Congratulations to Maldon Pony Club, who have been announced as recipients of a grant that they will use to run a Confidence and Connection Camp later in the year. They were awarded as part of efforts to encourage participation, strengthen leadership capacity and pay tribute to the role of women and girls in community recreation and sport. The club expressed gratitude while pointing out that these are qualities it already strives to achieve.

“Here is a female dominated club that is building these young riders,” said Committee Member Meg Berryman. She said the funding would help the club continue its activities to foster


inclusion, community, mentorship and camaraderie. The Pony Club acts as a protective factor, Ms Berryman explained, as riders grow up and face new challenges with peer groups and mental health. “We’re trying to be inclusive and supportive, with whatever they are going through,” she said. “With this new cohort of younger riders, we’re sort of wrapping around them and supporting them.”

The Confidence and Connection Camp, which will take place in November, is a chance to get everyone from the club together, forge friendship bonds and strengthen the club community. The *Tarrangower Times* cover photo illustrates the environment: girls working together and facing big challenges.

“It’s a hard sport and they work so hard,” Ms Berryman said proudly, saying she was happy to see some investment in the riders and what they are already doing as a club. “We’re not changing our game.”

The funding was awarded through the State Government’s funding Change Our Game Community Activation Grants Program, which awarded 130 grants of up to \$10,000 to groups across Victoria, aimed at fostering women in recreation and sport. Council votes again against subdivision



At its meeting on Tuesday 17 June, the recently-elected Mount Alexander Council (MASC) once again addressed the question of whether a 16-lot subdivision for land at 1 Lowther Street Maldon was appropriate for the site. The previous group of Councillors had debated the application in September 2024 and at that time carried the following motion: “That this matter be deferred to a future Meeting of Council so that Council Officers be able to prepare grounds for refusal.”

The report from council staff that was presented to last week’s meeting (and is available to view on the MASC website) again recommended that Council approve the planning application for 1 Lowther Street. Councillor Rosalie Hastwell recused herself from the discussion and vote, having been an objector to the application prior to the election.

The remaining Councillors agreed to amend a clause that would affect the nearby gold mine, making it void should the mine cease operations. However, discussions turned to the nature of the site at 1 Lowther Street, which some had been to visit. Councillor Phillip Walker said he had noted the “insightful” contributions of previous councillors to the discussion and described the residents’ concerns as “cogent”. During discussions, Councillor Matt Driscoll pointed out that any approval would be subject to stringent conditions and that many expert authorities had not raised objections to the proposed subdivision, saying: “I don’t see why we should.” Councillor Tony Cordy said there was a difference: “Because they have no objection, that doesn’t mean that they support it at all.”

Councillor Toby Heydon described the property as a “wetland”, raising concerns about the suitability of the site, the potential for flooding and biodiversity loss. “What we have here at Lowther Street is effectively a functional wetland in an urban environment and that’s a very precious and rare thing in our Shire.” He pointed out that the land had not been built on for residential housing in the past and said that was for good reason, moving that Council resolve to issue a Notice of Refusal to Grant a Planning Permit for the application. The motion was carried on the following grounds: the land is not suitable for the proposed subdivision, the proposal does not represent an ‘orderly planning outcome’ under the Mount Alexander Planning Scheme and does not maintain the natural drainage function, stream habitat and wildlife corridors and landscape values of the site per Council Catchment planning and management policy.

Council makes call on emergency services levy

Mount Alexander Shire Council moved at its meeting last week to call for a pause to the new Emergency Services Volunteer Fund (ESVF), saying it will request that the State Government holds a public enquiry and investigation into the ESVF’s impacts on Victorian farmers, businesses, residents and councils. MASC said the inquiry should “investigate the most fair and equitable approach to adequately fund emergency services.” It also carried a motion that the levy, if retained, should be collected by the State Revenue Office, and called to “exempt local councils from the burden of administration, collection and debt recovery.”

Council has expressed multiple concerns including that the rate increase impacts primary producers greater than commercial, industrial and residential ratepayers; that the volunteer rebate scheme is “unnecessarily complex” and that Councils will be “placed in a difficult relationship with ratepayers, being expected to collect the ESVF and pursue those who are unable or unwilling to pay it in full.”

The carried motion directs the Chief Executive Officer to send details of MASC’s objections to the ESVF to local members of State Parliament, the Victorian Premier and Treasurer, multiple local government bodies, the United Firefighters Union, and the Victorian Farmers’ Federation.

