



### Wilderhoods at the MULGA AGM



FOLLOWING Maldon Urban Landcare's (MULGA) AGM last Saturday, educator, ecologist and garden designer Dr Cassia Read gave an inspirational presentation on how to create a thriving neighbourhood environment in response to the changing climate. The solution, according to Cassia, is to create wilderhoods in urban areas.

Wilderhoods are a way to effect positive ecological change, primarily by communities coming together to plant grasses, shrubs and trees that bring nature into towns and cities. Cassia and her colleague Ada Nano, who head up the Castlemaine Institute, have conducted two successful pilot programs in Castlemaine that have seen local residents embarking on projects to rewild their neighbourhoods.

A passionate gardener, Cassia undertook her PhD in the Mallee and Wimmera, looking at small tracts of remnant vegetation surrounded by paddocks of wheat. "It made me realise how much nature can be found in a small place, and how important connectivity is in maintaining those islands of wildlife," she said. "Connectivity is vital. Plant a tree and you'll bring insects to your garden. The insects will bring birds. That's how it begins."

Cassia believes it's important to create habitat for wildlife in our towns. "We're right flat bang in the middle of an area of remnant vegetation, and we need corridors for our wildlife," she said. "In dry, hot times, those animals come into the towns. The birds come out of the bush looking for water. We need to create places of refuge for them."

Rewilding projects, according to Cassia, have great community benefits. "There's a sense of wellbeing when you're involved with greening and with nature, and it leads to a growing connection between neighbours," she said.

Where to start? There are many possibilities, including your nature strip! Imagine if you got together with a few neighbours and planted your nature strips with indigenous grasses and shrubs. And that'd be one less area that you'd need to mow

There may be a neglected area at the back of your shed, where you could plant some shrubs that will attract wrens or honeyeaters.

Remnant vegetation nearby vacant land needing care? Give it some care!

Cassia's dream is to make wilderhoods an integral part of urban areas across the region. "We attracted funding for our first two programs, through an Adapt Loddon Mallee grant and from the World Wildlife Foundation. In order to move on from where we are at present, however, we need more funding," she said.

## Porcupine Village - Permit Withdrawal

A State Government grant of \$1.7 million to assist with the development of a tourist complex at the Porcupine Village site was announced with much fanfare by the Minister for Sport and Major Events Martin Pakula one year ago. It was envisaged that the development would create more than 100 jobs and attract more visitors to the region.

The planning permit application for the proposed development has now been formally withdrawn, with Mt Alexander Shire Council recently notifying objectors of this fact. Objectors were informed by Council that the developer is now "considering opportunities to pursue a new proposal that is reduced in scale."

The permit application withdrawal does not, of course, affect the Village's current operations, which includes the Golden Nugget Restaurant - a popular place for locals and visitors to have a meal and take in some live entertainment.

The *Times* has contacted Mr Frank Hutchinson, the owner of Porcupine Village, for a comment. He said that, together with his town planning consultants, he was reassessing the planning permit application with a view to modifying the plans for the development. "We're trying to get it right," he said. "We want a development that is better for everyone in the end."

Ideally, Mr Hutchinson told the *Times*, he would like to see the development open in stages - firstly the motel units, and then the village.

## Fire Danger Period Has Begun

THE Fire Danger Period started on Monday this week, almost a month earlier than the FDP in 2022. According to Maldon Fire Brigade Captain Sean McCubbin, the coming summer is shaping up to be a potentially dangerous time for fires.

Sean is not surprised that the Fire Danger Period has already been declared. "I would have been happier if it had been called before the Folk Festival," he said. "You only have to look at the grass, which is very dry. There have already been a few fires in the area caused by hay cutting and roadside slashing. The smallest spark is all it needs at the moment to start a fire. You only have to look at what's been happening in Queensland to realise that it could be a long, drawn-out fire season."

According to Sean, if you haven't cleaned up your property yet, then it's definitely time to get into gear. It's worth remembering that you can dispose of your green waste free of charge at Maldon and Castlemaine transfer stations from Saturday 25 November to Monday 11 December. And don't forget to bring proof of your Shire residence.

This summer, Sean believes that it's important to be prompt when calling in a fire. "Call before a fire becomes a big issue," he said. "Don't be scared to call, because a small fire can easily escalate and become something big."

