

**M**aldon Golf Club wants the dog-owners of Maldon to know that they can enjoy the lush grassy gold course with their furry friend if they take out a 'recreational membership.' The scheme has been in place for about five years after the club realised that many options for off-leash pooch play were being removed in the region. "We see that people want a facility and if council can't offer that any more then we would like to," explains club

secretary Bob Briggs. "We don't mind people walking off lead if they know their dog will come when called. We just don't want them chasing kangaroos or causing trouble." There are some simple and reasonable guidelines to follow, including the request that owners clean up after their dog and take the droppings home. New members will be issued an identification tag as a recreational member and will also be invited to the club's social activities as well. "We just ask that people respect their duty of care, respect golfers," Bob

says. "The only exclusion is our golfing day on a Saturday between 12 and five when we have a major tournament." Tournament dates and times are promoted on Facebook. A family membership for recreational use of the Golf Course, which includes walking and dog-walking, is \$50 per year to cover insurance expenses. # New home for historic trains

THE Victorian Goldfields Railway (VGR) has welcomed a new depot in Castlemaine for the historic trains that run between Castlemaine and Maldon. An official opening celebration took place on Saturday 2 November with a ceremonial ribbon-cutting by Member for Bendigo West Maree Edwards MP and Clynn Lord, whose husband Kevin made the generous donation that kick-started the project. Kevin Lord had been a VGR volunteer before his death in 2016 and a plaque on the shed commemorates his contribution.

The VGR, with the support of Maree Edwards MP and Regional Development Victoria, leveraged that seed funding into a \$2 million infrastructure project to build the new VGR Castlemaine Depot.

The many benefits of the new depot buildings include greater space and more comfortable indoor environs for VGR volunteer workers to maintain locomotives and prepare them for service. The facilities in Maldon can now be repurposed and the station precinct can be cleaned up to be better presented as a typical Victorian Railways branch line terminus.

The VGR says its focus will now shift to finding the funds to properly fit out the buildings, as part of the strategy to provide volunteers with better and more productive working conditions, which is a key component towards the railway's long-term sustainability.

"This was a lovely way to finish up our Seniors Festival," Jenny from Dhelkaya Health said. "We'll still come to Newstead once a month and we look forward to becoming a permanent fixture here."

## Weed Watch

### CAPE TULIP

**Common Name:** Cape Tulip (one-leaf)

**Botanical Name:** *Moraea Flaccida*

**Weed Classifications:** Declared noxious weed in Victoria; Regionally Controlled in North Central area of Victoria, which means property owners have the responsibility to take all reasonable steps to prevent the growth and spread of the plant on their land.

**Where did it Come From:** Cape Tulip is a perennial weed introduced from South Africa.

**What Does it Look Like:** Cape Tulip is a herb with annual leaves and salmon red to orange/yellow flowers, with a yellow patch in the centre and six petal-like segments. It grows to 60cm high, developing from an underground bulb (corm) 1 to 4cm in diameter. Each plant has only one leaf which is flat, folded and ribbed, 1–2cm wide and longer than the flowering stalk.

**Why is it a Problem:** This plant is a garden escapee which has now become a significant weed throughout southern Australia. It is highly toxic to stock if it invades pastures. Recently it has increased its invasion of

native habitats and has the potential to be a weed of conservation importance. It easily spreads from gardens into native bush and reduces the growth of native plant species. This reduces native biodiversity, negatively affecting our native birds and animals by destroying their habitat and reducing their essential food plants.

**How does it Spread:** Cape Tulip spreads by the movement of seed or corms, which can be carried by wind, animals, water and in contaminated farm produce and machinery.

**Spread:** Cape Tulip is found in temperate, sub-tropical, sometimes semi-arid regions and a wide range of habitats. It occurs on a range of soil types, prefers sunny locations, and occurs mostly in areas with annual rainfall of less than 600mm.


