### Modern markings echo ancient times



WITH the recent sunny weather enticing people to get out and about, one of our many 'walking' readers was strolling past a stone wall in High Street. They contacted the *Tarrangower Times* to ask, "What's with the markings on the stone wall outside the Maldon Masonic Centre?" Our immediate response was probably similar to yours, 'What stone wall? What stone wall markings?'

Thank you for asking.

After much investigation (a quick phone call to Peter Thompson from the Centre), the story unfolded.

In ancient times, many stonemasons were illiterate, so each stonemason had their own a mark, much like a signature.

Some of the High Street marks engraved on the stones at the Centre continue this tradition, representing some of the historical founding members of the Maldon Masonic Centre. One such person was Robert Cleghorn Mackenzie, who played a big part in the establishment of the Maldon Hospital.

Other marks visible on the stones belong to donors who have sponsored the construction of the wall. *Barry Robinson*



#### Endorsement

I strongly endorse Gavin's letter. Evil is real, and it has a supernatural dimension. It's dangerous to have any involvement with the occult, even when it's dressed up as fun. Don't take the risk.

Lauren raises the same issues about the Christian Church as I did when an atheist. It's not the church that I've known since I came to know Jesus Christ, however. I'd take particular issue with the allegation of misogyny. Yes that's happened, but Christian faith and the church have overwhelmingly been a haven for women down through the centuries. Surveys show that over 60% of church attendees in Australia today are female, and I'm told it's the same in most other places.

The church has certainly gone badly wrong and departed from the Lord's ways at times in the past. It may do so again, but I'm sure the Lord will correct it again.

#### Judged by our actions

I shared the Women for Yes Open Letter with my UK cousin, a journalist, and outlined the Yes and No case. I found her response enlightening. She said, 'Why is there opposition? I'm shocked that this is not already the case. It is so sad and isn't a good look for Australia, which from the outside looks like and is considered a modern liberal democracy, but perhaps it's not so liberal after all'.

This is an Australian issue for Australians to decide, whichever side of the fence we may sit on. However, it prompted me to think beyond the scope of our own, sometimes insular lives. We are a global community and like it or not, are judged by our actions and moral values, as we judge other nations. How will it look if this referendum fails? How will we be seen if we cannot, at the very least, give Constitutional recognition to First Nations people? It is a first step. The Uluru Statement, an elegant document, asks for Voice, Treaty and Truth Telling. The key message for the Voice is that it is a simple, practical step in the right direction. If not this, then what? More failed Closing the Gap policies. More obfuscation for political purposes?

The 'If you don't know vote no' mantra, I think, is a lazy approach. If you don't know, find out. There is enough information in all formats. We should value our vote and cast it as informed citizens, whether that be Yes or No. Mary Dalton Maldon

A. Previous ATSI representative bodies have all failed. So, expecting another one to have a different outcome is unrealistic - regardless of its legal basis. 

The advice about writing ticks or crosses comes from the Australian Electoral Commission: the rule has been in place for 30 years. During the 1999 republic referendum (when the rule was in place), less than 1% of votes were classed as informal, and only a portion of those related to ticks and crosses on the ballot. The AEC continues to urge people to simply vote "Yes" or "No" in English. Maldon for Yes

### **Castlemaine-Maryborough Rail Trail Project: Feasibility Study Launch**



IT was a chilly start to the day at Joyces Creek last Thursday morning as a group comprising Bendigo West MP Maree Edwards, Ripon MP Martha Haylett, members of the Rail Trail group and representatives of both Mount Alexander and Central Goldfields shire councils met. The still water and shady trees, with the rail bridge towering overhead, lent a special atmosphere to the launch. The feasibility study has found that the 60 km of disused rail corridor can be profitably repurposed as a recreational trail.

CMRT President Dr Janice Simpson opened the launch with a welcome to country. Maree Edwards also paid tribute to the Dja Dja Wurrung – who often speak of Djaara land as "upside-down country" following all the changes wrought by settlers – and stressed their involvement as a high priority. The Moolort Plain is a very significant natural environment, and indigenous knowledge will be a vital part of this project.

