Small grants, big impact

TWO community organisations in Maldon celebrated on Friday 23 May after the recent news that they would receive grants from the State Government's Tiny Towns fund.

Member for Bendigo West Maree Edwards MP (who has been very busy and features prominently in this week's *Tarrangower Times*), visited Maldon Golf Club to officially announce that the club will receive \$28,800 and Tarrangower Village will receive \$14,553. "It's a very exciting announcement for Maldon because it's two," Ms Edwards said, while congratulating the volunteers who successfully completed the applications. "I know fundraising is a hard job."

The Golf Club plans to upgrade its kitchen facilities, increasing the kitchen's usefulness for the club and for hirers of the venue.

Meanwhile, Tarrangower Village will upgrade its footpaths to improve accessibility for its residents and visitors. Ms Edwards said: "I think that it's important to remember that Tarrangower Village is an important part of our community."

Maldon Golf Club President Glyn Milner spoke to the group about the big impact of the relatively small grant amounts. "It is very important for little communities. To get that sort of money is critical. Plus, a big chunk of it will be spent locally," he said.

Ms Edwards said she can't wait to return and see the outcome of the projects.

Stock theft: be alert

A Newstead farmer is fuming, and members of his community are rallying, after his neighbour witnessed his sheep being stolen. Tony Butler had attended a protest with emergency services volunteers in Melbourne on Tuesday 20 May when he says the incident occurred.

Tony and another member of the Newstead farming community, Rebecca Hamilton, are trying to raise awareness of stock theft and seek community support and assistance. In particular, they are asking for everyone to keep an eye out for suspicious activity and anyone with information to come forward.

Tony explained that the recent alleged theft, which was not his first experience of stock

theft, first became apparent when a neighbour drove down a remote road by Tony's property. The neighbour reported to Tony that she saw a white van (later identified as an Iveco Daily) towing a furniture trailer; some men were throwing sheep into the van and the trailer. "The moment we realised we'd been hit by thieves we went out and did a paddock count and we found ourselves to be exactly 80 short." Tony said, confirming that police have been fully informed. He believes that the incident was organised to coincide with the protest, which was against the State Government's new Emergency Services and Volunteers Fund legislation. Tony said: "The farmers rally on the Tuesday was all they needed to attempt

this theft. Probably 30-40% of the farming population of Victoria was in Spring Street."

Tony said he and other farmers are fed up with being targeted by thieves. In the past, he has trialled solar-powered satellite trackers for his sheep, but the technology was not reliable enough. "It's in its infancy, it's expensive, we've found it's got flaws," Tony said. "We will have to go back to a similar system, but that doesn't take away from the fact that this organised theft is happening."

Rebecca Hamilton, who told the *Tarrangower Times* that she has also experienced theft of stock from her farm in the past, said that there has been a big response to calls for help on social media in relation to the van witnessed in

the incident. Rebecca hopes that by spreading knowledge of the risk of stock theft, that the community can be alert. She asks that anyone with information call Crimestoppers. "We're encouraging people to report, it helps a tight-knit community," she said. "We're all just here to help each other."

Community members are encouraged to take note of unusual stock mustering or transport (at night, for example); record time, location and vehicle details to provide to police. To report crime information confidentially, call Crime Stoppers: 1800 333 000.

Housing report warns of worsening affordability

The National Housing Supply and Affordability Council's second annual report called 'State of the Housing System 2025', was publicly released on 21 May 2025. The report's Executive Summary states that housing affordability continued to deteriorate in 2024. 'For aspiring home owners, the average number of years required to save for a deposit rose to a near-record high of 10.6 years,' it said.

The summary also described difficult conditions for renters: 'Many renters faced ongoing rental stress, with 60 per cent of those in rental stress experiencing two or more consecutive years of rental stress.' The Council's report said: 'The deterioration in affordability in 2024 in large part reflected the fact that housing costs rose as new housing demand exceeded new housing supply.' Advocacy group 'Everybody's Home' said it reinforces their message that the housing system is in crisis. A spokesperson said: "The State of the Housing System 2025 report is a sobering and necessary reminder to urgently invest in social housing and reform tax settings that fuel inequality."

