience new things, and take part in a range of fun events."

Community strives to buy The Hub



A Co-op has been formed in Castlemaine in an effort to purchase and maintain community use of The Hub, a former pub on Barker Street that was originally built in 1875 as the Council Club Hotel.

It has been used since 2010 as a business and innovation hub containing 19 offices (individually leased) with kitchen and meeting room facilities, plus a model garden behind. The Castlemaine Community Co-op is seeking investment in the project and has announced that the offer for buying The Hub building is open until 29 June 2025. The Co-op board says this is an opportunity for people to help buy a significant local asset while earning a competitive return on investment. The quest has gathered some momentum already: the Co-op says it has raised 30% of its goal as at Sunday 8 June.

Organisation calls to unlock residential land lease housing



Caravan and Residential Parks Victoria (CRPV), the peak body for residential park housing in Victoria, released on Thursday 5 June 2025 a Policy Statement that positions Residential Land Lease Communities (RLLCs) as a significant contributor to increasing the supply of affordable homes in Victoria. The policy called Accelerating Affordable Housing - The Residential Land Lease Solution is the result of extensive consultation with industry stakeholders and provides 16 no-cost recommendations for Victorian Government consideration that CRPV says will unlock land, streamline planning, and reduce regulatory barriers, ensuring RLLCs can thrive and deliver more affordable, secure, and community-oriented housing in this state. It says that by 2051, over 8% of the Victorian Government's housing supply target, or over 360,000 new RLLC homes and freed up homes for first home buyers, could be delivered if barriers to development are removed.

"RLLCs are a proven model that can deliver tens of thousands of affordable homes quickly, especially in regional and peri-urban Victoria," said association CEO Scott Parker. "This is a zero cost, high impact solution that can make significant inroads into achieving the Victorian Government's housing targets while supporting ageing in place, economic growth, and community revitalisation," Mr Parker added.

The association is calling on the Victorian Government, local government authorities and industry stakeholders to work together to implement these recommendations and ensure that far more Victorians have quick access to secure, affordable, and community-oriented housing.

Youth myki design competition

The State Government is giving kids across the state the chance to design the new youth myki cards that will hit the network next year and offer free public transport for every Victorian under the age of 18. Minister for Public and Active Transport Gabrielle Williams announced on Thursday 5 June that young people between the ages of five and 17 can submit their designs for a chance to showcase their work on over a million youth myki cards and to win a \$1,000 gift card. Designs for the new youth myki can be hand drawn or a digital illustration – with the new card set to stand out from the current myki card range and entries will close on Sunday 15 June. Protest after approval of 45-year fossil fuel project

A group of locals protested outside Member for Bendigo Lisa Chesters MP's electorate office last week after the Federal Government approved to continue the use and extend the operating life of a gas processing plant in Western Australia. The newly installed Minister for the Environment and Water, Senator the Hon Murray Watt, announced on 28 May that he has approved the North West Shelf (NWS) gas processing project in Karratha, WA. The application by Woodside Energy was made to extend the life of the plant to 2070; it was approved after being under assessment by the government for a number of years.

Senator Watt said in his announcement:

"Following the consideration of rigorous scientific and other advice including submissions from a wide cross-section of the community, I have today made a proposed decision to approve this development, subject to strict conditions, particularly relating to the impact of air emissions levels from the operation of an expanded on-shore Karratha gas plant."

"Labor's decision is putting the goals of the landmark Paris agreement beyond reach, and threatening the survival of people already living in a world which is suffering from climate breakdown," said Central Vic Climate Action spokesperson Avery Barnett-Dacey. The Paris Agreement is a legally binding international treaty on climate change, adopted by 195 countries — including Australia — in 2016. Its primary goal is to limit global warming to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels.

"Every member of the Labor Government will live with the legacy of failing to act on the biggest issue of our time. The Government has decided that the bank accounts of their mates; the fossil fuel giants, are more important than life on earth," Ms Barnett-Dacey said.

Numerous "very concerned Central Victorians," including Mount Alexander Shire Councillor Lucas Maddock, protested outside the office of Lisa Chester's on Monday 2 June, asking the Labor Government to reverse approval of the North West Shelf gas development life extension.

Ms Chesters made a statement about the future of energy generation in Australia in a letter to the editor, which the *TT* has published in full.