### Tricia Migdoll: It's Like Singing in Silence



THIS was the description Tricia gave to the exhibition of her artworks, which launched on Friday last week: 'An exhibition of silent observations and expressions of the beauty that surrounds us'. Her work ranges from still life to landscapes to figurative arts. Far be it from this writer to attempt any further analysis, Nancy Whittaker covered that in last week's TT (Arts About).

A large crowd gathered to hear Tricia speak and to admire her work over a glass of wine courtesy of Welshmans Reef Winery, with Manon Maund playing cello in the background. The MANet Arts Focus Gallery, to give it its full name, is fast becoming an arts hub for not only Maldon but the goldfields region generally. This exhibition runs until 18 September and will then be followed by an exhibition of works by Jennifer Merkus.

She also noted the novelty of two adjoining councils working so co-operatively together!

While plenty of work remains to be done, the economic benefits will be significant. The study, made possible by state government funding, found that the trail will increase economic output in both shires by around \$24m every year and support up to 160 new jobs in communities along the trail. It expects tens of thousands of visitors.

"A trail can help thread the many powerful attractions this region has and knit the communities along the trail even closer together," said Dr Simpson. "Rail trails in other regions have shown how they can bring added prosperity to smaller communities through jobs and new businesses. This trail will too."

### **A Thing of Beauty**

AS many of you will have heard, our church has arranged a program of classical music concerts for the second half of this year. Some people have asked me: what is a church doing putting on concerts?

A big motivation for these concerts is very simply the desire to do something beautiful. There was a time, not so long ago when beauty was highly valued in our community. And all that effort was not for the function of the building. It was for its beauty. It was to create something beautiful for people and before God.

Western Christianity has tended to emphasise our corrupt natures and the broken state of the world. But this can sometimes miss where the story of the Bible starts, and that is at Genesis 1 and 2 and the understanding that God created a beautiful world that was 'very good'. God created a world full of beauty and goodness, and we have been made in God's image to celebrate and emulate this beauty.

### **Natural Newstead**

THE following is a recent blog post by Geoff Park from 'Natural Newstead: Observations of flora, fauna and landscape in central Victoria'. Text and photographs are printed courtesy of Geoff Park.



#### Unusual gatherings and hidden nests

Spotted Pardalotes (Pardalotus punctatus) are not birds that I've ever seen flocking together - they usually seem to be in the canopy, sticking to themselves or as pairs with a few young and quite scratchy towards others of their species. However, for the last couple of months at our place at Strangways, I've frequently seen them in groups of six up to 20, foraging for something on the ground. This has always been in fairly bare patches of ground, with little leaf litter and no cover. They've often been in these groups on the gravel of our lane and we've had to stop the car to move them on as they've been so focused on their foraging they won't move even for a car. Walking in the bush, I've nearly stepped on a few. I've spoken to a few friends who've seen something similar – again only in the last few months. Until yesterday, I'd not had my camera on me when I've come across these little cuties doing this, but I'm now pleased to be able to post some photos.



The group consisted of at least seven Pardalotes, adults of both sexes and some juveniles. They were certainly not collecting nesting material. After a few minutes they moved off the dirt track and into some leaf litter. Shortly after, they all flew off together. If anyone has any ideas about what they are doing or has seen this before, I'd be very grateful.

A little way down the dirt track from this little group of bush jewels, I noticed a pair of Buff-rumped Thornbills (Acanthiza reguloides) hanging around and then ducking down to a little tussock grass beside the track. These Thornbills nest in such tussocks, right at ground level. Sure enough, it wasn't long before they returned with some material to line the nest they were building. Specifically, fur from our dog that I leave in the bush after brushing him for nesting material and some feathers from our chooks. The distance from our chook yard to the nest is about 100m as the crow flies. I suspect the circuitous route these two used was more like 170m. A long way for a tiny bird with a lot of stuff in the beak.

broader pet-related issues, not specific health problems. If your pet is unwell, then a diagnosis can only be made by a visit to the vet.