Creative grant for Castlemaine Community House

Victorian Minister for Creative Industries Colin Brooks announced on Monday 21 May the latest round of recipients of the Small Regional Presenters program, providing grants to community groups and not-for-profit organisations to assist with the costs of programming and presenting creative shows and programs within their communities. The recipients include Castlemaine Community House, which has been granted \$15,000 to

present a children's theatre performance called *Play Date* during Castlemaine Pride in 2025.

Council is running a full day of activities for small businesses in Castlemaine on Friday 27 June 2025, saying it will be dedicated to sharing ideas, skills and support for micro and small businesses in our region. CAM Director Naomi Cass steps down

The Board of Castlemaine Art Museum (CAM) announced on Friday 23 May that Museum Director Naomi Cass will step down from her role on 26 June 2025. CAM said that since her appointment in 2019, Naomi has worked with the CAM Board, Trustees, staff, volunteers, funders and donors to revitalise the organisation. It said the leadership of Ms Cass has seen the renewal of CAM's programs, partnerships and profile, securing its place once more on the national cultural map. Reflecting on her time at CAM, Ms Cass said: "It has been an honour to serve CAM and its unique assets – the collection, the building and the people – on Dja Dja Wurrung Country.

Working closely with Djaara Elders Uncle Rick Nelson and Auntie Kerri Douglas, and with local artists, our dedicated volunteers, guides, staff and the engaged community has been a privilege. Together, we have reimagined the role of a regional museum in contemporary Australia. I'm confident the next director will continue to build on this momentum." The CAM Board thanked Naomi for her vision, commitment and contribution.

Community invited to help shape therapies pilot

Murray PHN (Primary Health Network) is seeking input from community members to help design services for a new creative therapies pilot for people living with mental health conditions in Castlemaine. Funding for beloved Buda

BUDA Historic Home & Garden in Castlemaine will be funded to proceed with its plans to upgrade and improve, as announced by Member for Bendigo West Maree Edwards MP on Thursday 22 May. The Victorian State Budget allocated \$500,000 to support the next stage of restoration for the well-loved heritage property.

President of Buda’s charitable, not-for-profit organisation Bronwyn Rudolph said: “It means we can keep going with our

Master Plan, which we’re hoping will sustain us into the future.”

The site of festivals, arts workshops, and community events, Buda will use the funds to pursue the next steps, which include heritage and planning permits. Chief Operating Officer Vivienne Hamilton explained that when the Master Plan has been completed, the house will be entirely open to view and Buda will feature a new event venue and Visitor’s Centre. “It

will be a much better experience for visitors,” she said.

Buda was built in the 1860s and named after Budapest by Hungarian immigrant Ernest Leviny. The house, with its Italianate façade and surrounding 1.2 hectares of garden, holds a nationally significant collection of art, furnishings and family treasures.

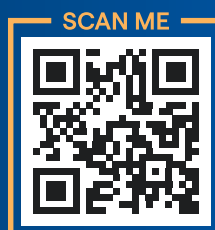

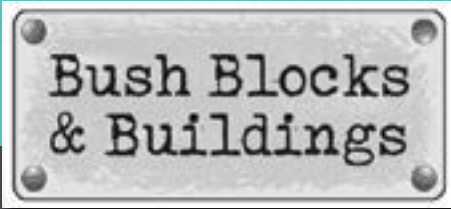

Butts Reserve

THE historic picnic and camping notable spot Butts Reserve — at the bottom of Mount Tarrengower — is perfect for a walk amongst ancient boulders and gullies, casting your imagination towards the natural world and the people who have walked here before.

Butts is only 2km from Maldon’s shops, which is a breeze in a car but would have taken an hour or two on foot or in a buggy; it has long been seen as a day-trip destination. It is called Butts Reserve because it was once used as a shooting range for the Maldon Rifles shooting club.