LAST Sunday the cactus warriors gathered to show their enormous appreciation to Nuggetty farmer Barrie McKnight for his significant contributions to the control of Wheel Cactus and presented him with a Life Membership of the Tarrangower Cactus Control Group.

Barrie has been a dedicated cactus volunteer, beginning more than 30 years ago in the 1990s, when he contrived a special kit to more effectively poison the plants. He was also part of the team of three (with Ian Grenda and the late Wendy French) who wrote a submission

to the State Government in 2005 requesting urgent action to stop the Wheel Cactus plague in Maldon. They successfully gained a grant of \$30,000 (a significant amount 20 years ago) which was the impetus of the special wheel cactus committee.

Barrie has been a champion Cactus Warrior. He has been attending our regular community field days from the very beginning in 2005 helping to demonstrate the injecting technique to many local landowners and volunteers. Barrie served on the committee of the Tarrangower Cactus Control Group for 15 years, contributing to the group’s objectives of raising awareness about this noxious weed, organising field days and motivating other local landowners to control their infestations. He’s always been available to support our group at important events such as our Wheel Cactus Workshop in 2015.

Ian Grenda, our other Life Member, presented Barrie with a certificate and thanked him for the many ways in which Barrie has contributed to the war on wheel cactus. Barrie then speared the cactus on top of a specially decorated cake and the warriors enjoyed a delicious afternoon tea.

Thank you, Barrie, without all your energy, insight, dedication and tireless commitment, we would now be living in a forest of wheel cactus!

Next phase for proposed quarry at Blue Hills

LANDSCAPE and quarry company Mawsons has placed advertisements and updated its website to announce that its proposal to construct a quarry of hornfels stone at Blue Hills, near Bradford, will be formally considered by The Department of Transport and Planning.

“This marks the commencement of the assessment process to determine whether an Environment Effects Statement (EES) is required under the Environment Effects Act 1978,” Mawsons said.

It comes after a Mawsons held a community meeting in Baringhup in December 2024 about the project, plus a period in April when detailed referral documents were made available online for public perusal and comment. The proposed Blue Hills Quarry, using 34ha of a 560ha property owned by Mawsons, would be developed in three stages, have an expected

life of up to 100 years, with a peak operating production of 500,000 tonnes of processed hornfels aggregate per annum.

The Mawsons referral has been formally accepted — it shows as a change in status on the website of the Department of Transport and Planning, indicating that it is progressing through the application process towards the possibility of approval. The sub-heading of the Blue Hills Quarry referral page says: “Supporting thriving, productive and sustainable communities, environments and industries.” The page contains 14 documents addressing environmental considerations for the proposed quarry such as flora and fauna, groundwater and traffic.

Beehive Chimney Consultation

Residents and interested parties have until Saturday 9 July* to peruse and comment about a permit application to repair and upgrade the Maldon Beehive Chimney. Parks Victoria has made the detailed application, which is (currently advertised with Heritage Victoria), after funds were recently allocated to the project. Application P40992 is described on the Heritage Victoria website as: “For works to partially dismantle and rebuild the chimney structure’s upper section, with new capping and lightning rod modifications including structural repairs, brick and stone replacement, and restoration of mortar and render.” Local history groups have welcomed the news that the chimney will be saved; though the reactions were mixed with some apprehension since the repairs will result in a reduced height for the structure (full report in the *TT* edition of Friday 20 June). Further information and estimated timelines can be found online at: tinyurl.com/5672kstc.

Resolve rental disputes: fast, fair and free

Rental Dispute Resolution Victoria (RDRV), a new service announced by the State Government last week, is designed to help renters and rental providers settle disputes over bonds, compensation, repairs and rent increases in a more informal

setting, freeing up VCAT to deal with other cases. Anyone involved in a residential tenancy dispute can access the free service by calling 1300 017 378, visiting online, or attending RDRV in person.

At RDRV, highly skilled resolution experts will work to bring parties together and resolve rental disputes quickly and avoid a formal hearing. They will oversee each case from start to finish and there will be an RDRV office in Bendigo — as well as available online— working to reduce time, stress and cost, plus reducing the need for lawyers. Consumer Affairs Victoria will still be accessible to people seeking information to better understand their rights. Visit: rdrv.vic.gov.au.