Q. How do I know how much my pet should weigh, and how can I help my pet maintain a healthy weight? Keeping our dogs and cats at a healthy weight is impor-


tant for many reasons, from allowing them to move and exercise comfortably to reducing stress on their joints for arthritis management in older pets and lessening their risk of developing certain diseases such as diabetes.


It can be tricky to know how much your pet should weigh, so vets will often assess body weight by measuring their body condition. You can do this at home by simply viewing and placing your hands over your pet's ribs, spine and waist. A pet that is underweight will have visible ribs, spine and hip bones. On the other hand, pets that are overweight will have fat over their ribs, making them difficult to feel, as well as a thick waist and large abdomen. If your pet is at an ideal body weight, you should be able to place your hands over their chest and feel their ribs, observe a nice waist and a tucked-in abdomen. Once your pet is at their ideal body weight, there are various ways to maintain this:

Feed them a complete and balanced diet where their caloric intake is matched to their ideal body weight. You can take the guesswork out of it by choosing a good quality commercial pet food that contains all the nutrients they need. Most commercial diets come with a feeding guide so you can feed the recommended amount for their ideal body weight. If feeding a home-cooked meal or supplementing your pet's diet with treats, then remember to take these calories into account so as not to exceed their recommended daily caloric intake. If your pet is older, less active or has other health conditions, then their diet may need to be tweaked to take this into account. Remember that every little treat and table scrap can add up to extra calories, so be mindful of how many treats you give. Also, be aware of whether your pet is able to access food that isn't theirs, e.g., stealing food off the counter or from another pet's food bowl.

Exercise is just as important as diet in maintaining your pet at a healthy weight. The level of exercise will depend on your pet's age, breed and health status. The type and duration of exercise may also need to take into account what's feasible for owners in terms of their daily routine and access to exercise areas. Indoor pets can be exercised with periods of play. If there are certain periods of time where you may not be able to give your pet the level of exercise they need or are used to, then adjust their diet accordingly to prevent them gaining weight.

If you're still having trouble maintaining your pet at a healthy weight, or if your pet displays signs of increased appetite, eating unusual substances or gains or loses weight unexpectedly, then it's best to have your pet assessed by a vet. **Dr. Andrea Khong** 





IN the Maldon Museum's collection is a cartoon showing a Falstaffian character with glass in hand saying, 'There's not a headache in a Puncheon of old Hutton's Rum'. The drawing is signed D R Drape and dated 1871. It refers to Daniel Hutton who was the publican at the Cumberland Hotel in High Street opposite its intersection with the Castlemaine Road.

David Relph Drape trained as a decorative artist and glass stainer in Carlisle, England. By the mid-1850s, with his partner John Scott, he had completed several important commissions for the Carlisle and Dundee Cathedrals. In 1858 Drape received a job offer from the Melbourne company Ferguson and Urie who were establishing Victoria's first stained glass workshop. On his arrival in Melbourne Drape found that, due to the lack of tradesmen, the workshop had not been built and so like many others, he travelled to the goldfields.

Drape would spend about four years in Maldon where he managed to make a modest living as an architect. He designed several buildings that still survive including Holy Trinity, the Maldon Hospital, the Royal Hotel and the Beehive chimney. For several years, Drape was also the secretary of the Concord Quartz Mining Association. He completed several watercolours mainly depicting mining activity and was in demand to provide illuminated testimonials. An example of his skill as a decorative artist can be seen in John Bentley's gravestone in the Maldon Cemetery.

In November 1863 Drape finally joined Ferguson and Urie at their workshop in North Melbourne where he worked with John Lamb Lyon. Lyon also had Maldon connections. His parents were storekeepers in the town and in 1863, Lyon designed the western window of Holy Trinity.