It's anticipated that there will be a fire safety information day at the Maldon Fire Station before the end of November, with the date yet to be finalised. "But you're welcome to call in at the station on any Sunday morning," Sean said. "There are always CFA members there then who'll answer your questions. And if you see any public land near your house that you think needs slashing, please let us know. We can always advocate for you."

## **Trailer Theft**


RENEE, Michael and son Ben moved to Maldon just a few weeks ago and set up their gardening/yard clean-up business 'MowMee'. Renee went through breast cancer treatment last year, and Michael started this new work venture to fit around Renee's ongoing medical appointments.

Early last Sunday morning, Michael heard a noise and went to investigate, only to see their trailer being taken away. It is a brand-new 8x5 box trailer with dual axle and mudflaps; it was full of rubbish at the time with some brooms and rakes. Renee made this appeal to whoever was responsible: "We cannot run our business without it and can't afford to replace it. If you have a conscience at all, it's not too late to leave it somewhere and text anonymously where it can be found. We really just want it back ASAP so we don't lose any work or money." An unconfirmed report claimed that six trailers were stolen recently.

Leading Senior Constable David Rose from Maldon Police Station told the Tarrangower Times that three trailers had been stolen in Maldon over a 10-day period, two of which have been recovered. It appears that at least one, containing stolen property, had been used for illegal wood collection. Chainsaws in good condition were also found; if you are missing that or any other equipment, please feel free to contact Maldon Police. Leading Senior Constable Rose also urged residents to 'harden up' about household security. He noted that relaxed attitudes in our relatively crime-free community expose a soft underbelly and create temptation for the light-fingered. A Police program named 'Target Hardening' aims to raise awareness of the easy target we can make of ourselves and our possessions through complacency. You have been warned.

## Know Your Local - Meg Sattler



THE Times caught up with Meg Sattler this week on the day she arrived home in Maldon from an intense three weeks of work in Europe. Based in Vienna, Meg heads up a small NGO that gives policy advice on the delivery of humanitarian aid. To date, she has had an amazing career where she has made a positive difference to the lives of untold thousands of people. And you get the feeling that the best is yet to come.

Let's start at the beginning, when Meg's family lived in Melbourne, moved to Tennant Creek for a while and eventually settled in Castlemaine. She remembers her parents and her grandmother being involved with social justice issues, with Meg and her sisters being taken to protests and encouraged to watch the news. "Although that didn't immediately influence what I wanted to do when I left school," Meg said. "I didn't want to change the world. My aim was always to work in wildlife conservation or veterinary science—anything to do with animals."

In the end, Meg studied journalism at Deakin University and this led to a job with World Vision working in emergency communications. From there, she was deployed to Haiti for six weeks, following the devastating earthquake there in 2010. "I ended up staying there for two years," she said.

From Haiti, Meg worked on the ground in Pakistan, Syria and Iraq and held senior roles with a number of United Nations offices. These were tough assignments, and in Pakistan she received death threats and had to leave. "I was probably too young at the time and it was a very senior job," she said. "We were trying to organise vocational training for Pakistani and Afghan girls and we copped huge criticism from men in general and the Taliban in particular."

But Meg talks still easily of these times. "Yes, it was hard," she said. "You do get angry about the way the world is, but I feel as though I've been really privileged too. I've had access to communities I'd never have seen if I'd stayed in Australia, and gained so much knowledge about the world."

Working with a team of 30 people, Meg's organisation plays a watchdog role in working out the best way to deliver better results when it comes to channelling aid to crisis-affected countries. "Sometimes we push ourselves in, but mostly Humanitarian Coordinators invite us in to help. We're more or less an accepted part of the architecture of the humanitarian aid system now."

The non-profit organization is funded by the governments of Norway, the Netherlands, Switzerland, the USA, Canada and Sweden, as well as contributions from foundations like Ikea. "We've just been nominated for the Hilton Prize," Meg said (at \$2.5million, this prize is the world's largest annual humanitarian award presented to a non-profit organisation).

Meg believes that there will be increasing pressure on the aid sector as there are so many protracted crises throughout the world. "There are more refugees, more people displaced within their own countries, and climate change will lead to more people needing aid," she said. "It's a challenging but interesting time to be working in aid. I'm genuinely inspired by the young people I meet. The new generation is much more connected and shares a great deal of information to help them organise and push for change."

