Q: How many Folk Musicians does it take to put on a festival?

A: Over 50 to fill the program and hundreds to sing about how good it was!

ONE of the great things about Folk Music is that it can be evocative and transportive; taking listeners on imaginary journeys to other times and places. Many ticket-holders have already undertaken a trip to be in beautiful Maldon for the festival so the event becomes a further jumping off point to the

broader world, with a huge array of artists and styles on offer in the 2024 program.

Highlands, lowlands and lochs

For those whose hearts are yearning for highlands or craggy coasts there are many artists with Celtic vibes, including the fluting and fiddling of Out of Hand, Enda Kenny from Ireland, Alan Reid from Scotland and Fiona Ross singing Scottish songs. Bread and Drink and Painted Rooms offer Anglo and Celtic inspired melodies, while Réiltín Collective (Irish for little star) presents classics plus heartfelt originals and the O'Shea Ryan Academy

Of Irish Dancing promises to translate the sounds into steps.

Roots and boots

There is also a great selection for audiences whose musical preferences tend towards the American, with the bluegrass sounds of Nick Charles (bluegrass, sounds American), the heartfelt guitar tunes of Suzette Herft. The honkytonky, rockabilly beats of Rhiz and the Sugarplums will surely have the crowd on its feet while the Duck Downpickers offer foot-stomping fun.

Bush range

Indigenous voices include Leroy Johnson & the Waterboy - playing catchy campfire songs about Country and culture - and Sonia Smith & Glenn Skuthorpe singing stories of struggle and triumph. For fair dinkum bush vibes there is Robyn Martin singing outback stories, Kevin McCarthy and Michael Waugh telling Aussie tales and the Emu Creek Bush Band who will encourage the whole family to dance. 

Voting has closed on the local government election after ballot packs were mailed to over 4.4 million voters. The Victorian Electoral Commission (VEC) had received 61.33% back at close of business on Thursday 24 October, with those mailed by 6pm Friday 25 October accepted until 12 noon on Friday 1 November. Electoral Commissioner Sven Bluemmel says: "The counting of votes will take place over the next three weeks locally within each council wherever possible." The VEC anticipates that all elections will be declared by Friday 15 November.

Report shows gender bias continues in news reporting

Australia's largest media study tracking gender bias in news reporting reveals a mixed report card for newsrooms. The report by the Women's Leadership Institute Australia (WLIA) shows business news continues to be dominated by male reporters and experts, but the gender balance in political reporting has improved since the last study in 2021. Led by La Trobe University Professor of Political Communication Andrea Carson, the study analysed more than 200,000 articles to track the gender of bylines and expert sources across key news topics and major media outlets. "While we found almost equal numbers of male and

female journalists in Australia, women still disproportionately cover soft news stories, while men write the hard news topic areas," Professor Carson said. "While men account for 80 per cent of expert opinions, we found women are better than men at quoting women's sources," Professor Carson said. The editor of leading local newspaper the *Tarrangower Times* agreed.

Castlemaine Farmers Market turns 21!

The next market on Sunday 3 November will be an extra special celebration of this milestone birthday with entertainment, giveaways and fun. The monthly Sunday market now hosts around 80 stallholders and the weekly Wednesday edition is hyper-local and smaller, appreciated by regulars for their weekly shop. The market has a growing partnership with local First Nations groups and the traditional boundaries of Djaara Country serve as the meaning of 'local'. Whenever possible growers are selected from within these boundaries. There's now huge interest in supporting local growers and eating locally grown seasonal food. Consequently there's a consistent emergence of new producers who see the market as providing a viable opportunity for selling their produce. It plays a key role in reducing the digital divide between cities and regional Australia, with feedback from the public in previous Reviews leading to policy initiatives and programs such as the Mobile Black Spot Program and the National Audit of Mobile Coverage. Kidsafe Australia and the Royal Life Saving Australia are calling on home pool and spa owners to check their barriers and help reduce the tragedy of toddler drowning. The call comes as figures from the Royal Life Saving Australia's National Drowning Report show that 15 Australian toddlers aged under four drowned in 2023/24. Backyard swimming pools account for 40% of all infant drownings. Drowning continues to be one of the leading causes of accidental death for Australian children under four.

Celebrate Maldon: Twilight Dinner 2025

THE famous and fabulous Maldon Twilight Dinner will return next year, with the theme of 'Maldon's Gold' and a focus on local produce and talent. President of the Maldon Lions Club Renée Thompson confirmed that the event will take place on Saturday 18 January and that tickets will be on sale in the next few weeks. "I'm really excited that it's going ahead and everyone I've spoken to has been really positive," Renée told the *TT*.