Secrets of the Shire
ANZAC Circle is a ring-shaped, commemorative walking track, sitting on Anzac Hill like a wonky crown. The Circle is a bushy, birdy walk of only a few minutes with a clear but stony path. Through the trees you might catch a glimpse, to the east, of the distance that includes Harcourt, Redesdale and Tooboorac.

Maldon Museum has compiled a very interesting history of the rejuvenation of Anzac Hill and the formation of the Anzac Circle, both of which commenced after the First World War at the instigation of the local Progress Association. The hill was renamed from Garfield’s Hill to Anzac Hill and the circle was originally conceived as 32 trees to commemorate fallen World War I soldiers. Eventually, due to the hard digging efforts of local volunteers (and particularly the Methodist Church’s Reverend Rule Jones), the number of trees planted was closer to 150.

Did you know that planting trees for commemoration is a uniquely Australian tradition?

If you travel up Anzac Hill Drive to reach the Circle, you will observe over 50 Monterey Pines and Southern Mahogany Gums that make up the Avenue of Honour. The Victorian Heritage Database listing for the Maldon Avenue of Honour says: “Australians, and in particular Victorians, embraced the idea of planting them more enthusiastically than any other country in the world.”

You might see kangaroos or hear the screech of black cockatoos while traipsing around Anzac Circle, which is now a leafy nature-walk.

To get there by foot, head straight up the hilly path from Spring Street. To drive, take a slow journey up unsealed Anzac Hill Drive until you see the sign. There is no designated parking and there are no amenities on Anzac Hill; be sure to bring what you need and take it when you leave. Enjoy the birdsong, the scent of eucalyptus and the history of this thoughtful memorial.

Maldon Primary School Portraits in Maldon CBD

CONSISTENT with tradition, Maldon Artist Network (MANet) and Cascade Fine Art Gallery have worked with Maldon Primary School to produce and exhibit delightful portraits by children. Sponsored by Maldon INC, there are exhibits of ceramic portraits by children from grades three and four in Maldon's CBD shop windows from 6 June, as part of the *Maldon in Winter* celebrations.

The clay portraits are the outcome of four sessions with art teacher Kirby Kneebone. I dropped into the school to find out more about the project from Kirby. She has been the art teacher at MPS since 2020. Though the first couple of years were made very difficult due to COVID lockdowns. Despite this, Kirby came up with some very creative ways of engaging her students, including pavement art and creating a colour wheel with autumn leaves. Both activities enabled the students to use their imagination despite there being no face-to-face classes.

Kirby explained that after discussing portraiture by various artists, including Frida Kahlo, the children used rolled out

sheets of clay to cut out face shapes, then mould them over squashed up newspaper to create a three-dimensional surface.

Then, with guidance on the proportions of the face, they hollowed out eye sockets and added facial details; learning how to attach clay to clay in the process. Obviously, they had a lot of fun with things like eyes, lips, teeth, and even a devil. Once their creations were dried out, they were painted and then lacquered, as the school does not have a kiln. They had a lot of fun and loved it. Another clay experience occurred for *Mother's Day* when they created clay jewels for their mums. Kirby was wearing some striking earrings made by her son as part of that project.

Shops involved include Sue James Clay Worker, Elsie and Pat, Maldon Fudge and Ice Creamery, Maldon Artist Network Gallery, Maldon Quality Butchers, Portia & Co, Much Ado, Community Bank Maldon & District, Polly and Willow, Maldon Lolly Shop and Maldon Crystals.

Cascade Art Gallery will run a portrait workshop with children from grades five and six to

produce artworks which will be exhibited at the Maldon Artist Network (MANet) Gallery from 5 July for four weeks. More to come later.

The future of the arts in Maldon and surrounds is in good hands with Kareen Anchen, Catherine Tait and Kirby Kneebone ensuring art education is alive and well.

Hopes, expectations and surprises

Every 'expedition' is a combination of expectations and hopes, with the promise of the occasional surprise. It is these prospects that maintain the drive to explore and enjoy the local landscape.

Recently I headed out to Picnic Point to enjoy the golden hour before dusk, with the following expectation ... **Black Swans** grazing on the pasture emerging on the receding mudflats around the lake in the company of autumn flocks of Australian Shelducks and Wood Ducks. Unsurprisingly this expectation was met.

At Picnic Point there has been some nice growth of **Pale Knotweed** *Persicaria lapathifolia*, a favourite haunt of

Golden-headed Cisticolas. I had been hoping to see this species and sure enough several pairs were foraging in the knotweed and surrounding patches of rank grass and fireweed. A curious male clambered to the top of some stems to check me out.