Drape had a keen sense of humour. At the Hospital fete in 1863 he presented a 'peep show' of satirical cartoons. At the time, there were concerns about the integrity of the recently constructed reservoir above the Camp Reserve. One cartoon showed the wall of the reservoir bursting and flooding the town centre. A leading critic of the reservoir was shown in his nightgown, clutching an umbrella, on the roof of the Victoria Bank. As water lapped around his feet he seemed to yell, 'I told you so!'.

After leaving Maldon, Drape kept in touch with his old friends. In April 1864 a novelty cricket match was held between the 'Fat' and the 'Lean'. Between innings, a foot race was run between two Shire councillors representing each side. A few weeks later, Drape sent his Maldon friends a cartoon depicting how he had imagined the start of the race. He promised that it was the first in a series and others would follow. The Museum's sketch might have been one of several that Drape sent back to Maldon.



#### **Library News**

There has been a gratifying renewal of interest in the library's Maldon Collection since we moved it to a more accessible location in the Main Room. Rarely a day goes by without members browsing the shelves and taking a few books for perusal while sitting at the long table or in the armchair in front of the stained glass window. Of particular interest are books about the history of Maldon and surrounds: books such as Malcom Crick's fascinating Maldon Memories, a compilation of recollections told by Maldonians who grew up here in the 1930s; A Rich Vein, Christopher Creek's history of the area known as Eagle Hawk; and The Essential Maldon by Miles Lewis with its beautiful illustrations by G.H. (Mick) Morton. While these books will always be its core, in order to better display this unique collection, we are in the process of sifting, sorting and rearranging. Many books have previously been shelved in the Maldon collection because they were written by local authors, but they aren't about Maldon and the surrounding areas, instead being on topics as far-ranging as gardening, interior design and military history. We plan on moving these out to be shelved along with others of their kind where they will be more easily found by people interested in each book's particular topic. Not only will this make them more accessible, but their relocation will allow us to better showcase the Maldon Collection itself. And we'll showcase our talented local authors by stamping the inside cover of their books with a custom-made 'Local Author' stamp.

#### Fat Girl Dancing by Kris Kneen, 2023

Fat child, self-denying adolescent, hungry young woman; a body now burgeoning uncontrolled into middle age. Kris Kneen has borne the usual indignities: the confrontations with clothes that won't fasten, with mirrors that defame, with strangers whose gaze judges and dismisses. This is the story of how Kris learned to look unblinkingly at her recalcitrant body and ultimately found the courage to carry it to freedom.

The Heart is a Star by S.J. Megan Rogers, 2023 Layla Byrnes is exhausted. She's juggling a demanding job as an anaesthetist, a disintegrating marriage, her young kids, and a needy lover. And most particularly, she's managing her histrionically unstable mother, who repeatedly threatens to kill herself. But this year, it's different.

When her mother rings just before Christmas, she doesn't follow the usual script. Instead, she tells Layla that there's something she needs to tell her about her much-loved father. In response, Layla drops everything to rush to her childhood home on the wild west coast of Tasmania. She's determined to finally confront her mother and find out what really happened to her father.

#### The Interpreter by Brooke Robinson, 2023

A childhood spent moving around the world left Revelle Lee with an unusual gift: the ability to fluently speak 11 languages. Now, Revelle spends her days translating for witnesses, victims, and the accused across London crime scenes and courtrooms. It's a stressful job, though not as stressful as the process she is currently going through to adopt little boy, Elliot. She is determined to be the mother to him that she never had and to make up for her own past mistakes.

But when it seems a murderer will go free, Revelle puts the adoption and her job at risk, deliberately mistranslating the alibi to ensure he is found guilty. No one can ever find out that she interfered, or she will lose her son and her livelihood. The problem is someone already knows what she's done and they want justice of their own.

Charles Collard: born Somerset England 1811, died Baringhup Victoria 1891.