Having been event manager and coordinator of the event for eight years, Pamela Jewson 'passed the baton' following the 2024 dinner. The Lions Club will oversee the running of the 2025 dinner in cooperation with the Maldon Vintage Machinery and Museum, whose team will do the heavy lifting. Renée says the handover has been smooth. "We've always been working with Pam anyway so she has been very helpful."

Renée addressed the rumour that the dinner would be moved to Francis Street in reaction to some discontent about shop closures that occurred this year. She says it was simply a suggestion that was 'thrown around' but the venue remains the central stretch of Main Street, Maldon. "I've spoken to most of the shops

about the plans," Renée explained. "There'll be signs on both ends of the street from the first of January to let people know that the street will be closed from midday that day, but all the shops will still be open for everyone to enjoy." She said that Main Street does not face the same hurdles for a temporary closure as High Street does for the Easter Parade, because High Street is a council-owned road.

There are some great plans for the 2025 dinner, including the involvement of the Victorian Goldfields Railway to bring diners from Castlemaine by train. A gold class ticket will be available, offering gold class service such as wait service and a premium position. The dinner will be three courses, including a grazing plate from the start, with products from the local region. "If anyone goes home hungry, I will be surprised," Renée says. Dessert will be provided by cafes on Main Street and the bars will provide drinks in what will be a very local affair. "We're using as much of Maldon as we can; it's all about celebrating Maldon."

Rare glimpse into a wonderland



SHADES of Gray is a magical, metal garden wonderland that is only open for a few weeks each year. Its annual exhibition begins on Saturday, November 2 at the intersection of Farnsworth and Brown Streets in Castlemaine.

Peter Gray, who has been working into the wee hours for months, preparing and creating pieces for the exhibition, encourages locals to experience it. "People travel from all around the world and you're only 13 minutes away," he said. "We're only open 15 days of the year; come over!"

Shades of Gray is an extraordinary manifestation of the hard work and imagination of its owners, Peter and Chelly Gray, who have worked on it for 31 years. Every corner is a delight for the eyes, with metal blooms emerging from below and bell flowers hanging overhead. Multiple galleries are filled with mirrors, candelabra and wreaths, all decorated with flowers and creeping tendrils. "I wanted it to look like a florist shop," said Peter of a gallery adorned with brightly coloured metal blossoms. He explains that the colour is created by using many hues of ordinary paint. "It's not special paint; we want the rust. We tried making flowers with rust-proof paint and nobody wanted them!" Peter is particularly excited to share something new that they have been working on: a detailed and quirky 'Chook House' filled to the rafters (literally) with metal chickens. "This will break the internet!" he laughed, posing beside Romeo the rooster.

The annual exhibition attracts people from far and wide, but this is the 24th of its kind and Shades of Gray is well-equipped to manage. They will be assisted by 20 staff, in two marquees, with eight EFTPOS machines. "It's a world-class event with 13,000 flowers," Peter said. "You won't see that anywhere!" He assures potential visitors that while some ornate pieces - such as birdcages and weather vanes - are likely to sell out quickly, the gardens and galleries will still be gorgeous and spellbinding until the last day of the exhibition. Why would you miss a glimpse of this wonderland and a chance to take a piece home?

Liadaan's magical mystery garden tour

LIADAAN has created a magical garden just down the road from the Maldon CBD located at Avalon Studio - Greenhouse Gallery and Sculpture Garden, 26 Parkins Reef Road.

Within the garden there is an outdoor gallery full of trailing plants in hanging baskets, ceramics and mixed media sculptures, together with oil on linen paintings of flowers and fruit. Just in time to complement the Festival of Gardens. And of course, to celebrate spring. The Gallery is open for the Central Victorian Clay Trail, which will be on Saturday 2, Sunday 3, Monday 4, and Tuesday 5 November.

This magical mix of creations is set within a garden that has areas to sit and contemplate the cool green growth around you, or gaze at the waterlilies in the pond. It is an altogether immersive experience.

Liadaan's magical realism is most evident in her mixed media sculptures such as the piece titled *After The Storm*. Where she has combined ceramic sculpture with mistletoe. And another titled *The Scream of the Falling* is also a combination of ceramic with mistletoe.

There is a particularly meaningful work titled *Mother and Child*, which can be ordered to be cast in bronze.

