Moolort walk: planning decisions imminent

A collection of around 60 attendees met under bursting skies at the Moolort Silos on the morning of Sunday 16 March, to attend the 'Walk the Line' event which commenced at 9.30am. The walk was arranged by Castlemaine to Maryborough Rail Trail (CMRT) and Central Goldfields Bushwalking and Hiking Club, offering the chance to ponder the past and the future of the Moolort Plains.

Walkers gathered first to hear an introduction by CMRT's Janice Simpson, with a reminder of the vast history of the Dja Dja Warrung people in the area. Geoff Park then spoke with deep knowledge about the region, having spent significant time walking and observing the plains and wetlands.

"If you ever get an aerial view, you'll get an idea of the diversity," Geoff explained, saying that it was very difficult to tell from ground level. He described the formation of the landscape through volcanic eruptions that led to lava flowing onto sedimentary rock, which was then "clothed by mostly natural grasses, not trees." Geoff said that there were some pockets of forest, including banksia and buloke/bull-oak trees and that the Dja Dja Warrung subtly managed and carefully cultivated the area. The Moolort Landcare group has also been planting trees for over forty years. Geoff (whose Natural Newstead column features in the *Tarrangower Times* each week) spoke of birds such as brolgas and rails from the wetlands; golden headed cisticolas and quails; as well as endangered species like the black falcon. He described mammals that are no longer seen such as quolls and dunnarts. He said that the landscape is very dynamic; many animals only visit every couple of years when the wetlands fill. Geoff painted a picture for attendees of a varied landscape before mining, deforestation and canola. "This really is a very special landscape, it's had a long history of Aboriginal management and I think it's our challenge to protect it," Geoff concluded.

Just as the walkers set off, the rain began in earnest. Their route followed the section of the proposed (CMRT) from the Grain Silos at the old Moolort Station to Bald Hill Road and included a section of the line that goes through the Environmental Exclusion Zone of one of two proposed broiler farms, with corflutes placed along the walk to indicate the area in question. The Central Goldfields Shire Council has indicated that it will make a decision on the broiler farm planning applications in the next few months; the CMRT urged walkers to consider the likely impact this development would have on the trail. When asked what she hopes the walk will provide to attendees, Janice replied: "Just a chance to look and think."

Peter said that he is always happy to hear from prospective festival participants. "Always looking for stuff, we can always fit them in somewhere and do something with them," he said. The fourth Goldfields Gothic Festival will take place on Friday 1, Saturday 2 and Sunday 3 August in various venues around Maldon. Now is the time to book accommodation for a weekend of poetry, music and gatherings with goths! Festival ticket prices remain the same as last year at \$50 for a weekend pass (check with festival about any exclusions).

trial will enable 54 victim-survivors to remain in their home and community, while the perpetrator is removed from the home and given support to change their behaviour. The Safe At Home pilot is part of the Strengthening Women's Safety Package, which includes work to prevent violence and provide tailored responses for women and children who experience family violence, while keeping the focus on holding men who use violence accountable.

Sizzling pool season ceases



More than 2,000 visits to Mount Alexander Pools have been recorded across the summer season. The pools are now closed until the end of 2025 when swimming weather returns. YMCA Victoria, who manages the pools, is calling it a successful summer after multiple events, programs and initiatives, including concerts at Newstead and the popular aqua aerobics sessions at Maldon Pool. Sometimes all it took was a dry wind, the radio volume up and a sausage sizzle to bring the crowds. A YMCA statement said: "The region's pools continue to play a vital role in keeping communities active, engaged, and connected".