Council reveals highlights of budget



As reported in last week’s *Tarrangower Times*, Mount Alexander Shire Council (MASC) voted at its Tuesday 17 June meeting to adopt a \$56 million budget for the year ahead. It has revealed details and highlights online which include: \$17 million for capital works to improve infrastructure such as roads, bridges, drains and footpaths plus an increase in the budget allocation for a number of services, including an additional \$127k for aged care. The budget allocated \$40k to work on designs to upgrade the Maldon playground; \$15k to providing support for family violence assistance and prevention; \$50k to explore options for increasing childcare within the shire (\$50k) and \$47 to host the Mount Alexander Business Awards. Local organisations which will benefit from the budget include: Newstead Live (\$6.7k); Nalderun (\$12k); Harcourt Community House (\$7k) and Newstead Live (\$6.7k).

A notable highlight is that the budget allocates \$100k to: “Continue to enable the operation of Maldon Caravan Park while a long-term solution for the site is determined.”

See Councillor’s Column below for more detail. MASC Mayor, Councillor Rosie Annear, said that Council is proud to deliver a budget that was created collaboratively with the community.

“Community consultation is a big part of the budget process and this year we heard from more residents and local organisations than ever before,” said Mayor Annear.

“We took these submissions into consideration and have worked diligently to create a budget that meets our statutory

obligations and endeavours to respond to the wide-ranging needs and priorities of our diverse communities.”

Calls for drought help

As winter proceeds with little rainfall, there are calls for the State Government to provide assistance to drought-affected farmers.

Member for Northern Victoria Region Rikkie-Lee Tyrrell moved a motion in the Victorian Parliament calling on the Allan Labor Government to provide extra funding for farming households struggling in the wake of the ongoing drought. Mrs Tyrrell tabled the motion on Tuesday 18 June that: “... this House notes that Victoria is currently under the worst drought conditions in decades according to the Victorian Farmers Federation, with some areas having their lowest rainfall totals on record.” Mrs Tyrrell’s motion stated that farmers are “bearing the brunt” of the drought with high costs of feed, water, fuel, energy and freight; all coupled with increasing costs of living. She called on the government to “implement hardship funding for farming households to help with the pressures of the ongoing drought.” It prompted some poetry reading in the Legislative Council when Member for Western Victoria Bev McArthur recited *Rain from Nowhere* by Murray Hartin, while a bit of Dorothea Mackellar appeared later in the debate before the motion was passed.

Meanwhile, The Victorian Farmers Federation (VFF) is urging the Victorian Government to introduce a targeted rebate scheme for fallen stock collection costs. The VFF says it has made the request as it continues to work to ensure a long-term, sustainable solution for animal disposal across the state. VFF Livestock President Scott Young said the VFF has actively worked with service providers to prevent a complete collapse of the system, but now warns the government must assist with costs. “We are calling for a rebate scheme to offset collection costs for producers in declared drought-affected areas. Anything less is a failure to support animal welfare and on-farm biosecurity during crisis conditions.”

Slow while passing- new law from Tuesday

RACV is reminding Victorian motorists that from Tuesday 1 July 2025, they will be required to slow down to 40 kilometres per hour when passing incident response vehicles that display flashing lights of any colour. RACV General Manager Automotive Services Makarla Cole urged motorists to be aware of the rule change so that they could create the safest environment possible for roadside and incident response workers. “We’re grateful that the Victorian State Government has made this change to improve the safety outcomes and working conditions of roadside and incident response workers,” Ms Cole said.

Since 2017, Victorian motorists have been required to slow down to 40 kilometres per hour when passing stationary emergency services vehicles displaying red or blue flashing lights.

This rule has now been expanded to include: accident towing vehicles, breakdown towing services, roadside assistance operators, toll road incident Response vehicles.

COUNCILLOR’S COLUMN



MALDON Caravan Park is a much loved local asset providing affordable accommodation located on Crown land in a beautiful natural setting. When Council ran a consultation earlier this year about the future of the Park, the message from our community and other stake-

holders was clear. Almost 95% of survey respondents who came from Maldon, surrounds and beyond were in favour of retaining the use of the land site as a Caravan Park. Many also noted that facilities need to be upgraded.

Following the consultation, Council Officers prepared a detailed report and Councillors have now voted unanimously

in favour of appointing a consultant to explore appropriate management models for the Park. Options for management will be presented to Council in the next financial year and I will continue to provide updates in this column.

Another major item on the agenda has been development of Council’s 2025/2026 Budget which needs to meet our statutory obligations and also respond to the wide-ranging needs and priorities of our communities. Council staff and Councillors have worked together closely to achieve a balanced budget. For details see Annual Budget 2025-26 . We also really appreciate the efforts of each of the 83 community members and organisations from across the Shire who presented their submissions in writing and in person. Although it was not possible to include all community requests in this year’s budget there was a wide range of needs and priorities that we have been able to address including the submission from young Maldon families for the

design of an upgraded Maldon playground. Council has also committed to providing additional support to the tireless and important work of the Tarrangower Cactus Control Group.