There are amenities including tables and a toilet block, with plenty of room for free camping. Just be sure to check your dates in advance: the volume and vibe is somewhat different at Butts when the Tarrengower Hill Climb event is taking place (think: rally cars and motorbikes), while during the 1970s and 80s it was the primary venue for the Maldon Folk Festival. This area was historically a source of local water (the mountain is covered with rivulets that fill when it rains), some of which

was used in goldrush times by breweries nearby.

These days it’s good for a photo amongst those instagrammable rocks, lunch around a fire (following CFA guidelines of course) or a ramble further up the hill to the lookout tower. Butts Reserve is a brilliant place to have a ‘sniffari’ with your leashed canine family member, because it features all sorts of

residual scents from human and animal activity. There is lovely bird life, a variety of flora and a historic covered pavilion that was happily under repair when the *TT* visited. Usually Butts Reserved is quiet and serene; well worth a visit.

The art of pruning – shaping the future with every cut

IN the heart of winter, when the cellar is still and the vines look lifeless against grey skies, there’s one job that signals the quiet beginning of the new season: pruning.

It doesn’t make headlines. It’s not glamorous. But pruning is one of the most important, most personal, and most reflective parts of vineyard life. It’s where next year’s wine begins—not with grapes, but with clippers. Pruning is more than maintenance. It’s a craft. And each snip is a decision that shapes not only the vine, but the wine to come.

Why Prune at All?

Vines, like people, need boundaries. Left alone, a grapevine will sprawl in every direction, putting energy into wood and leaves instead of fruit. Pruning focuses that energy. It balances the vine, reduces disease pressure, and sets the stage for high-quality fruit when spring arrives.

A well-pruned vine:

- Produces better fruit
- Ripens more evenly
- Allows for better airflow and sunlight
- Lives a longer, healthier life

It’s not about cutting back—it’s about setting up the vine for success.

There are different pruning methods—spur, cane, double Guyot and more—but the principles are the same: choose the best wood to carry fruit next season and remove what’s no longer needed.

Every vine is unique. Old vines may need a gentle hand. Young ones can be shaped. Weather, past yields, soil health—all of it factors in. And once you’ve made the cut, there’s no going back. At Panacea Estate we typically use a spur pruning method.

I walk the rows with my, taking my time pruning, but also finding amazing little spiderwebs and birds’ nests. Each snip is considered. Each decision has consequences, nine months from now and beyond. It’s hard to describe, but pruning becomes a conversation (or maybe I just like talking to myself). The vine tells you where it wants to grow; the job of the pruner is to guide it.

Tools of the Trade

For the curious: yes, there’s a bit of gear involved.

- **Sharp Secateurs, both electric and manual** – Essential. Dull blades do more harm than good.
- **Loppers, reciprocating saw or chainsaw** – For old wood or vines that need heavy cuts (next week will write about larger cuts).
- **Gloves** – Unless you want hands like sandpaper and many cuts.
- **Headphones** – Optional, but a solid playlist, an audiobook, or some podcasts can make the cold mornings go faster.

On a personal note, some of my favourite mornings at Panacea happen in winter—just me, the vines, and the soft crunch of frost underfoot. There’s no rush. No noise. Just breath, cold air, and quiet satisfaction. There’s something deeply human about pruning. You’re not reacting, you’re planning. You’re not rushing to bottle—you’re investing in the future, one small decision at a time. And come vintage, when the fruit ripens just right, it feels like the vines are thanking you for the care.

#15 of a series: Ellen Gladman, Maldon Lolly Shop and BNB.



So, how's business?

"Last year... April 24... 2024. It was the settlement of buying the business. Nervous? Yes, because not long afterwards we had a big public holiday, the King's Birthday. It was the long weekend... it was a beautiful day... the Maldon market was on – it was like the perfect storm. I'd only just bought the business,

and the holiday weekend was absolute mayhem. People bought everything, everything, everything! Crowds filled the shop, so I couldn't see the shelves to go and restock them. And when the shop finally cleared after hours and hours, it was just like a battlefield of little bags of lollies hiding in the corner. It was baptism by fire... it really was, but I was so grateful because it was like the worst-case scenario... it gave me ideas of the things I could change about the way I work in the space... to make it a better experience for the customer and for us.