Duck season in drought

The Victorian 2025 duck season commenced Wednesday 19 March and will continue until Sunday 9 June, as the Bureau of Meteorology (BOM) reports that February rainfall was "below average to very much below average" for large areas of the state. Given the recent rain-deficient period, those against duck hunting are concerned that the birds are more vulnerable than usual, with the organisation called Regional Victorians Opposed to Duck Shooting saying: "It's not rocket science to see our native ducks will be sitting ducks for shooters in the few wetlands they happen to be concentrated in within our state." The Victorian Government's Game Management Authority says its Game Officers, with Victoria Police and Authorised Officers from partner agencies, will patrol wetlands across Victoria to ensure hunters and protestors act in a safe and responsible manner. National bird body BirdLife Australia is running a petition that urges the Victorian Government to ban recreational native bird hunting in Victoria, visit: actforbirds. org/bird-hunting/vic.

Grants for First Nations businesses

Victorian Minister for Small Business and Employment Natalie Suleyman announced on Friday 14 March that grants between \$5,000 and \$10,000 are available as part of the Victorian Aboriginal Business Investment Program. They are to be used for training, mentorship, networking, marketing, expert advisory services and accreditations, while larger grants up to \$100,000 will be support 20 businesses to expand into new markets, complete building works and invest in developing workforces. Democracy, Sausage



THE Australian Federal Election is scheduled to take place on or before Thursday 17 May, three years since the last one, so no need to feel like a silly sausage if you've forgotten how some of it works. Plus, some changes have been introduced in the past few elections and it can be hard to keep up.

The Prime Minister is running out of prime Saturdays to hold an election before that May deadline — it must be a Saturday — and his lackeys may also be trying to coordinate his campaign diary with the Governor General and the Easter Bunny. Certainly, the election to determine Australia's next government will be announced soon. The *Tarrangower Times* plans to step through some of the processes, like onion and tomato sauce on an election day snag; in the proper order.

Region refresher

Where are you? If you are holding a paper copy of the TT, you are likely to be located in the electorate called the Division of Bendigo, which has been named after the city since 1900. (The following year a national election determined who would sit in the very first Parliament of Australia and the principle of 'forming a parliament' remains the same today.)

Parliament is formed by electing people to sit in meeting rooms that are sometimes called the 'lower house' and 'upper house', names which hint at the fact that prospective laws are considered first by the lower and secondly by the upper, like progress in a condiment queue.

Two houses, two votes

At the upcoming election, residents in the division of Bendigo will be voting for one candidate to represent their interests in the lower house (which is properly known as the House of Representatives). The 'House of Reps' is often symbolised in green, with a green ballot paper on voting day.

If you are in the division of Bendigo, you are in the state of Victoria and will also be voting for half of Victoria's 12 allotted state representatives in the upper house, called the Senate (the other half of the Senate will undergo an election in three years' time). The Senate is usually represented in red, although its ballot paper is white on voting day, like a buttered slice of Tip Top.

So there you are: in the electorate or division of Bendigo, in the state of Victoria, planning to vote for who will represent you in each of the two 'houses' of Parliament that make the laws and govern Australia.

Council wants a word about the future



MOUNT Alexander Shire Council (MASC) is seeking feedback about some key planning documents and is asking residents to provide six words to guide it. The Council is working on a vision statement, a health and wellbeing plan, plus a broad strategic plan to outline budgetary priorities and feedback will be taken until Tuesday 22 April.

Council states on the Shape Mount Alexander website that it is involving as many people and organisations as possible when developing these documents. The website has options for a brief survey that asks simply for six key words, or a more in-depth survey. It is also possible to be directly in touch with Council to have input by phone, email or using postcards that are available at Castlemaine Civic Centre, Maldon Neighbourhood House or the Newstead RTC.

In relation to the documents, Council describes the Community Vision as "a statement that describes a community's aspirations for the future" and says that the Municipal Public Health and Wellbeing Plan (MPHWP) is mandated by and must align with, state-wide laws and plans around the protection and improvement of health amongst community members.

The Council Plan is directly linked to the MASC Annual Budget; it must be reviewed regularly and contain measurable goals. The newly elected Council is required to deliver a Council Plan to set out its strategic focus for the next four years, showing "key priorities, goals and actions." By giving Council three words for 'things that matter to you most now' and three words for 'things you're thinking about for the future', you'll be helping to highlight the priorities of the community.