In recent weeks I’ve enjoyed celebrating endeavours that highlight some of our rich local talent and unique environment. These have included the launch of the Maldon Cycling group’s wonderful new publication *17 Gravel Rides in Maldon and District*, and the opening of the fabulous Maldon Portrait Prize presented by Maldon Artist Network and Cascade Art Gallery.

Of course there’s always much for the community and visitors to enjoy and be involved in throughout the year. I would encourage everyone to check out the program for the Maldon in Winter Festival, brought together by our wonderful local groups, organisations and businesses and inviting all to celebrate the warmth, creativity and resilience of our community.

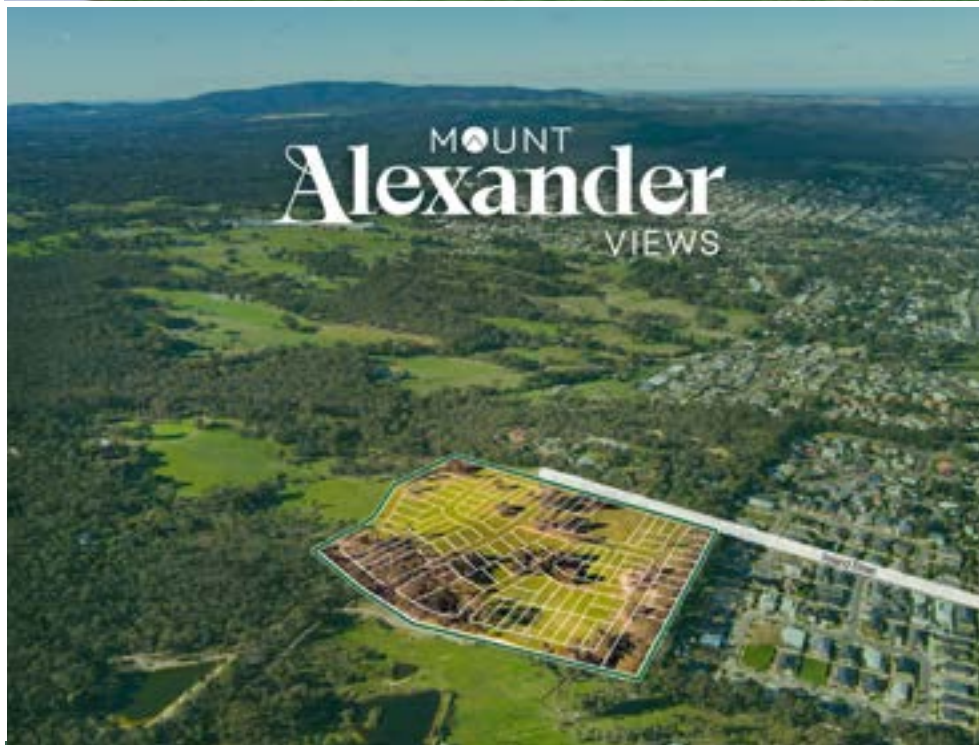

Butts Reserve Picnic Shelter

It was very pleasing to read in the *TT* of 6 June that Parks Victoria had allocated money for the repair of both the Beehive Chimney and the Butts Reserve Shelter - known as The Butts Pavilion. It was, however, disappointing that the construction of the Pavilion was given by Parks as 'around 1900'.

This is not correct, it is considerably older. The *Tarrangower Times* of December 1877 reported that local residents had raised 12 pounds 9 shillings as a contribution to half the cost of building 'a shelter to everybody ... at the Springs'. The Maldon Council accepted a tender from local builder William Smith, and the Pavilion was completed by 22 December 1877. A search through past copies of the *TT* reveals numerous references to events held at the Pavilion prior to 1900, including, for example, a New Year's Day sports carnival in 1878 and the annual picnic for the Maldon Catholic School in 1886.

This iconic building has been part of Maldon for almost 150 years and it is great to hear

that it will be repaired so that it can continue to be used by the community for many more years to come.