"This year was my first experience of the Easter weekend – a big weekend in Maldon for a lot of us in retail. This time I was ready. And I made it! I was so pleased to have made it through my first year. I've done businesses from scratch before and it's really, really hard. And I didn't know if I had it in me

again. I remember sitting at the swimming pool in Newstead, enjoying the sun, and my friend saying to me, "There's a For Sale sign at the front of the Lolly Shop in Maldon." The next day I was having a look at it. We came all the way through the building, saw an opportunity for a BNB as well, saw all the things in the shop... I walked out thinking, 'Oh my gosh, this is it. It's perfect.'

"I've now become part of the Maldon Inc committee. I've been looking forward to getting involved with other business owners. Now that I have a good feel for my own business, I can take some extra time to focus on some other things, including doing my bit to support Maldon."

Logistics

"My nightmare. Logistics. That's not my natural place. So that's been a challenge for me, figuring out the best way to run the business logistically out the back. For me, it's a lot of stock and high turnover and making sure I've got everything ready to

go. Logistics impact so many other things. For example, coming up to Easter, I was a bit frightened about how many people were going to come in; I didn't really know how much stock we were going to need. I was spreading myself a bit too thin trying to do everything. Then came my staff, Linda and Gemma... they stepped in and just naturally took over some of those roles I thought I had to do and it opened up my brain to be able to do the other stuff better. So yeah, I've created a really wonderful little team here."



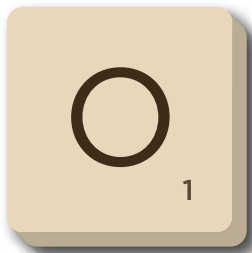

"Well, Okay... umm, Dragons? So, where did that come from? I don't know. I'm not really into the dungeons and dragons and fairies, and stuff like that. However... (PONDERING)... I've always been into fairies as a little girl. I was always down the backyard looking for fairies and building

play houses. And today, I love leaning into imagination and fun, which is why I love event themes here in Maldon like Goldfields Gothic. I used to have a costume shop, so it doesn't take much to encourage me to get into a fun outfit or to get themed. I mean, I do daily themes sometimes in the shop as well. I'm already thinking about Christmas... and I've got one of my makers working on a special hard-boiled lolly for this year's gothic theme. So there you go, that one was an easy one after all."



Open mind

"People giving advice... it can be very, like, 'Oh no, I've never done it like that before.' I don't like shutting yourself off when I'm doing something I have never done. Or parts of this I've never done before. Having an open mind, listening to people's ad-

vice, and then taking what I need, letting it sit and stew, and then I find it'll pop up when I need it. When I bought the business a year ago, I had things I thought I was going to do in the shop. 'This is my idea and this is what I want to do' kind of thing. But then sitting in the space, listening to the customers, watching the patterns play out and going, 'Oh, that's not what is going to work here at all.' So you can't just get stuck in one way of thinking. It's about staying open-minded."

Magical

"This one's big for me. Magical was something I felt the shop needed to be. So that's where I've been trying to take it. It's been really important to me that the shop isn't just about buying chocolate and lollies. So if somebody is walking past

or sees the window from across the street... 'Ooh, what is happening in there... that looks different... that looks enticing?' It says Lolly Shop... OK, I'm not really into lollies, but I still need to go and have a sticky beak.' That's the mystical, magical something I want to create because it's different. And the lovely thing about Maldon is that I can pop a little magical-feeling shop here and it fits in so well. The streets themselves, the experience in Maldon is unique and quite magical. Like Maldon, the Lolly Shop is a true journey back in time... to your childhood."



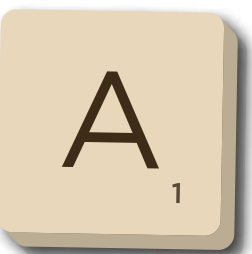
Neurodiversity

"I have a very neurodiverse workplace. I was late-diagnosed ADHD – all my friends and family are all apparently the same! And my team members tend to be gifted that way as well. So, we have a lot of fun, and we laugh a lot and dance a

lot. Being ADHD diagnosed, that is what I work with, including the logistics I mentioned earlier. The way I run things and the way I do things may not be from a business textbook, but I do what works for us... my business. That means, for example, listening to my neurodiverse staff when they say, "Do you mind if I rearrange these shelves here... looking at them makes my brain hurt." If it doesn't mean anything to me, then I say, 'You go right ahead.' If that helps them work in this space, then I'm all for it."