Following this community consultation process, MASC will work in partnership with consultants to develop the documents and will prepare a draft Council Plan 2025-2029 during May for community review. It will be presented to Councillors for consideration at the June Council meeting. 



The children loved making the biscuits and setting up the chairs ready for our afternoon visitors.



Natural Newstead

THE following is a recent blog post by Geoff Park from 'Natural Newstead: Observations of flora, fauna and landscape in central Victoria'. Text and photographs are printed courtesy of Geoff Park.



Still around

We've been away for the past two weeks and almost the first sound I heard on return was that of Rainbow Bee-eaters, a small flock passing overhead at home, heading north.

Later in the day I paid a visit to one of their favourite gathering sites that is used before migrating. Perhaps a dozen individuals were present (including a number of juveniles), hawking insects above the canopy with occasional plunges into the water for insect prey or to bathe. Tree Martins, another migrant that will depart soon, were also present – a reasonable sized flock of about 40 birds.

Also noted: Little Lorikeet, Grey Currawong, Yellow-tufted Honeyeater, Fuscous Honeyeater, Black-chinned Honeyeater, Spotted Pardalote, Magpie-lark, Crimson Rosella, Eastern Rosella, Peaceful Dove, Wedge-tailed Eagle.

Australia-first survey targets the role of local papers



POLITICAL leaders across Victoria are being asked their views on the importance of local newspapers and their ongoing sustainability as part of an Australia-first research project. The Victorian Country Press Association has engaged Deakin University researchers to examine the impact of the state government's decision in 2022 to introduce the equivalent of a page of public awareness notices each week in most newspapers across rural and regional Victoria. The move attempted to provide some surety to the business model supporting local news in a challenging digital environment.

The Victorian government is the only state government in Australia to make this guaranteed commitment. The federal government has pledged a minimum \$3 million of its advertising budget to support local newspapers as part of its new \$153.5 million framework to support public interest journalism in Australia. VCPA executive officer Peter Kennedy said the research project would survey political leaders at local, state and national levels across Victoria as well as local news proprietors.

Professor Kristy Hess said government public messaging was an important area to research because it differed from election advertising spending as it provided awareness about a range of issues from road safety to bushfire awareness, new infrastructure projects, and health messaging.

She said it was the first time politicians had been surveyed about their perceptions of, and role in, supporting public interest journalism.

"Government and media are often uneasy bedfellows and tend to keep 'distance' from each other, when actually they share a symbiotic relationship," Professor Hess said. "Any form of government advertising should not buy favours of the press but it has been an important, unspoken revenue source for local newspapers for decades. A lot of this spend has shifted towards social media in recent years."

Dr Alison McAdam said all tiers of government would be approached to be involved in the survey.

"We know some local governments, for example, produce their own publications rather than spend money advertising in a newspaper, so we want to understand that further," she said.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

The tobacco experiment

ON Wednesday 25 June 1930 the Victorian Assistant Minister for Agriculture, Reg Pollard, visited Maldon with tobacco expert A.J. Temple Smith. During a meeting at the Shire Hall (now the Maldon Museum), Temple Smith pointed out that the granite soils around Maldon were ideal for growing the light tobacco leaf so much in demand for cigarettes. He also offered to come back to Maldon to explain the opportunities afforded by establishing a tobacco industry.

Two weeks later, Temple Smith returned to Maldon and gave a lecture on tobacco, illustrated by lanternslides. Several landholders who attended expressed interest in trialling tobacco and James Waldron of Tarrengower Court (now Tarrengower Prison), undertook to plant out a five-acre plot.

Soon after, the Advance Maldon Association also decided to establish a small tobacco plantation at Bradford and, through a committee chaired by Alf Meyer, issued a prospectus to form the Maldon Experimental Tobacco Plantation Company. Local residents quickly took up shares in this new enterprise.