I have witnessed what is colloquially known as 'a slow cull'. And this was not a period of drought. I have an agricultural background, having studied at Longerenong Agri College many years ago. We all know that Australia is a land of drought and flooding rains. We all know that when you remove all vegetation, rainfall decreases. Look at the rainfall records that go back to early settlement of Victoria. They show a direct correlation between habitat removal and reduced rainfall. But now I am reading about debt laden farmers crying poor. We all want the latest 4X4s, we all want the latest tractor decked out with the latest tech. But this comes at a very high price. To where, to what. Life on the land has always been hard (except for the squatters and selectors who stole the best) without a guarantee of success. The

decision of the Victorian state government to reduce control permit approvals for farmers to be allowed to cull kangaroos to under a week fills me with horror and I use that word with deep meaning. It's like an echo from the past, when colonial governments allowed and encouraged the clearing of the land, by any means possible, of its original inhabitants by white farmers, mercenaries and police.

AFTER talking about labels and stoppers, it is now time to talk about bottles. Most of the time, when people picture a bottle of wine, they’re imagining the classic 750ml format. It’s become the global standard for good reason—it’s just enough for two

people to share over dinner, or for four to enjoy a couple of generous glasses. But at Panacea Estate, we know there’s a whole world of wine bottle sizes out there—and each one has its place.

So why 750ml?

The 750ml bottle has become the norm thanks to a mix of tradition and practicality. It’s said to have been the average lung capacity of a 19th-century French glassblower—and it also happens to be the ideal serving size for most social occasions. But wine doesn’t *have* to come in a 750ml bottle. In fact, some wines shine even more in alternative sizes.

Common bottle sizes (and why we use them)

Here’s a guide to the most common formats you’ll see at Panacea Estate or elsewhere—and when we like to use them:

375ml – The Half Bottle

Perfect for solo sippers, romantic dinners with different wine preferences, or when you just want a glass or two without committing to a full bottle.

- Often used for **dessert wines, fortifieds, or specialty reds**
- Great for gifting or cellaring smaller amounts
- Encourages moderation without sacrificing the experience

750ml – The Classic

Our go-to size for most Panacea Estate wines.

- Balanced, portable, and familiar
- Fits well into wine racks, shipping boxes, and expectations
- Ideal for everything from midweek meals to weddings and events

1.5L – Magnum

A magnum holds two standard bottles of wine, and it’s more than just a party trick. Wine actually ages *more slowly* and often *more gracefully* in a magnum because of the lower ratio of air to liquid.

- Perfect for celebrations or long-term cellaring
- Makes a visual impact at the table
- Great for red wines intended to age (like Shiraz or Cabernet blends)
- Here are some of the most common (and uncommon) big bottle sizes, each with its own history and drama:

| Name | Volume | Equivalent to |

| Magnum | 1.5 L | 2 bottles |
| Jeroboam | 3.0 L | 4 bottles |
| Rehoboam | 4.5 L | 6 bottles |

| Balthazar | 12.0 L | 16 bottles |
| Nebuchadnezzar | 15.0 L | 20 bottles |

- Yes, they’re all named after biblical kings. And yes, we think that’s fitting. They feel grand—and they are.

We love bottling a small number of magnums for special releases—sometimes even using a wax seal or hand-numbered labels for extra character.

A personal note

On a personal note, one of the joys of winemaking—especially at a small, family-run place like Panacea—is that we get to treat wine not just as a beverage, but as a complete experience.

That includes the shape of the bottle, the label design, the closure type, and yes—the size. Sometimes we choose a smaller bottle for intimacy. Sometimes, a 6L bottle for a friend’s wedding is the perfect gift for someone who has all they need. But if you can’t give good friends impractical presents, when can you?

Call to action, have you ever opened a magnum or something even larger? What was the occasion—and how did it feel? Tell us your ‘big bottle’ stories or let us know which Panacea wine you’d love to see in a large format someday.

Gowar School Ruins

THERE’S something about the mood of this place and its remoteness from anything else town-like that makes it seem ominous, as though it must commemorate an incident or tragedy. As a local raconteur might say; do you want the true story or a good story?

Gowar School, in the district now spelled Gower, was part of a thriving township in the second half of the nineteenth century, one of many similar small hamlets that popped up across Djaara Country when gold seekers arrived. The tiny town of Gowar may have served as a pit-stop town between Castlemaine and Maldon before faster transport became available. The Victorian Heritage Database Report about Gowar School doesn’t say when the stone structure was built but says the site: “...represents an early small school established in 1855 and occupied until 1908.” The simple story is that there was no incident; people just moved away from Gowar until it was no longer a town and the school was abandoned.