THE OLD OLDSMOBILE

HIDDEN in sheds, under tarps and out of sight in Maldon, are some amazing things.

This is a 1925 Oldsmobile Tourer, which obviously means it's now 100 years old.

Here's a fun fact: it was Oldsmobile that pioneered the production line, not Henry Ford, although he certainly picked up the idea and ran with it with his Model T.

Looking back, cars from this era all look similar to me, but in their day, the brands all represented different market segments. Oldsmobiles were upmarket cars and part of the General Motors family. They were a cut above the Buick, but not as expensive as a Cadillac. I find it interesting how the advertising gurus can control our perceptions; human nature hasn't changed since the twenties (you could write a thesis about that). Some Oldsmobile models were as expensive as a house.

What has changed though, is the technology. Although it gets along quite well at 60 to 80 kilometres per hour, you really need to watch closely what's going on up ahead, or you'll be getting much more excitement than you planned on. The problem is the brakes. Only on the front wheels and then only mechanical, not hydraulic, so I wouldn't be comfortable driving the Olds in Melbourne traffic. No shock absorbers either, but we're talking 100 years ago and so it's not fair to make any comparisons.

This car was the subject of a very thorough restoration about 30 years ago and then unfortunately, the owner passed away and his widow left it virtually untouched until recently. It's pretty close to what a brand-new 1925 Model Oldsmobile would have been.

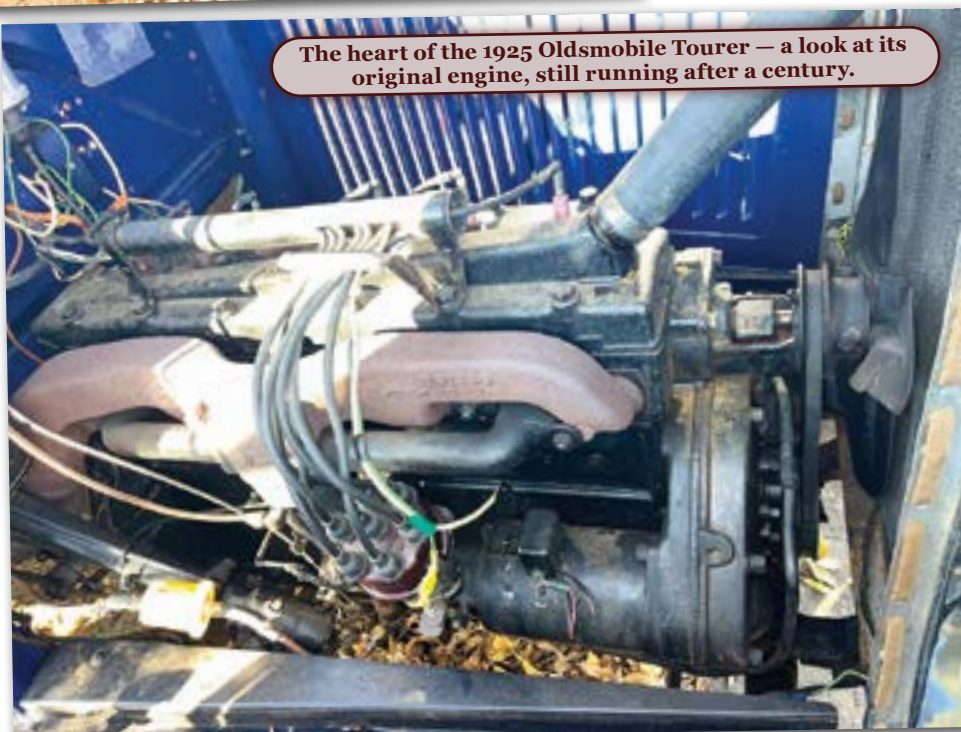
To drive a 100-year-old car today is to experience a completely different attitude to travel.