By October 1930, Meyer was able to report that the experimental plot had been planted out. Over 10,000 seedlings had been obtained from local nurseryman Alf Harding, who had been raising tobacco seedlings for many years. Harding had supervised the planting and offered to provide ongoing advice. Department of Agriculture officials had also visited the plot and they too promised their support.

With the economy in deep depression, tobacco was seen as a viable alternative to wool, wheat and fruit and so there was widespread interest in the experimental plot. Local agents used the prospects of this new industry to sell farmland and in August 1931, the plot and its curing kiln featured in a Weekly Times' article on Maldon. This report also included a photograph of tobacco being grown by David Morgan at his property on Back Cemetery Road.

In 1931 the Maldon syndicate managed to produce 457 pounds of cured tobacco leaf, which sold for 3s 3d a pound. They also produced 195 pounds of leaf residues that were sold for 1s a pound.

While this first crop was a success, the tobacco experiment hit a major hurdle when, in December 1931, Joseph Lyons and the United Australia Party won the federal election in a landslide. One of the new government's first acts was to halve the duty on imported tobacco leaf. This made tobacco grown in marginal areas such as Maldon uneconomical and put an abrupt end to the experiment.

Library reviews *Memorial Days* by Geraldine Brooks, 2025

Many cultural and religious traditions expect those who are grieving to step away from the world. In contemporary life, we are more often met with red tape and to-do lists. This is exactly what happened to Geraldine Brooks when her partner of more than three decades, Tony Horwitz just 60 years old and, to her knowledge, vigorous and healthy, collapsed and died on a Washington, D. C. sidewalk.

After spending their early years together in conflict zones as foreign correspondents, Geraldine and Tony settled down to raise two boys. They shared a life of meaningful work, good humour and tenderness, but all of this came to an abrupt end when, on Memorial Day 2019, Geraldine received the phone call we all dread. The demands were immediate and many. Without space to grieve, the sudden loss became a yawning gulf. Three years later she came to a remote island off the rugged coast of Australia to give herself the time and solitude to mourn. She pondered the varied ways those of other cultures grieve, such as the people of Australia's First Nations, the Balinese, and the Iranian Shiites, and what rituals of her own might help to rebuild a life around the void of Tony's death.

Bennelong and Phillip: A History Unravelled by Kate Fullagar, 2023

Bennelong and Phillip were leaders of their two sides in the first encounters between Britain and Indigenous Australians, Phillip the colony's first governor, and Bennelong the Eora leader. The pair have come to represent the conflict that flared and has never settled. Fullargar's account is also the first full biography of Bennelong of any kind and it challenges many misconceptions, among them that he became alienated from his people and that Phillip was a paragon of Enlightenment benevolence. It tells the story of the men's marriages, including Bennelong's best-known wife, Barangaroo and Phillip's unusual domestic arrangements and places the period in the context of the Aboriginal world and the demands of empire. To present this history afresh, Bennelong & Phillip relates events in reverse, moving beyond the limitations of typical Western ways of writing about the past, which have long privileged the coloniser over the colonised. Bennelong's world was hardly linear at all and in Fullagar's approach his and Phillip's histories now share an equally unfamiliar framing.

The Garden of Evening Mists by Tan Twan Eng, 2011

Malaya, 1949. After studying law at Cambridge and time spent helping to prosecute Japanese war criminals, Yun Ling Teoh seeks solace among the jungle fringed plantations of Northern Malaya where she grew up as a child.

Beautiful Assassin by Michael White, 2009

Beautiful Assassin is a stunning, relentlessly thrilling and richly evocative historical novel. A gripping tale of secrets and suspicion as a beautiful Russian woman, one of World War Two's most decorated snipers, is caught between her government's deadly intrigues and First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt.