The old school site is located on the corner of Gower Road and Castlemaine Maldon Road. The ruins are surrounded by a fence but it is possible to see the beautiful crumbling walls with their display of patient, Victorian-era handiwork and all that time has thrown at them. They are nestled in beautiful, rustling bushland but quite near the main road (and the buzzing of the nearby motocross club): it is difficult to get lost but beware of snakes in warm weather. The Heritage Council deems the area of archaeological significance, history is in the air here. It is interesting to enjoy the atmosphere while taking a walk, imagining what it was like with village children learning here 150 years ago.

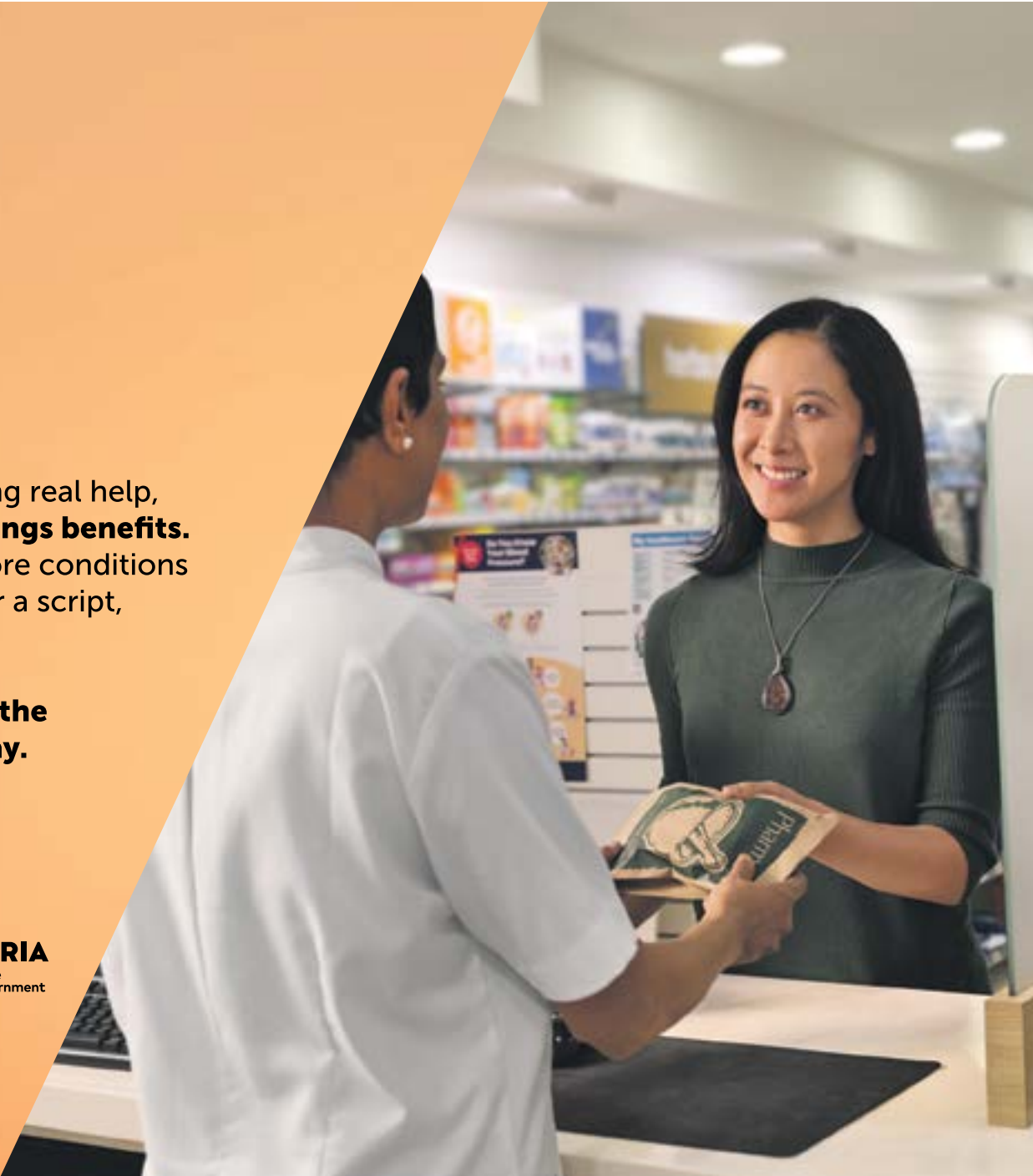

Maldon Primary School Portraits @ MANet Art Gallery

CONSISTENT with tradition, Maldon Artist Network and Cascade Art Gallery have worked with Maldon Primary School to produce and exhibit delightful portraits by children. Cascade Art Gallery ran a portrait workshop with children from grades 5 and 6 to produce art works which will be exhibited at the Maldon Artist Network (MANET) Gallery from 5 July for four weeks. This activity is sponsored by Maldon Inc.