It was the new freedom, to go wherever you wanted, at three or four times the speed of a horse, something which is hard to imagine today and the reason that enthusiasts love these old vehicles.

Vignettes bring library to life

IT was an upbeat afternoon at the Maldon Athenaeum Library on Saturday 24 May, when the library launched its new online feature.

The Library History Vignettes are a series of vignettes designed to illuminate, through words, the history of the building, the organisation and its community.

The launch of the Library History Vignettes attracted over 60 people, many of whom had been involved in the years-long project. Member for Bendigo West Maree Edwards MP gave a poignant introduction about the value of the place and the people. “This is no ordinary

library,” she said, describing the Maldon Athenaeum’s longevity as “The quiet but powerful force of community.” Ms Edwards said it was a great source of connections: “New volunteers step through your door and find friendship, purpose and belonging.”

Author and Historian Robyn Annear gave a ripping run-through of the workings of the Mechanics Institute movement, to which the Athenaeum belonged, and how it affected Australian country towns. Of its origins she said: “The movement aimed to improve you morally as well as intellectually, to make you a more valuable worker,” and the idea was

embraced by the same kind of people who were attracted to the gold rush: the growing middle class of tradespeople, shop keepers and skilled workers. It was this group who brought the movement, which had originated in Scotland, to Central Victoria. Ms Annear pointed out that few remain. “It would be interesting to see what the originators of this place would say to this rare and valuable survivor!”

Coordinator of the Library History Vignettes project Dr Lynda Achen talked the attendees through the library’s internet page, where the vignettes can be found at the History page and feature photos and references. Ms

Achen was weirdly disrupted by a confused, elderly person in satin who called herself Mrs Beale and insisted that she was the librarian and caretaker, until it was pointed out that she died — to the day — over 130 years ago. The entire presentation was very engaging and the appearance of an apparent ghost before afternoon tea was a highlight!

Regional view: State Budget

THE Victorian Treasurer Jaclyn Symes MP handed down the State Budget on Tuesday 20 May and it is now available for public scrutiny — it is presented more like an illustrated, online brochure than a spreadsheet. It came after the government sent a flurry of announcement emails to the media (evidently scheduled one-per-minute over the Tuesday lunchtime period). There is a lot of documentation and information to absorb in the State Budget, so the *Tarrangower Times* scanned the pages to gather some key points.

Overview

The State Government’s 2025-26 Strategy and Outlook paper contains big-picture forecasts about the economy and shows a continued focus on recovering from the COVID years. The world context is factored into the forecasting as well, with a nod to Donald Trump’s tariff talk. The document says: ‘Victoria enters this period of global uncertainty from a position of strength. The economy demonstrated its resilience through the COVID-19 pandemic and the subsequent period of high inflation and elevated interest rates, with favourable labour market performance compared with many advanced economies over this period.’

A glance at the Summary of Initiatives provides an understanding of how the Victorian budget pie was sliced up by the government; announcements continue to be made about where the money will be spent. Items and amounts include \$171 million for Victoria’s hospital infrastructure; \$497 million to

improve mental health services; \$211 million for road maintenance activities; \$320 million to complete the statewide rollout of Disability Inclusion in schools; \$407 million to unlock land for housing, continue stamp duty concessions and support those experiencing or at risk of homelessness; \$727 million for a community safety package to implement major reforms to Victoria’s bail laws and measures to keep Victorians safe.

Budgeting for regional Victoria

Under the heading ‘Supporting Rural and Regional Victoria’ the paper states: ‘The 2025-26 Budget builds on this Government’s continued investment in our regions with a further \$1.5 billion invested.’ The budget includes investment in regional transport, including \$52 million for the Gippsland, Seymour and Bendigo train lines, which the government says will result in additional capacity for Bendigo services. The budget invests \$976 million in delivering a Better Roads Blitz (maintenance and repair); \$117 million to improve regional education facilities and services; \$216 million in regional healthcare, including \$84 million to maintain regional and rural ambulance resourcing across Victoria; \$12 million to complete Maryborough Hospital; \$50 million for the regional stream of the new Victorian Investment Fund and \$60 million towards regional natural and cultural activities.