Questions that Meg and her organisation need to ask are: Is aid relevant? Is it working? "Local knowledge is essential," she said. "You need to ask people what they want and what they think. Local organisations often work the best, if resources can be directed their way. For instance, in the early days of the Ukraine conflict, it was the small, local organisations who were delivering aid. And they did a great job. But sometimes the aid is not working; large aid organisations can be bureaucratic and a bit colonial. Smaller and scrappier organisations can often deliver more effective outcomes."

Even resilient people such as Meg have their limits. On the humanitarian crisis in Gaza, Meg said, "Everyone I know working in my sector is just broken by what's happening in Gaza. We need to tell our leaders it can't go on. People power on this one is strong. We must speak up. I've seen a lot of crises, lived in a lot of war zones. But Gaza is just beyond me."

Gaza notwithstanding, Meg said that there have been times when she has struggled with the amount of suffering she has seen. "Seeing children being trafficked in Haiti and seeing the impact of war on little kids in the Middle East," she said. "That has affected me more than when my own security has been threatened."

It's a big life, a stressful life that Meg leads. She flies out again soon to attend COP28 in Dubai, but in the meantime she is enjoying time at home in Maldon with her rescue dog Chippy (who is cared for by Meg's parents during Meg's overseas stints). "Maldon is my little slice of paradise," she said. "I always say that Maldon's nice, but not nice enough to be covered in tourists. I can go out walking, not see anyone else and simply disconnect by being in nature. My little bush life helps me cope with my crazy international life."

Meg is a Director of the Community Bank Maldon & District, having been approached to join the Board after she won a category of the local photography competition. "I love being on the Board," she said. "It's a whole different level of accountability and decision-making to that of my working life."

And here is what those surveyed in regional areas consider to be the top five elements of their ideal Main Street, in order of preference:

- Cleanliness
- Parking
- Safety and security
- Walkability
- Services & amenities (Services may include post offices, banks and service stations, while amenities would include easy access to public conveniences, seating etc).

How do Main Street and High Street in Maldon measure up? Pretty well, although there's not a lot on offer in terms of footwear unless you count the possibility that gumboots may be on sale at SP Machinery & Hardware! Apart from the lack of footwear, Maldon ticks all the boxes.

## **Batteries - Warning**

NEW research by B-cycle, Australia's government-backed battery recycling scheme, shows that most Australians are not aware of the simple safety measure of taping used batteries.

For child safety and for fire prevention, used batteries must be covered with clear sticky tape and never put in general waste and recycling bins.

Here are some worrying statistics:

- More than half (55%) of Australians are still disposing of batteries incorrectly in regular waste or recycling bins.
- 79% are not aware of the important safety step of taping used batteries.
- Only 12% say they immediately tape the exposed terminals when replacing used household batteries.

Button batteries in particular are a huge safety issue. While they appear harmless, battery buttons can have a devastating impact when ingested or inserted by small children. They can cause severe internal caustic burns and death. If thrown in general waste and recycling bins, button batteries can cause fires and can leach toxic materials into the environment.

Taping and recycling batteries can:

- Make batteries harder to swallow or insert.
- If ingested, the tape limits the caustic burn and gives health staff more time to save the child's life.
- Tapping over battery terminals helps prevent short-circuiting.
- Keeping batteries out of general waste and recycling bins helps prevent fires in the waste stream and stops batteries going into landfill.
- Recycling gets used batteries out of the home and into safe hands so they can be made into something new.

B-cycle has over 4,000 easily accessible drop-off points across the country in retail stores such as Aldi, Bunnings, Battery World, Coles, Officeworks and Woolworths. Councils also have collection points.

The message is:

Don't toss them!

Tape them!

Take them to your local B-cycle drop-off point or council collection site.



## Maldon Vintage Machinery and Museum

—— MEET OUR MEMBERS —-

A series of profiles showcasing our wonderful volunteers.

#### Today we meet: MORRIE OXLEY

"I'm from Raywood, a small rural community just north of Bendigo. I started farming here in the late 1940s and ran a beef, sheep and cropping property."