Last Wednesday, I dropped in to the Cascade Art Gallery to watch Karen Anchen work her magic in her inimitable way to inspire students from Grade 5 and 6. In her opening remarks Karen asked how many of them had not been to the Cascade Art Gallery before and only one hand went up, which was very reassuring for the future of the arts in our community.

Karen set the students the task of looking around the gallery and talking to each other about the Portrait Prize exhibits. She suggested that they switch on their *thinking* caps and their eyes while looking. As a result, a few even imitated the position of the figures in the portraits while they were talking to each other about them.

There was quite an excited hubbub as they analysed the portraits and pointed out details to each other deciding which ones they liked most. Then Karen gathered them back into the main gallery to explain the task and set them to work. Some sat at tables, others wandered off to sit near their favourite portrait, or sat on the old pew near the front door to see a range of portraits they liked. They set to work drawing portraits of each other, or copying a portrait on the wall, using pencils or pastels, and even small mirrors if they decided to do a self-portrait. In fact, self-portraits proved quite popular.

At the end of the session, Karen brought them back together to talk about such details as the position of the eyes in the head which are half way between the top of the head and the chin, and how much detail is above the hairline, including hair and hats and such. She explained that they would be finishing their drawings back at school, then they would be placed on a backing mat to enable them to be exhibited in the MANet Art Gallery from 5 July.

Kirby Kneebone, their art teacher collected all the drawing in a folder before the class walked back to school chattering excitedly about what they had just experienced.

The finished drawings will form the basis of an exhibition in the MANet Art Gallery from 5 July to complement the Cascade Art Gallery exhibition.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

Laying the Market House foundation stone



ON Easter Monday 1859 the foundation stone of the Maldon Market House, (now the Maldon Museum), was laid. The Market House was the first major project undertaken by Maldon’s recently formed Municipal Council. Councillor John Ludolph Subritzsky had proposed that Maldon become a market town and a market square had already been surveyed. The Market House at the centre of the square was intended to be the first of several municipal buildings.

After the Town Surveyor, Arthur Hartley, drew up plans and specifications for the building, the Council announced on 24 February 1859 that they were prepared to accept tenders. Eight local builders submitted proposals and the Council voted by a majority to accept the tender of John Jamieson and his associates, Robert Aitken and David Marshall. Jamieson & Co undertook to complete the project at a cost of £820. After the Office of Public Works suggested some minor alterations to the plans, an additional £15 was added to the price and the Council asked that work commence immediately.

Jamieson & Co chose to lay the foundation stone at midday on Easter Monday, as it was a local holiday. They extended a special invitation to the town’s Masonic and Oddfellows lodges to participate in the ceremony. The Masons however declined the invitation due to some petty internal politics and Council Chairman John Wright was given the honour of laying the foundation stone.

A large crowd of men and women gathered for the ceremony. However, a swarm of young boys crowded around where the stone was to be laid and obscured the view of everyone else and made it difficult for others to hear the speeches.

The formalities opened with a prayer delivered by Wesleyan minister the Rev Henry Chester asking the All Mighty to grant the township prosperity. Chairman John Wright then outlined the Council’s vision for the Market Square and the many opportunities the Market House would afford the district. The farmers of Baringhup would have an outlet for their produce and their wives and ‘cherry cheeked daughters’ would soon grace the market as in the ‘old country’. The poor man and his ‘good wife’ could also sell the surplus produce from their cottage gardens and sell eggs to supplement their income. Wright said that being a market town would stimulate local trade by bringing large numbers of people into Maldon each market day. He pointed to the success of the Castlemaine Market that had started as just a few fruit stalls but was now flourishing.

After ensuring everyone that the contract for the building was in good hands, Wright laid a bottle containing coins ranging from a farthing to a sovereign, a copy of the *Tarrangower Times* and a parchment listing the names of Council members and other Maldon dignitaries in a cavity. He then spread mortar over the bottle and the foundation stone was lowered onto it and then with a few taps of the trowel Wright declared the stone well and truly laid.