**How can it be Controlled:** Ensure you don't have this introduced plant in your garden or on your property. Manual control involves pulling or digging out the plants, including the corms, then ensuring the plant dies by dehydration and/or disposed of in a sealed bag. It is difficult to control chemically due to the dormancy of corms below the ground.

# Chaperon Wines now at Golden Nugget

**BOUTIQUE Chaperon Wines, made in small batches to the highest quality, are now available at the Golden Nugget Restaurant in Maldon. The exclusive wines are produced entirely by hand at Grangehill Vineyard from varietals including shiraz, grenache and mourvedre.**

The business was inspired by its location at the historic property, which had been a thriving winery until the phylloxera epidemic of the late nineteenth century. After selling various home-grown products in outlets across regional Victoria, owners Russell Clarke and Angelina Chaperon decided to take the property back to its roots, so to speak. “At that time, when phylloxera went through the wine states, if the disease didn’t kill the vines, people were paid to dig them up. So there was none of that left,” Angelina explained. “But the history made Russell think that since it was once a winery, it could be again.”

Russell studied wine-making at TAFE, worked at other wineries and learned under mentors, and after replanting the vineyard, the couple’s first vintage was released in 2000. It was produced in the traditional way. “The vineyard has never been irrigated. We don’t use herbicides or insecticides,” Angelina says. “Grapevines don’t need irrigation and we believe that makes the quality of our fruit.”

Chaperon only produces 500 cases of wine in a good year, which means this high-quality drop is rare and valuable. It makes sense that Golden Nugget

Restaurant at Porcupine Village, which has just won a prestigious award, would want to feature Chaperon on its menu.

“We’re thrilled to have our wines served at Golden Nugget and we also want to congratulate the team on their win at the Restaurant and Catering Awards,” Angelina said.

Chaperon Wines of Grangehill Vineyard are also available at Maldon Market, Maldon IGA and from their own cellar door on weekends. 







## Beyond Migration: The Challenge of Speaking a Different Language

Being a migrant is a profound challenge. Even for those who speak the same language and share a similar culture, the experience can be daunting. But for migrants like me, living in a small town—where everyone knows everyone, and you are the outsider—this challenge becomes even more complex. Sometimes, people may not engage with you directly, especially if you have a strong accent. They might overhear you by chance or through someone else's interpretation, and the distance grows when someone says, "I didn't quite understand what she said."

Today, I am not just talking about being a migrant—I am reflecting on the experience of speaking a different native language and learning English as an adult presents unique struggles.

I encounter these unspoken barriers daily, created by cultural

clashes and fear of difference. I've learned how difficult it is to express myself when words don't come easily, and I've noticed how quickly people shut down when an accent sounds unfamiliar. Here, local knowledge often trumps all, not because it is better researched or understood, but because it's passed down and familiar.

In this imbalance, the person who can argue their case more eloquently—often the native speaker—wins. It is not about who is right but about who speaks best. And so, the truth is sometimes drowned out, not by reason but by language—the one who speaks better wins.

During conflict, despite my best efforts, I sometimes struggle to communicate what I am experiencing. When I express myself intensely—because I openly display my emotions, as many Latinos do—I may unintentionally come across as repetitive or overly emotional. A noisy environment only adds to the challenge, and without the right words, it's easy for things to be perceived as unintentionally rude or misunderstood.

I am learning that people in Australia often approach emotions differently. Here, feelings tend to be contained, whereas in our culture, sharing emotions openly is how we connect.

I understand that I need to adapt as we live in Australia. However, I also invite others to reflect on this dynamic: it's not just about learning the local ways of expressing emotions—there is also value in understanding how other cultures experience and express their feelings differently.

A question to reflect on:

How would you feel if your voice was not taken seriously and no one showed interest in hearing your side of the story?



# Natural Newstead

**Woodswallows and lerp**

It's always delightful to watch birds going about their business without obvious regard to your presence.