Meanwhile Liadaan has just recently had work exhibited in a group exhibition in Florence, Italy, organised by the Rossocinabro Gallery in Rome. She entered two plein air landscapes featuring Maldon and surrounds in

North Central Victoria. This is the outcome of contacts she had made over the years with curators who have seen her work, commencing when she represented Australia in the Florence Biennale in 2013 and had a solo exhibition in Verona in 2016.

Liadaan's artist statement sums up her approach very succinctly... *Dividing my work between the disciplines of painting, drawing, sculpture and poetry. I am a contemplative artist. I am not necessarily looking for a lot of detail in a subject; however, sometimes I like to take a portrait or still life to a higher finish. I look for the light, mood, atmosphere and poetry favouring late afternoon, moody and crepuscular subjects. Due to the moving light my landscapes are mostly understated. My focus is always the interplay between the lights and the darks. Figures are usually painted in contemplative poses. I work plein air and in the studio and attend weekly life drawing and painting groups. Still life is also a well-loved subject.*

My ceramic and mixed media sculptures are always based on the feminine and often accompanied with animals and plants. Nature and dreams are the inspiration for all of my art work.

I like to write haikus, which are often accompanied by small tonal paintings.

I don't follow art trends keeping true to my own vision and working from the heart. I consider all of my work to be a meditation.

Liadaan was also happy to have been chosen as a finalist for the Kennedy prize in South Australia this year with a pastel work titled *Japanese Study*. Around 50 artists nationwide are chosen, so she said,

"this was a huge thrill to be hanging with the best."

When not creating more delightful plantings in her garden, Liadaan is presently working towards a pastel drawing exhibition at the Convent Gallery in Daylesford in December. She is unstoppable.

Over the long weekend there will be two books for sale in the open air gallery: *Tomorrow In Your Dreams* by Kurt Forrer, and *Dancing on Green Air Paintings and Haikus* by Liadaan, which was launched at an exhibition in March

2021, thanks to Dino Marasà and staff at Studio By-blos, Italy.



A chat about serious business - fire season

FIRE season looms and Maldon CFA is holding a Fire Safety Essentials session at the Maldon Fire Station Tuesday 26 November at 7pm, with a reminder that the conditions are different each year.

Bruce Clements 1st Lieutenant (Acting Captain) of Maldon Fire Brigade says that everyone should think ahead about fire season and be alert, not alarmed. "It's most important that people think of it now rather than when they need to," he says. "Don't wait until the rush at the last minute."

Fire restrictions will come into force in Mount Alexander Shire on Monday 11 November and residents should take a few steps to become fire ready, Bruce says.

He points to the CFA website as a wealth of information and says the VicEmergency App is essential for those living in regional areas. "Always have the VicEmergency app," Bruce says. "I set mine for 50k radius. You might get a lot of false alarms but I think that's a minimum distance, it gives you enough time to leave."

If it becomes necessary to leave your home, depending upon the circumstances and location of a fire, the CFA has designated 'Neighbourhood Safer Places' in this region as the Bill Woodfull Recreation Reserve on Francis Street, Maldon and Newstead Community Centre at 9 Lyons Street, Newstead. Bruce regularly mentions the phrase "situational awareness" which means knowing what is going on around you. "If it's one of those terrible days, don't stay inside watching TV," he says. "keep an eye out."

Some other smart suggestions from Maldon's Acting Captain include:

- Keep gutters clean, mow lawns regularly.
- Remove debris, rubbish and green waste from around the house.
- Have a fire plan and kit.
- Store financial and other important information on a USB stick, such as insurance and bank details, medication and medical information.

Acting Captain Clements says: "The more information you have, the better decisions you can make."

Free Green Waste Disposal

Mount Alexander Council is offering a free green waste disposal period from Saturday 2 November to Sunday 17 November 2024 to help residents prepare homes and properties for the upcoming fire danger period (proof of residence is required).

Stay informed for 2024

Even if you think you've heard it all before, come along to the Fire Safety Essentials session at the Maldon Fire Station, Tuesday 26 November at 7pm. There will be specific discussions about the conditions that residents in Maldon and the wider region are facing for the 2024 fire season and everyone is welcome. How to keep a cool head during fire season

BUSHFIRES are a terrifying reality in many parts of Australia, and they have a way of turning even the calmest person into someone gripped with fear. When fire threatens your community, property, or loved ones, panic is a normal reaction. However, the experts say that while you can't always predict how you'll respond in a fire emergency, being prepared significantly reduces the chances of panic.