What caught me by surprise was a single **White-backed Swallow**, hawking for insects in the still air around the lake margins. This species is a spring/summer breeding migrant to our district with very few records in central and southern Victoria over the cooler months. I can't recall seeing one previously at this time of year in the Newstead area. Superficially resembling the Welcome Swallow with their deeply forked tail they have a much shorter bill and distinctive white patches on the crown, back and breast.

Weed Watch



Spiny Rush

Common Name: Spiny Rush

Botanical Name: *Juncus acutus*

Weed Classification: Spiny Rush is a declared Noxious Weed and classified as Regionally Controlled in our North Central region, hence must be controlled.

Where did it Come From: It's not known how Spiny Rush was introduced into Australia, but it has a wide native range including the Mediterranean, western Europe and North America, South America, Asia and southern Africa. Some of the earliest specimens collected in Australia were from the banks of the Loddon River in 1909.

What Does it Look Like: Spiny Rush is a tough, dense, tussock-forming, long-lived perennial rush, growing to 1.5m tall, with a very short rhizome (underground stem). Its blue-green or dark green stems are both leaves and culms (stems bearing the clusters of flowers) with a very sharp pointed tip when mature. Leaves and culms emerge from the base of the tussock at an angle, giving the plant a hemispherical shape. Young plants do not flower until at least two years old. Flowering and seed germination can occur at any time of year, but mainly in spring or summer. The green-brown flowers are in dense branching clusters on the culms, normally 1–6 per cluster. The fruit is a brownish coloured capsule, containing many oval or irregularly shaped seeds, each about 1 mm long.

Why is it a Problem: Spiny Rush is a serious weed because of its abundant seed production and very pointed tips, which make control difficult. Once established in dense infestations, it out-competes native plant species and disrupts native habitats and food chains. Its leaves and flower stem ends have very sharp, hard points

that can pierce the skin and injure animals. Dense infestations of large plants can inhibit the movement of people and animals including livestock, and is capable of completely covering large areas, therefore is a serious environmental and agricultural weed.

There are native species of rushes (*Juncus* spp.) that are similar to Spiny Rush, e.g. *Juncus kraussii*. Spiny Rush can be distinguished from these by its very sharply pointed stems and shiny seed capsules.

How does it Spread: Spiny Rush spreads mostly by seeds, distributed by moving water (which results in much spread along waterways) as well as by agricultural and mining machinery, birds, stock and other animals. The short rhizomes can also be dispersed in soil attached to vehicles or animals.

Spread: Spiny Rush is found all around Australia, in Victoria, South Australia, Tasmania, the coast of New South Wales, south-east Queensland, Western Australia and the Northern Territory. Its main habitat is by rivers, lakes, creeks and drains. Spiny Rush can colonise mine dumps and other areas of low fertility.

How can it be Controlled: Spiny Rush can be controlled with herbicides in association with other control methods. Mechanical removal is used for large dense infestations, then plants are burnt or buried. Hand pulling small plants is possible. To date there are no biological controls for Spiny Rush.

A Cast of Falcons

Central Victoria, and particularly Maldon, is well known amongst the auto-aficionados for its splendiferous collections of the old, the desirable, the unusual and the obsolete.

Amongst the throng, and perhaps regarded as one of the desirables, is the species *Fordus*. The native Australian *Fordus* is quickly becoming endangered and will, in time, be all but extinct. Its survival is in the hands of a few hardy souls working to ensure that the

remaining populations are well cared for into their dotage.

Fordus are known for their robust natures; they are long lived and, in this particular area, well-cared for by the Resident Keeper. The Keeper's coop is patronised by those who are committed to the survival of the species as it is widely known he holds said species close to his heart.

Keen observers of the species will have no doubt noted that the Maldon environment supports a particularly large number of the apparently otherwise rare *Fordus falconii* sub sp. *s. wagonus*. The sub species *s.wagonus* is well liked by many. Its commodious load space known to be superior to other similar species, its capacity for hard work, its comfort over long distances and its feed bill remarkably good for its size and capacity. The distinctive silver plumage shines bright in the summer

heat and can absorb the dirt and grime of the environment with ease.

Maldon is home to over a dozen of this silvery sub species but are often confused by observers. It should be noted that the silvers can be easily distinguished by their exclusive tags applied by breeders at hatching. Some can even be further identified by their accoutrements - racks over their heads or the attachment for trailing under their tail feathers.