Such was the case yesterday with a small flock of White-browed Woodswallows. I heard their distinctive chattering first, low in the canopy, rather than in the sky above where they'd been observed a few times in recent days.

The flock of approximately 20 birds were feeding in Yellow Gum foliage, deftly removing lerp from the surface of leaves. You can see the profit of their endeavours in several of the images. This species is another spring migrant to the district, typically with small numbers of Masked Woodswallows.



# THE REST IS HISTORY

## STRANGWAYS



Strangways shops and businesses early 1900s.

HAVE you ever driven through Strangways and wondered why it is there? For such a small place, it has an interesting history. Strangways is located between Guildford to the east, Clydesdale to the south and Newstead to the northwest, at the junction of the Loddon River and Yarni Barramal Yaluk Creek (formerly Jim Crow Creek).

From the early 1850s, diggers would stop here on their way to Mount Alexander from the south-east of Victoria and Adelaide. Then in 1855, after a rush to nearby Yandoit, when more and more diggers were arriving, a settlement was established.

In 1861, after the settlement grew into a township, a much-needed bridge was constructed over the creek. During this time, the township had grown larger than Newstead and included a school, bootmaker, carpenter, blacksmith, bone mill, at least one general store (Mulholland's), butcher and a hotel. A Wesleyan church was erected in 1865 and was attended by Newstead Wesleyans until their town's church was built in 1903.

There were also suggestions that from 1860 to 1864, a Chinese camp of up to 3,000 diggers set up in the area mining Pickpocket Hill and running a market garden along the Loddon River.

The railway, which would join Castlemaine to Maryborough, went through in 1874 and during this time Strangways was known as a 'rowdy place...drinking and fighting was all the go and pick handles were freely used'. However, due to the railway taking traffic off the roads, the township slowly dwindled, houses vanished and by 1901 the population of Strangways had dwindled to only 98.

By 1908 property values had increased as dairy farming became popular along the fertile Loddon and at the same time gold mining resumed with a small rush near Clydesdale. Between 1938 and 1954 Strangways was revived as a mining centre when it was made the headquarters of the Victoria Gold Dredging Company N.L. that mined along the Loddon Creek.

Strangways is now a sparsely populated mixed farming community with only traces of a town centre. However, this once-thriving township has notable colonial and Victorian-era structures and ruins that have been identified by the Newstead and Daylesford/Hepburn Springs Heritage Projects.



#### A significant donation

They were published by the Government Printing Office in the early 1980s and are a great addition to our Australian History section.**

### World Science Day

World Science Day, celebrated every 10 November, highlights the significant role of science in society and the need to engage the wider public in debates on emerging scientific issues. Sometimes people feel alienated by science, assuming it is hard to understand, or they distrust scientific knowledge and the scientists themselves. Reading a good book about science can both inform and entertain you and perhaps change and challenge the way you think about the importance and relevance of science in our daily lives.

### *The Sceptic's Guide to the Paranormal*

by Lynne Kelly, 2009

Lynne Kelly is a local science writer and academic who was a guest of the Athenaeum Library earlier this year. Supported by colour photos, this book offers scientific case-by-case explanations for phenomena that appear to defy known science, including alien abductions, levitation, the Loch Ness monster and the predictions of Nostradamus. Follow her instructions and you too can bend spoons! ### *Lessons in Chemistry* by Bonnie Garmus, 2022

When Elizabeth Zott, a chemist, becomes a cooking show star, her audience loved her and her scientific and rational approach, but the network was not so happy. It seems that Elizabeth wasn't just teaching women to cook but also challenging the status quo. ### *A is for Arsenic: The Poisons of Agatha Christie*

by Kathryn Harkup, 2016

A British chemist and science communicator investigates the poisons used by the murderers in 14 classic Agatha Christie mysteries. This book looks at why certain chemicals kill, how they interact with the body, the cases that may have inspired Christie, and the feasibility of obtaining, administering and detecting these poisons. 