Golden Textures award looms large

Library news

More memoirs... and some follow up ‘at home’ book talks

THIS week the library news features two more outstanding memoirs: Geraldine Brooks’ *Memorial Days* and Richard Flanagan’s *Question 7*. A memoir isn’t just a chronological account of events. Good memoirs are deliberate constructions, with evocative prose that holds the reader and carries them forward into an intimate relationship with the author. Creating (and reading) a memoir requires a great deal of self-reflection, not just about the events described but also the emotions involved, the impact of the events and the lessons learned. *Memorial Days* and *Question 7* are both easy and hard to read - easy because they draw you on, hard because you are challenged to ask, ‘what does this mean; what does it mean for me, the reader?’.

Memorial Days is Brooks’ most recent book following a string of award-winning novels including *Horse*, *The Secret Chord* and *Caleb’s Crossing*. She is also a non-fiction writer, journalist and former foreign correspondent. *Memorial Days* describes the events following the sudden death of husband and fellow journalist Tony Horwitz. Caught up in the shock of his death and its aftermath, Brooks is unable to grieve. It is not until three years later, and on Flinders Island, Tasmania, that Brooks is able to think and write about their 35-year marriage, her loss and the process of grieving.

In the final chapter of *Memorial Days*, Brooks writes, ‘I’m not sure if our modern secular world has the capacity to come up with a gentler way of dealing with bereavement. I don’t know if we can make room for something like Sorry Business.... Our culture is averse to sad.... I merely wish for the bereaved some time and space, however long, however short, for melancholy’. She found that time and space, ‘settling into solitude’ on Flinders Island, amidst the granite rocks and ‘the gentle susurrus of the casuarinas’.

In his latest book, *Question 7*, Booker prize winning author Richard Flanagan tracks his life and that of his family through a ‘daisy chain of events’. Firstly, the H.G. Wells novel *The World Set Free*, then physicist Leo Szilard and the nuclear chain reaction. Next the dropping of the atomic bomb that saved his father, genocide of Aboriginal Tasmanians and his own near death by drowning in the Franklin River. These apparently unconnected ‘true facts’ are joined together in a memoir that Flanagan described as, ‘joyful to write... the words began to levitate’.

And the title? This comes from a Chekhov short story – the question with no answer: “only fools are those with answers.” According to Flanagan (and Chekhov), however, this does not mean such questions should stop being asked.

Library reviews

Downstream by Annika Johansson, 2024

Lismore resident Rob, a happily married empty-nester, enjoying his late middle age, has always defined himself by the quality of the roof over his head and the state of his family life. Solid. Safe. Stable. But when the 2022 flood hits, he and his wife Sal find themselves homeless, their lives now the very opposite of secure and predictable. While government and insurance investigations drag on, Rob and Sal are left with no choice but to rent while they wait to find out the fate of their badly damaged home. After a mix-up with contracts, they reluctantly agree to share a home unit in Ballina with a slightly older hippy couple, also impacted by the floods, who couldn’t be more different from their new flatmates. As each awkward, yet entertaining week rolls into the next, they graciously try to deal with one another’s personal quirks while waiting for life to get back to normal.

Hanging Ned Kelly by Michael Adams, 2022

Hanging Ned Kelly looks at the life and times, crimes and demise of Australia’s most famous antihero from a new perspective: that of the ‘rogue and vagabond’ who finally put the noose around his neck. Elijah Upjohn was the latest in a long line of flogging hangmen allowed to run amok because they’d do the dirty work that let officials keep their hands clean. Despite being duly appointed ‘finishers of the law’, Upjohn and his fellow boozing bunglers were so hated they were hunted by angry mobs. As one writer asked: ‘Who shall hang the hangman?’

Biography of X by Catherine Lacey, 2023

When X, an iconoclastic artist, writer, and polarizing shape-shifter, falls dead in her office, her widow, wild with grief and refusing everyone’s good advice, hurls herself into writing a biography of the woman she deified. Though X was recognised as a crucial creative force of her era, she kept a tight grip on her life story. Not even CM, her wife, knew where X had been born, and in her quest to find out, she opens a Pandora’s box of secrets, betrayals, and destruction. All the while, she immerses herself in the history of the Southern Territory, a fascist theocracy that split from the rest of the country after World War II, as it is finally, in the present day, forced into an uneasy reunification.

Cut Flowers by Celestina Robertson, 2022

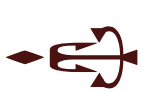

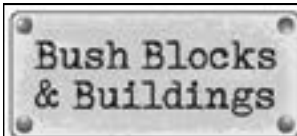

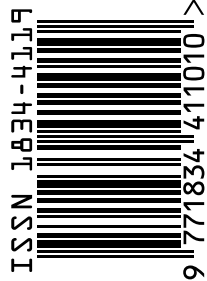