One Down, One Missing by Detective Senior Constable Joe D'Alo with David Astle, 2004

Join the largest manhunt ever mounted in Victorian police history. On 16 August 1998, Sergeant Gary Silk and Senior Constable Rodney Miller were shot dead while on duty. The Victorian policemen had been staking out a restaurant in Moorabbin as part of an operation aiming to snare two serial bandits who'd been targeting fast-food restaurants around the city's southeast. A member of that team, Detective Senior Constable Joe D'Alo, has collaborated with writer David Astle to give the reader a rare chance to enter a dramatic chapter of Australian police history and take you on the full investigative journey that took several years to reach its dramatic conclusion.

Weed watch

Common name: South African Weed Orchid Botanical name: Disa bracteata

Weed classifications:

South African Weed Orchid is a new Environmental Weed in Victoria. It's in the early stages of invasion and can be eliminated if action is taken now. If this plant is allowed to invade unchecked the consequences could be devastating.

Where did it come from:

It was introduced into Australia as an ornamental garden plant from South Africa.

What does it look like:

This is a robust, erect, fleshy perennial orchid which grows annually from tubers to 30-50cm high. Each plant grows up to 60 tiny flowers on a thick, cylindrical spike that resembles a brownish asparagus spear. Green grass-like leaves grow up the stem, decreasing in size progressively up the stem. Modified leaves also embrace each flower. It flowers in September and then the brown fruit disperses millions of minute dust-like seeds in November.

Why is it a problem:

This plant is highly invasive because it produces millions of dust-like seeds, allowing it to spread very easily from gardens into native bush, where it competes with and excludes small native plant species such as lilies, grasses and orchids. This reduces native biodiversity and food sources for our native animals. This is a weed we cannot risk ignoring.

How does it spread:

The plant self-pollinates and the minute seeds are very easily dispersed by wind and also on vehicles, equipment, clothing, shoes and by water and animals and spreads very rapidly. Spread:

South African Weed Orchid was first found in Victoria in the 1940s and has since established



populations across the state. Over the past few years, isolated plants have been found locally within the Maldon Historic Reserve and within Maldon township.

How can it be controlled:

Please ensure you don't have this introduced weed in your garden or on your property. If you find South African Weed Orchid, the best way to eradicate the plant is by digging it up, making sure you also dig up all the tubers underneath the soil. Place plant and tubers in a double-bag and seal the bags, then dispose in domestic waste so that they go to landfill. The seeds continue to mature even if the flower head has been picked and remain viable for approximately seven years. When walking in the bush, it's a great idea to carry a couple of plastic bags in case you find an isolated plant. If this is not possible, it's extremely helpful to record the plant and location using the WeedScan app on your mobile phone. More information:

Wheel Cactus is bad news for property value



THE presence of weeds such as Wheel Cactus on your land, particularly large infestations, no doubt affects the value of your land.

Wheel Cactus are an eyesore, and any prospective buyer could easily be turned off by these horrible weeds. If I was looking at two similar properties, one full of Wheel Cactus and one without this scourge, I know which one I'd choose! A property where Wheel Cactus is absent, or at least in low densities, is bound to be far more appealing to most buyers.

Apart from the aesthetics issue, weeds represent clear financial problems for primary producers because they reduce farm productivity. Weeds can reduce crop yield by competing for water, sunlight and nutrients and smothering pastures. They also negatively affect stock by reducing available forage, causing physical injury and hindering grazing behaviour.

Did you know that weeds and pest animals cost Australian farmers approximately \$5.3 billion every year in management and lost production? Of this enormous figure, weeds (not animal pests) actually contribute 82% of this total cost, according to a 2023 report by Australian Bureau of Agricultural and Resource Economics and Sciences, weeds (not animal pests) contribute 82% of this total cost. There are of course many other non-financial benefits to tackling weeds such as Wheel Cactus on your land. Weed control benefits the neighbouring natural environment, gives you pride in your achievements, and the physical activity can reduce stress and improve your mental and physical wellbeing.

If you have Wheel Cactus on your land, don't be discouraged. It is possible to clear your land of this noxious weed, and it's never too late to get started. The Tarrangower Cactus Control Group (TCCG) has a wealth of information and support to provide landowners and neighbourhood groups, including providing equipment on loan. 