Keeping track of these spectacular creatures is made all that more simple by noting their tags, but not all observers are astute enough to have recalled individual tags. Furious waving at any of the flock will often result in confusion when the greeting goes unacknowledged or ignored.

It is with a little sadness that, in recent days, one of this number known to roost along the Hornsby Street corridor, is no longer there.

She was one of the more senior of the flock, having chalked up a magnificent 26 years. Her tracking device had shown she had managed to cover over 425,000km in her time migrating from her home range to locations up and down the east coast and to the west. Sometimes she ranged inland to the likes of the Silver City, dodging the feral goats and plagues of mice and other times were spent amongst the auto-terrorists of her home breeding grounds. All these distances were covered without mishap or failure.

It seems reasonable to accept that her plumage may be a little dulled but her heart is still strong. The Resident Keeper has taken her under his wing and will ensure that she has, after a little rest and rehabilitation, a future for however many years she may have left.

Au revoir, madame 190. You will be missed.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

The Boundary Stones



THE Shire of Maldon was formed in January 1864 by the amalgamation of the Borough of Maldon and the Baringhup Road Board. The Road Board had been responsible for roads from Baringhup in the west to Muckleford in the east. Initially the Shire was divided into two ridings based on the old boundaries of the Borough and the Road Board.

From the start, Muckleford ratepayers were unhappy with being represented by councillors who were mainly based in Baringhup. When Muckleford winegrower, Otto Jung, was elected to the Shire Council in August 1865 he began a campaign for a separate rural riding for the east of the Shire. In November 1873 the ridings of the Shire of Maldon were finally reorganised and the Walmer riding was created. The Maldon riding was also redefined as a rectangle measuring four miles north-south and two and a quarter miles east-west. The rest of the Shire was divided into the Baringhup and Walmer ridings by the major roads running north-south through the Shire.

In 1879 the Maldon Shire Council decided to erect boundary stones to mark the limits of the Maldon riding. They purchased six granite boundary stones from Mrs Hutton, who was almost certainly Margaret Hutton, the licensee of the Cumberland Hotel.

Margaret and her husband Daniel had built the Cumberland Hotel in High Street in 1859. They later purchased the burnt-out ruins of the Atlas crushing plant and reopened it as the Phoenix. However, soon after Daniel's death in 1875, Margaret was declared insolvent. She managed to retain the Cumberland Hotel licence, but it is unclear why she should have had six granite stones to sell.

In July 1879 the Shire employed John Williams to carve lettering into the stones. Based on the amounts he was paid, he carved 138 letters. This number is consistent with the wording on the surviving stones.

Four stones marked the boundaries of the Maldon riding. The southern and eastern markers survive. The best known of these is the southern marker, which can still be seen in Sandy Creek Road. This marked the point on the southern boundary of the Maldon riding where it met the Walmer and Baringhup ridings. A corresponding stone would probably have stood on Nuggetty Road where the three ridings also met. The stone marking the eastern boundary of the Maldon riding is still in place, but its mate on the western boundary between the Maldon and Baringhup ridings seems to have disappeared.

The two other stones were carved with the words 'Shire Hall' and now stand on the footpath outside the gates to the Shire Gardens. If anyone has information about the two missing boundary stones, the Museum would be very pleased to hear from them.

Refugee Week

PEOPLE immigrate permanently to Australia in one of two ways: through the Migration Program (family reunions or skilled migrants) or the Refugee and Humanitarian Program. Who is a refugee? According to the United Nations Refugee Agency, refugees are people who have been forced to leave their homes and have crossed an international border to find safety in another country. They have fled war, violence, conflict or persecution. The number of refugees welcomed to Australia since World War II is on track to pass one million later this year.

The first Vietnamese refugees arrived in 1976. One of these was Nam Le, a prize-winning author who came to Australia as an infant with his family in a small boat. His book *The Boat*, a collection of short stories that won the 2009 Prime Minister’s Literary Award, explores the themes of identity, culture and migration. His latest offering is a collection of poems, *36 Ways of Writing a Vietnamese Poem*, that has just been selected as Book of the Year in the 2025 NSW Literary Awards. Judges described the book as “damning, frank and unwavering... passionate and bold in its depiction of otherness, trauma and struggle.”

In the past decade, the number of people applying for refugee status in Australia has increased dramatically. Hundreds of thousands have fled violence: in Syria, Iraq and Afghanistan, Myanmar, the Congo, Ethiopia, Sri Lanka, Somalia, Sudan and, most recently, Gaza. Out of the 10,033 Palestinian applications launched in the past 10 months, 7,111 were rejected.