Other regional programs mentioned in the Strategy paper include \$10 million towards infrastructure for water, sewerage, roads and electricity, \$400 000 to pilot new Regional

Launching Pads for collaboration spaces, development of agricultural applications of RNA technology, and a new web portal focused on regional Victoria’s economic opportunities.

Organisations Respond to Budget funding

In the wake of the budget on Tuesday, various advocacy groups have been distributing their public responses to the State Budget. Landcare Victoria responded with cautious optimism, saying it welcomes the \$17.3 million allocated by the government over two years for Landcare and Coastcare programs. However, the organisation is disappointed that its call for long-term, secure funding has not been met. “Landcare is delivering on its commitments and doing extraordinary work across the state, but government support is falling short of what’s needed to ensure stability and growth,” said Landcare Victoria CEO, Claire Hetzel.

The Australian Industry Group, a national employer organisation, said the budget was designed to please Victorian voters. It said: “The Victorian State Budget announced today is an early election budget delivered 18 months out from the State’s next ballot. But it provides little for business and offers few additional benefits to encourage and support Victorian businesses.”

BLAST FROM THE PAST

Maldon's early Bakers

THE Maldon Bakery has a good claim to being Australia's oldest continuous operating bakery. In 1854, soon after the discovery of gold, George McArthur began baking bread locally and about 1857 built the small brick building that is part of the current building. The McArthur family operated the bakery for more than 80 years.

The McArthurs did not have a monopoly on baking in early Maldon. In August 1858 their neighbour, butcher Henry Knight, offered to let a bakery and stables on the current site of the Phoenix Building. Also in the late 1850s Wilhelm Ewald operated a German bakery, probably in North Maldon on Reef Street.

At the same time Hugh Hainan rented a bakery from John Robinson at the back of Robinson's Loddon Store that then stood on what is now the vacant block at 7 High Street. On Tuesday 7 February 1860 Hugh and his wife's drunken quarrelling disturbed their neighbours and later a fire broke out in the bakery that destroyed not only all of the Hainans' possessions but also part of Robinson's store.

There were a number of other bakeries in High Street. Storekeeper Robert Wheelhouse had one until 1864 when he had a frightful accident while driving his cart between his shop and his home in Long Gully. Wheelhouse injudiciously sat on a pile of empty crates and fell from the cart when the crates shifted. He severely fractured his spine and later died, leaving a young widow and two children.

Also in High Street, just below Spring Street, Robert Lawrence established an early bakery that continued under various bakers until the Housing Commission demolished the building in 1968. The Wells' family operated this bakery for many years.

In 1866, on the corner of Templeton and Reef Streets, Joseph Crossley opened the Scotch Pie House. Crossley rented the site from the Warnock brothers who had set up their first Beehive Store there in 1858. In the 1870s Thomas Robertson, baker and confectioner, took over the business and specialised in cakes and pastries.

Maldon's bakers delivered bread widely around the district. In September 1888, when the Maldon Bicycle Club were returning from Maryborough on their penny farthings, they met a Maldon baker near Baringhup who provided them with breakfast and later took one tired cyclist and his bike back to Maldon. More tragically in 1911 a popular Maldon baker, Charles Rerden, drowned in the flooded Muckleford Creek while on his regular rounds.

The one thing that is really good about our Bridge Club is the relaxed atmosphere and camaraderie that helps us get through the lack of concentration, or a distraction or two, and in the end it is only a game of cards!

Following the afternoon tea break we finished off the day's play and the scorers Ken and Mary quickly had the numbers crunched and entered into the computer for the revealing of the final placings.

In first place with 54 points were Liz and Judy Mac who concentrated and combined well to gain the extra tricks needed for success. There was a slam bid missed by the duo with all 13 tricks taken by Liz! Second place went to Mary and Newstead Jo with 50 points. Ken and Associates were third with 46 points, followed by Werner and Fred in fourth place with 34 points. Well done to all.