Preparation starts well before summer arrives, and being proactive now is key to staying safe when the heat is on. Having a fire plan, knowing your evacuation routes, and practising them with your family or housemates can make all the difference. It's important to involve everyone, from children to elderly relatives, so that they know what to do if a fire threatens.

Another essential tip is to understand the fire danger ratings. Pay attention to local alerts and warnings, especially on high-risk

days. VicEmergency is the official Victorian Government app for emergency warnings and information. You can download the VicEmergency app from the Apple store or Google Play and set up notifications for your area to ensure you don't miss critical updates. Alternatively put the following url into your browser: <https://tinyurl.com/5n96kfve>. Knowledge is your best defence against the unpredictable nature of bushfires.

It's also wise to create a support network within your community. Neighbours can help keep an eye on your property if you're away, and they might be able to lend a hand with evacuation if needed. Remember, when panic sets in, it's easy to forget crucial steps. Staying prepared is not just about property—it's about mental readiness too.

Essential tips for making your home fire-ready



AS the fire season looms closer, it's crucial to ensure your property is prepared. The reality is that bushfire prevention is a year-round job, and if you haven't already started, now is the time to get your home fire-ready.

While many think the danger comes from the flames, it's often embers carried by the wind that pose the greatest risk. These tiny sparks can land in dry foliage, on roofs, or in gutters, starting a fire before you even realise it.


One of the most overlooked tasks is cleaning gutters. Leaves and debris in roof gutters can ignite from embers, creating a fire hazard right above your head. Regularly clearing out your gutters is a simple yet effective way to prevent this. Likewise, cutting back branches that overhang your house or carport and ensuring

there's at least a two-metre gap between your roof and surrounding trees can help stop fires from jumping onto your home.

Another tip is to avoid having flammable materials near your house. Wood piles, mulching, or even furniture made of combustible materials should be kept well away from the walls of your home. Think carefully about what you store next to your house—it's often the small details that make the biggest difference.

Make sure gaps in your roof spaces, under eaves, and especially under timber decking are sealed, as embers can easily invade these areas. And remember to keep your grass cut short—10cm or less is the ideal height to reduce fire risk.

Green waste disposal information

- Green waste includes garden waste such as grass, sticks and branches that are less than 10cm in diameter.
 - The green waste must be free of contaminants such as rubbish and declared noxious weeds, and removed from plastic bags prior to disposal.
 - Loads containing items other than green waste will be charged accordingly.
 - Residents are also encouraged to compost as much material as possible at home.
 - Proof of residence in the shire will be required.
 - Normal green waste disposal fees will apply to businesses or residents acting on behalf of businesses.
 - Normal gate fees will apply before and after the free green waste disposal period.
- "Another way to make sure you're prepared for high risk weather season is to have an emergency plan.

"Mount Alexander Disability Advocacy Group is running a free program for residents called the Emergency Planning Assistance

program," said Luke.

The program means a volunteer from MAS-DAG, Council, CFA, SES or the red Cross can meet you in your own home to give advice, answer questions and help create a plan for emergencies.

"This is a fantastic service that's open to anyone, but is especially suitable for our most at-risk and vulnerable residents – those who face barriers accessing existing information, attending meetings and creating and implementing emergency plans," said Luke.

"I encourage you to get in touch so we can make sure you're ready in case of emergency."

The smoking ceremony was held by Uncle Rick, and he had all the children listening to what he was saying. He explained what a smoking ceremony is, some background on the land including all the different areas and talked about the two feuding volcanos: Lalgambook and Leanganook (Mt Franklin and Mt Tarrengower).

WOMINJEKA!

We invited the grade five and sixes from Maldon Primary School, and the kinder children were super excited to mingle with them, some having a brother or sister in that grade. The grade fives this year will be our Gumnut children's buddies next year, so it is important that they spend time together, as it helps with their transition to Primary School.



A smoking ceremony is a tradition that has been performed by Aboriginal people for centuries. It is an ancient custom among Aboriginal tribes that involves smoldering various native plants to produce smoking which has cleansing properties and the ability to ward off bad spirits. Traditionally an elder welcomes people to their land and significant events can be celebrated. We all walked through the smoke, encouraging it to cover us, then put the soles of our feet to the smoke.

Maldon Preschool were celebrating the end to our bush kinder program (however we are looking to extend it into Term 4) and the commencement of our Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP). The smoking ceremony will also cleanse the space to allow peace for subsequent Bush Kinders.

At the end of Bush Kinder we sprinkled a mix of native wildflower seeds donated by one of our kinder families in a bid to heal country.