Lebanese-Palestinian writer Hasib Hourani - who won the Kenneth Slessor Prize for Poetry in the 2025 NSW Literary Awards - says when he started writing the book-length poem *Rock Flight* he wanted to ‘advocate for Palestinian liberation to people who might not yet be convinced that’s a just thing for us to ask for’. It started as a work of non-fiction, tracing his family’s history in the region, including his grandparents escaping war-torn Palestine in 1948. Hourani is distressed that since he finished writing the book in 2023 more than 53,000 Palestinians have been killed in the war in Gaza. He writes, ‘i go to palestine with a new journal/ thought i’d write some metaphors/ but return with scant pages of/ questions and fodder./ the more time i spend with words/ the more i realise that they just won’t do.’

Shankari Chandran is an Australian writer whose book *Chai Time at Cinnamon Gardens* won the 2023 Miles Franklin Award. Chandran’s parents were Tamil refugees from Sri Lanka. She describes her more recent novel, *Safe Haven*, as “fuelled by rage.” One reviewer describes it as a “heartbreaking tale of the plight of asylum seekers in Australia and the abhorrent treatment they receive in detention centres.” In a note at the conclusion of *Safe Haven* the author comments that she wrote the book, “because I was trying to understand what lies behind

our detention policies and the strength of Australians who fight against it.” It is a book of hope as well as one of despair. *The Boat*, *Chai Time at Cinnamon Gardens* and *Safe Haven* can be found in our library collection.

Library reviews
***Out Of Bounds* by Val McDermid, 2016**

When a teenage joyrider crashes a stolen car and ends up in a coma, a routine DNA test reveals a connection to an unsolved murder from 22 years before. Finding the answer to the cold case should be straightforward. But it’s as twisted as the DNA helix itself. Meanwhile, Karen finds herself irresistibly drawn to another mystery that she has no business investigating, a mystery that has its roots in a terrorist bombing two decades ago. And again, she finds that nothing is as it seems.

***Splinter the Silence* by Val McDermid, 2015**

Is it violence if it’s virtual? The outspoken women targeted by the increasingly cruel internet trolls and bullies would probably say so. For some of them, the torrents of bile and vicious threats prove too much. They begin to silence themselves in a series of high-profile suicides. Or do they? Tony Hill isn’t convinced. But he’s the only one. Former cop Carol Jordan is too busy messing up her life to care. Until she gets an unexpected second chance. Now it’s game on, and the stakes have never been higher.

***The Seven Sisters* by Lucinda Riley, 2014**

Maia D’Apliese and her five sisters gather together at their childhood home, ‘Atlantis’, a fabulous, secluded castle situated on the shores of Lake Geneva, having been told that their beloved father, who adopted them all as babies, has died. Each of them is handed a tantalising clue to her true heritage, a clue which takes Maia across the world to a crumbling mansion in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. Once there, she begins to put together the pieces of her story and its beginnings.

***Drink Your Own Garden* by Judith Glover, 2013**

Drink up: with this fully revised and wonderfully imaginative guide to making the most of your garden produce. The 140 recipes here range from fruit and berry wines to beer and honey mead, as well as non-alcoholic juices, cordials, and teas. It includes guidelines for every step; advice on equipment, ingredients, and what to grow when; and a list of potential problems and remedies, accompanied by attractive vintage-style colour illustrations.

***The Last Templar* by Raymond Khoury, 2005**

In present day Manhattan, four masked horsemen dressed as Templar Knights emerge from Central Park and ride up the Fifth Avenue steps of the Metropolitan Museum of Art during the black-tie opening of a *Treasures of the Vatican* exhibit. Storming through the crowds, the horsemen brutally attack anyone standing between them and their prize. Attending the gala, archaeologist Tess Chaykin watches in silent terror as the leader of the horsemen hones in on one piece in particular, a strange geared device. He utters a few cryptic Latin words as he takes hold of it with reverence before leading the horsemen out and disappearing into the night.

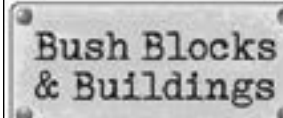

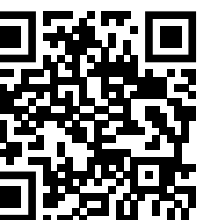