Married at Launceston Tasmania 1841 to Mary McLean: born Perthshire Scotland 1811, died Baringhup Victoria 1898.

The story of Charles and Mary (pictured) is a classic one of people who travelled to a far land to make their fortune, in the course of which they faced trials and tribulations that are almost unbelievable to the 21st Century citizens in the country they help to create. Here is my [William Bell's] attempt to describe some

of those trials they faced. As with all studies of this kind, it is a collection of facts, wishful thinking and speculation and is an ongoing work in progress.


As with all family history mysteries, we turn to the usual sources such as birth, marriage and death records and published works. Looking at Charles and Mary's children, we find that they are recorded as being born in Tasmania, Victoria or, surprisingly San Francisco. Charles and Mary's four children, based on birth, marriage and death records as of 1988: Alexander McLean Collard 1844 Launceston, Margaret Helen 1847 Launceston, Mary Jordan 1850 San Francisco, Daniel Charles 1854 in Collingwood.

Other clues exist about Charles' past. Victoria and its Metropolis published in 1888, during Australia's first Centenary Celebrations, has entries supplied by people about themselves and in the volume dealing with country personalities, there is the following entry: 'Collard Charles, Baringhup was born in Somersetshire England in 1802 there learned bootmaking which he worked at until 1830 when he went to Launceston Tasmania working at his trade as well and renting a farm on the River Tamar. He next went to California and was employed in a bonded store for three years, but when the Victorian goldfields were opened, he came to Victoria and worked at the principal diggings with but little success. In 1860 he proceeded to Baringhup, bought 107½ acres of land, and has farmed it to advantage ever since. He now has 1000 acres of freehold on which he carries on dairy farming and grazes about 200 cattle.'

All very conventional until you begin to look behind the bland facts in the entry. In 1988 Clare Warn published the Collard Family Tree and presented the results of her research at the Collard Family reunion at Baringhup West. Clare managed to track Charles to North Petherton in Somerset, but she came up with a major revelation, Charles was a convict sentenced to exile in Van Diemen's Land (Tasmania). At the time, this came as quite a shock to his descendants; the black stain of Australia's convict past was still something to be buried.

In 1829 Charles was tried and convicted to a whipping and two months' imprisonment in Wilton goal, Taunton for stealing two pairs of shoes. Worse was to come; on the 13th of August 1832 Charles and his mate Thomas Kidner were sentenced to death for the assault and stealing of four pairs of stockings from William Lally. The sentence was commuted to Life in exile.

A search of the Felons Register of Ilchester Goal states that 'Charles Collard, a shoemaker aged 21, was convicted at the



Assizes 13 August (18)32 of assaulting William Lally and stealing four pairs of stockings from him. He and his accomplice Thomas Kidner, a 17-year-old shoemaker, were sentenced to death, but Collard's sentence was commuted to transportation for life, and he was sent to the hulk Discovery (pictured) at Woolwich on 18 September to await transportation. Kidner was also reprieved and sentenced to two years hard labour. Collard had at least one previous conviction, having been sentenced at the Sessions of 13 July 1829 to a whipping and two months' imprisonment in Wilton goal, Taunton for stealing two pairs of shoes. His description: five feet three inches tall, stout, brown hair and grey eyes, pockmarked. He was single at the time of his conviction and it is noted he could read but not write.'

The original source of information about Charles' exile to Tasmania comes from a letter from the State Library of Tasmania to Clare Warn in 1964 following an inquiry about Charles' record as a convict. To summarise, his gaol report was 'believed to be bad' and his hulk report 'good'. He was transported to Van Diemen's Land on the Emperor Alexander XVII and arrived on 12 August 1833. He received a Ticket of Leave on 13 July 1841 and was recommended for a Conditional Pardon on 24 December 1844, and this was granted on 16 December 1845. On 2 September 1841 he made an application to be allowed to marry a Mary McLean, who had arrived free, although we have been unable to find the date of her arrival, and this application was approved.