Many sacred returns

I heard my first **Sacred Kingfisher** of the spring in the last week of September at the Rise and Shine.
 My first sighting was on 4 October, this time of a pair in one of their usual breeding haunts along the Loddon River near town.
 Sacred Kingfishers are at home in a variety of habitats. I've just come from a few days in the Little Desert National Park where several were seen in stringybark/mallee woodland many kilometres from the nearest waterway. They are breeding migrants to central Victoria, arriving any time from early September and then departing usually in March.
 Listen out for their harsh 'kek-kek-kek' call over the next few weeks as they stake out their breeding territories. One could be heard calling just now in the centre of town!

Open garden to benefit animals

CATHERINE and Neil Tait are opening their gates to the public and all the proceeds will be donated to Regional Community Vet Clinic (RCVC). The gorgeous garden at 'Stringy Bark Hill' in McKenzie Hill (between Castlemaine and Muckleford) is offered as part of the Castlemaine and District Festival of Gardens and will be open from Saturday 2 to Sunday 10 November.

The Tait's are both sculptors and have transformed the area around their home since 1982. "It's been evolving since then," Catherine says. 



BLAST FROM THE PAST

ELSIE THE 'STOLEN' COW

IN January 1947 dairyman Thomas Caudry was charged in the Maldon Court of Petty Sessions with stealing a jersey heifer belonging to Margaret Harcoan, licensee of the Kangaroo Hotel. There was considerable interest in the case and all the court's seating, including the jury box, was filled. At the time the Maldon Common was in operation, allowing cattle registered with the Common's manager to roam and graze on Crown land. It was therefore quite usual to see cows wandering about the town.

William Ralph of Chapel Street told the Court that his brother, George, had bred the heifer after their sister's cow had been mated with a bull loaned by Tom Caudry. He said the heifer was a little jersey with a short square jaw and 'pretty small horns', which he could easily identify in any herd. He had seen it regularly around town and at the Kangaroo Hotel until about two months earlier. George Ralph confirmed his brother's evidence. He also said that two years earlier he had sold the heifer to Mrs Harcoan for £1 after she had taken a fancy to it when it wandered into her backyard.

Margaret Harcoan told the court that her heifer went missing on 14 November 1946 and she did not see it again until Christmas Eve when she identified it in a paddock in Bendigo. She said that it had come to her when she called it. She had then noticed that, in addition to the brand she had put on it, it had a new brand that she recognised as Tom Caudry's. On returning to Maldon she confronted Caudry and told him that unless he arranged for the heifer's return she would go to the police.

Caudry insisted that he had bred the heifer and that it was his property. He claimed that he had branded it as a calf and had then let it roam on the Common. He had not seen it for some time, but when he came across it drinking from a trough in High Street he decided to take it to Bendigo to be sold. Caudry plead not guilty to the charge and was committed to stand trial at the Bendigo Supreme Court.

In the Supreme Court the prosecution's case was similar to that originally presented. Tom Caudry however elaborated on his defence. The heifer in contention he said was named 'Elsie' after his younger sister. Caudry also brought to court a cow named 'Tilly' who he claimed was 'Elsie's' mother. Both cows were held in trucks outside the courthouse where they were inspected by the opposing barristers and the jury.

After comparing the cows and their brands, the jury heard several character witnesses for Caudry. They then retired for half an hour before bringing in a verdict of not guilty. Despite their decision, the judge ordered that the heifer be returned to Mrs Harcoan, saying that this was consistent with the jury finding that Caudry had honestly mistaken it for one of his own.





Melbourne Cup special

It's almost Melbourne Cup time and so this week's News features the elements without which the event could not happen. No, not the bookies or the hospitality marquees. Not the car boot picnics in The Nursery or the 'tired and emotional' patrons. The horses, of course! The library has an abundance of books about horses, their history, their lives and their relationships with humans, both novels and non-fiction. Here is a selection:

The Horse: A Galloping History of Humanity by Timothy Winegard, 2024

This recently published book tells a story that started over 5,000 years ago in the Eurasian steppes when the partnership between man and horse began. Since then, human endeavour has been linked to an animal that was the primary mode of transport, essential farming machine, companion and weapon of war. *The Horse* takes us from the cavalry charges of Alexander the Great to hunting, trading and horse-worshipping. It is a narrative of this noble animal's unrivalled and enduring reign across human history. To know the horse is to understand the world. (*The Horse* can be found in the World History & Geography section).