Morrie went on, "I soon developed an interest in improved farming techniques and was the first in the district to practice organic farming by improving my soil without the use of pesticides. I was also looking at innovative tools to improve my pasture. In the early years, I had my working horse team of between 4 and 12 Clydesdales, which then progressed to me building my own powerhouse to run farm machinery. Then around 1980 came the tandem Chamberlain tractor. I made this hybrid tractor by joining two different Chamberlains together to pivot in the middle (for manoeuvrability). This provided me with double the horsepower for my needs."

Morrie states that the neighbours could hear his twin Chamberlain from miles around when he fired it up and marvelled at its capabilities. "They dubbed it the 'Lizard'," he says.

"I also had the biggest hay mower of the times ... because I built it!"

By building his own farm machinery, Morrie was able to improve the productivity of his farm, also modifying machinery for other local farmers in order to fulfil their needs.

He continued to tell me that the Department of Agriculture would call him every few weeks to see what he was doing as he had developed advanced methods of improving his soil, consistently returning the biggest crop yield in the district!

A pioneer of advanced farming techniques within the agricultural industry.

Morrie has long since retired from farming and his Chamberlain 'Lizard' was laid to rest. Many years later, it was acquired by a tractor and machinery enthusiast basically in pieces and later bequested to the Mt Alexander Vintage Engine Club (MAVEC) for restoration.

On Sunday 29 October 2023, MAVEC held its annual Tractor Pull event at the Dave Bennett Reserve at Muckleford and Morrie's Chamberlain tractor was proudly displayed for all to enjoy.


88-year-old Morrie was on hand to see the 'Lizard' power up and get behind the wheel one more time. You couldn't wipe the smile off Morrie's face as he did a lap of honour!

Restoration is now almost complete thanks to a dedicated team of volunteers at the Mt Alexander Vintage Engine Club, who have spent countless hours bringing the Chamberlain back from the brink.

Morrie has been a member of the Maldon Vintage Machinery and Museum for about 12 years (he thinks) and brings a vast knowledge of stationary engines, tractors (particularly Chamberlains) and farm machinery to pass on to other members.

Morrie continues to show a keen interest in sharing this knowledge and is a much-valued member of our museum.



### **Natural Newstead**

#### **Getting busy**



#### Posted on 6 November 2023

After filling the skies above the forest for weeks now, the woodswallows have finally descended to nest.

It's early stages, with some birds incubating and many nests still being constructed.

White-browed and Masked Woodswallows often select locations in the lower canopy, such as a fork in a sapling – this pair has chosen a small River Red Gum. Low stumps and even fence posts are also frequently used.

Interesting to note the fresh lining in this nest – native grass stems and wool to complement the outer shell of slender dry sticks.





## **Mosquitoes - Stay Safe this Summer**

FOLLOWING last year's heavy rain and flooding, particularly across parts of northern Victoria, conditions have created the ideal environment for disease in the mosquito population.

For some people, mosquito-borne diseases can lead to severe and long-term health complications. Mosquitoe-borne diseases that can be passed from insect to human include Japanese encephalitis, Murray Valley encephalitis, Ross River, Barmah Forest and West Nile viruses.

Here are simple and practical steps that you can take to reduce the risk of being bitten by mosquitoes:

- Cover up by wearing long, loose-fitting clothing; mosquitoes can bite through tight clothing.
- Use mosquito repellents containing Picaridin or DEET on all exposed skin.
- Check the repellent label before applying to children.

Spraying or rubbing repellent on children's clothes is recommended. Avoid applying it to their skin, especially their hands.

- Minimise outdoor activity if there is an increase in mosquito numbers. Use 'knockdown' fly spray, mosquito coils or plug-in repellent when sitting or eating outdoors.
- Remove stagnant water where mosquitoes can breed around the home or campsite.
- Make sure your house and holiday accommodation are fitted with mosquito screens.

High-risk areas where residents are eligible for the Japanese encephalitis vaccines include Greater Bendigo and Loddon. These municipalities are close to the *Times* readership area, so the message is clear: avoid getting bitten by mosquitoes this summer!

## **Uptick in Train Travel**

TAKING the train to Melbourne and back has become a popular way to travel. More than 1.5 million trips have been taken along the V/Line northern corridor in the six months since regional fares were capped.

Since the launch of the fare cap, the level of regional travel across the network has increased by around a third in the same period last year, including a more than 50 per cent increase in patronage on the Bendigo Line compared with the same period in 2022.