Dick Francis: A Racing Life by Graham Lord, 1999

Dick Francis novels may be out of fashion, but in their day, they were best sellers, loved by many, including the Queen Mother. As an ex-champion steeplechase jockey, Francis was well-qualified to write about racing; however, it was the collaboration with his wife, Mary, who had an English and French degree from London University and an avid interest in literature, that resulted in the 40 crime novels that sold over 60 million copies and were translated into 34 languages. Dick and Mary Francis created a spectacularly successful literary partnership and the story of the Dick Francis books was the story of them both. This book can be located in the Autobiography, Biography & Memoir section of the library.

Horse by Geraldine Brooks, 2022

Horse is a fictional novel by Australian historical fiction writer Geraldine Brooks, author of *Years of Wonder* and *People*

of the Book. It is based on the true story of Lexington, the record-breaking American thoroughbred who became America's greatest stud sire. It is also the story of Jarret, an enslaved black man who formed a bond with the foal and became Lexington's groom, the history of racing in America and the American civil war. Carefully researched and beautifully written, with Lexington a central character, this is historical fiction at its best. (*Horse* is in the General Fiction section).

Wild at Heart by Alienor le Gouvello, 2021

From the moment French-born Alienor encountered a pair of wild horses in the Australian outback, she was transfixed. Inspired to celebrate their character, Alienor tamed three brumbies and teamed up with them to conquer Australia's longest trek. *Wild At Heart* follows Alienor and her horses on a three-year journey stretching 5,330 kilometres from Healesville in Victoria to Cooktown in tropical Far North Queensland. Through her travels across some of Australia's most spectacular terrain (illustrated by stunning photography), battling isolation and the elements, she built a profound bond with her horses and made life-changing discoveries where she least expected. (This book is part of our Travel Tales collection).

Wild Horses Don't Swim by Michael Keenan, 2011

Australian farmer Mike Keenan's first book - a true story of battling drought to save his cattle and his farm - touched a chord with Australian readers. Now Mike takes us into the magnificent wilderness of the west Kimberley in a personal quest to highlight the problems of this beautiful but troubled region.

Mike's involvement with the area began when he learned of plans to dam the lifeblood of the region, the Fitzroy River - the last great river still flowing freely to the sea - to provide water for cotton growing on the plains below. It was horrific news: a dam on the Fitzroy would cause an environmental disaster greater than any Australia has ever known. With the help of the local Banuba people, fierce opponents of the dam that threatened their homeland and sacred sites, Mike organised a horseback trek to explore the area and discover what was at stake. What he found was a paradise of unique plants, pristine rivers and dramatic gorges.

In *Wild Horses Don't Swim* we join Mike, his intrepid wife Sal and their Bunuba friends in an action-packed adventure as they dodge wild bulls, ford raging torrents, brave bushfires and climb sheer cliffs - searching for the legendary rock art that might be lost forever.

Book reviews

Woo Woo by Ella Baxter, 2024

Woo Woo follows Sabine, a conceptual artist on the verge of a photo exhibition she hopes will be pivotal, as she plunges deeper into her neuroses and seeks validation in relationships with her frustratingly rational chef husband, her horde of devoted Gen Z TikTok followers, and even a mysterious, potentially violent stalker. Accompanying her throughout are Sabine's strange alter egos, from hyper-realistic puppets of her as a baby to the ghost of conceptual artist Carolee Schneemann, who shows up with inscrutable yet sage life advice. Ella Baxter approaches the desire to see and be seen that defines both the creative and romantic act with humour, empathy and a good dose of wildness, driving Sabine to a surreal and compelling climax that forces her to reconsider what it means to be an artist and a partner.

Bill the Bastard: the Story of Australia's Greatest War Horse by Roland Perry, 2012

Bill was massive. He had power, intelligence and unmatched courage. In performance and character, he stood above all the other 200,000 Australian horses sent to the Middle East in the Great War. But as war horses go, he had one serious problem. No one could ride him but one man, Major Michael Shanahan. Some even thought Bill took a sneering pleasure in watching would-be riders hit the dust.

Bill the Bastard is the remarkable tale of a bond between a determined trooper and his stoic but cantankerous mount. They fought together. They depended on each other for survival. And when the chips were down, Bill's heroic efforts and exceptional instincts in battle saved the lives of Shanahan and four of his men.

By September 1918, 'Bill the Bastard' was known by the entire Light Horse regiment, who used his name not as an insult, but as a term of endearment. Bill had become a legend, a symbol of the courage and unbreakable will of the Anzac mounted force. There was no other horse like Bill the Bastard.



Free guided walk in Maldon Historic Reserve