V/Line has experienced the busiest Winter and Spring school holiday periods for train travel on record under the fare cap.

To help meet the extra demand, V/Line has added hundreds of special services across the network, including additional weekend services on the Bendigo Line. V/Line has also added carriages where possible, used standby coaches at key locations and trialled new reservation procedures.

Bendigo West Member Maree Edwards said, "We're delighted fairer fares have been so popular and we'll continue transforming the regional rail network – upgrading every line in the state, as well as adding more trains and services."

## BLAST FROM THE PAST

#### A POEM FOR THE SHIRE COUNCIL

IN late 1883, Joseph Jenkins, the Welsh Swagman, was living in the bush at Ravenswood in a hut he called 'Ants' Hill Hermitage'. He was finding it hard to get regular paid employment or buyers for the firewood he gathered. To obtain some income, he successfully tendered for a Shire of Maldon contract to dig a drain and clear a road of dead trees at Walmer. After Jenkins had completed the contract. the Council Surveyor and a number of other Council employees inspected his work and expressed their satisfaction with it.

In early January 1884, a severe storm hit Walmer, downing a number of trees. Some of these blocked the approach to a bridge across the Muckleford Creek near what is now Williams Road. The Council asked Jenkins to cut these trees up and remove them. After he completed the job, Jenkins' account for payment was accompanied by some original poetry that was read at a Council meeting on Thursday 7 February.

The first poem was a ditty of just four lines expressing Jenkins' thanks for the job.

> Thanks to the storm that blew the trees, And block'd the public road; That brought the labourer some fees, To blunt his hungry goad.

The second poem was headed *Rhymes dedicated to R H* Way, President and consisted of seven verses each of four lines. Richard Henry Way, a local butcher, was then the Maldon Shire President.

The poem opened with the lines:

Travel and beg for a job to toil With skill to improve the maiden soil, With fair remuneration in both ways, With peace and plenty through all our days

Jenkins argued that the workingman had skills and knowledge to contribute and should not be just seen as a source of cheap labour. He then went on to object to government-assisted immigration that undermined workers' wages. Jenkins reminded the reader that the working class paid more than their share in taxation and all levels of society would suffer without their toil. Labour, he said, was property's 'best pearl'.

In his final verses, Jenkins declared that everyone was born 'to do something that's good'. The Colony's militia alone was not strong enough to defend Victoria against an invader. It would need the support and assistance of 'strong and happy settlers'. The poem ended with the lines,

> Vain pride, selfishness and ambition Will never make, nor form a nation.

## **Bowerbird Collective at Holy Trinity**



MALDON has been completely spoilt for musical offerings recently, from the lavish Folk Festival weekend to regular gigs at our drinking holes – and last weekend, something truly special in the series of classical music concerts hosted by Rev Darcy Vaughn at Holy Trinity Church. Violinist Simone Slattery and cellist Anthony Albrecht are the Blue Mountains-based Bowerbird Collective.

Their enchanting presentation was an immersive experience of music supported by text and visuals on a large screen, its theme 'Sounds of Australia'. It was a feast for the senses - as they said, "we make art for nature." The recital began with strings and haunting vocals. Classic Australian outback scenes were projected onto the screen, then extraordinary footage of birds on the wing as familiar birdsong combined with their playing. The audience was treated to film of wrens, fledglings in the nest, a bowerbird at work nest-building and large flocks of native birds.

The music included works by Arvo Pärt, Sarah Hopkins,

Ralph Vaughan Williams, Ross Edwards, David John Lang and Chris Williams. There was a Bach prelude and the classic medieval welcome to spring, 'Sing Cuckoo'. Quotations about birds and birdsong projected behind and beside the performers were a constant reminder of the natural wonders we have on this remarkable continent and indeed around the world. Many of the quotes were from the renowned Tim Low. We were reminded of the unsurpassed mimicry of Australia's lyrebird, described appropriately as 'a Shakespeare among birds'. Adding to the tribute came verse from George Meredith, Siegfried Sassoon and John Keats.

The stunning conclusion to this special concert featured a Yorta Yorta song. And in a visual tour de force Simone Slattery stood playing violin in front of the big screen projecting a flock of white cockatoos in flight; it seemed they were actually flying across her deep green frock. Wow.
